### From the Pastor's Desk



**Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us!** No doubt at all, from the many titles Catholics have to call upon the intercession of our Blessed Mother, the most august of all is that of Mother of God! It was early in the history of our Church that bishops got together in the city of Ephesus and proclaimed this dogma: Mary is the Mother of God. As astonishing as it may sound, this simple young woman holds the greatest honor human beings can dream of: She carried in her womb the Son of God, the second person of the Trinity who became flesh for our salvation.


The Word of God became flesh (this is what we are celebrating as Christians these twelve days of Christmas), and in the person of Jesus of Nazareth, the almighty one, the omnipresent one, the everlasting one, is at our reach. Because we believe Jesus to be true God and true man, the woman who gave him birth is honored with the title of *Theotokos*, that is to say, the bearer of God!

Such an incredible mystery can only be grasped at, and accepted once we acknowledge that in Jesus of Nazareth, the two natures (divine and human), cohabitated without any conflict. Story goes that once the bishops got together to discern about this dogma, a crowd of believers gathered together outside the place where the council was happening and kept praying over and over again: *Agia Maria Theotokos...* Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Once the bishops heard the crowd praying and honoring our Blessed Mother with that title, they did not hesitate to declare the dogma. At the end, what the bishops did, was a way of honoring what the sense of the faithful had revered for years: Mary became the Mother of God the moment she decided to welcome the Word of God in her womb,

As we begin New Year, we turn our eyes and our hearts to the Virgin Mother. Let us pray that every single day of this new adventure, can become an opportunity to embrace God's will in our lives the way she did it. May her intercession, continue to aid us all; and may our filial devotion grant us the Grace of being safe throughout the entire year. Happy New Year!

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

"Octave" comes from the Latin word for "eight," and since eight is one step beyond seven, the number of days in a week, it has long been seen as a symbol of perfection, completion, and new beginnings. Early Christians called Sunday the "eighth day," since it was the day after the Sabbath and a day of resurrected life, the Lord's Day. By the seventh century, people regarded the eight days after Easter Sunday as one great day, an octave, one glorious feast when people were forbidden to fast or kneel. In the seventh century, Pentecost acquired an Octave, too. Christmas didn't claim the honor of a continuous feast, but it did get an Octave Day. January 1 is the oldest Marian feast, the Octave of Christmas. It was originally a feast of the motherhood of Mary, although for centuries until 1969 it was called the Feast of the Circumcision. Our reformed calendar follows the earlier tradition of celebrating Mary as Mother of God.

### Mensaje del Párroco

**¡Virgen Madre, tu cargaste en tu seno al unigénito de Dios!** Al inicio de este Nuevo año, el Señor nos concede la Gracia de reunirnos como familia en la fe para celebrar la festividad de la Madre de Dios. Sabemos que de todos los títulos que tenemos para invocarla, este es el más solemne y el más digno de cortesía: Ella, la doncella simple de Nazaret, la mujer sencilla que abrió su vida a la voluntad de Dios, y ahora goza el honor de llamarse madre suya. Desde los principios de la Iglesia, esta fue una devoción bastante enraizada en el corazón de los creyentes, en el siglo cuarto los obispos de la Iglesia se reunieron en Éfeso para un concilio, definieron el dogma de la Maternidad Divina, al descubrir cómo la gente insistía en rezar a la Virgen Santísima con esta simple oración: *Santa María, Madre de Dios, ruega por nosotros los pecadores...*

Cristo vino al mundo para salvar la humanidad lastimada por el pecado. Él es verdadero Dios y verdadero hombre, por ello al honrar a María como Madre de Dios, básicamente lo que estamos haciendo es reconocer que, en Cristo el Señor, habita la plenitud de Dios. En Jesús de Nazaret, la naturaleza divina y

la naturaleza humana conviven sin conflicto y en beneficio de nuestra salvación. Es basados en esta verdad, que, desde los principios de la Iglesia, los creyentes se vuelcan en María como intercesora de todas las Gracias. Al celebrar este día el comienzo de un nuevo año, nos acogemos a la intercesión maternal de Nuestra Señora. A ella consagramos cada día que está por venir y le suplicamos que se vuelva compañera de camino, guía en la jornada y protectora en el momento de la dificultad. Sabemos que con gentileza maternal nos protege siempre y en esa certeza caminamos confiados.

Que nuestra celebración de un Año Nuevo se vuelva la ocasión perfecta para volver el corazón y la mente a la Madre de Dios y que como creyentes en Cristo seamos capaces de abandonarnos confiados sabiendo que ella nos cuidara. Lo hacemos repitiendo aquella antigua oración: *Bajo tu amparo nos acogemos Santa Madre de Dios, no desprecies las suplicas que te dirigimos en nuestras necesidades, antes bien libranos de todos los peligros, Oh Virgen gloriosa y bendita AMEN.*





## TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En Nicaragua y otras naciones latinoamericanas se celebra el final de un año con la "quema del año viejo". Construyen grandes muñecos con ropa vieja, pólvora y papel que se encienden a medianoche entre los dos años. Celebrar el comienzo de un año nuevo tiene una larga trayectoria en la historia humana. Hace unos 4000 años el pueblo de Babilonia ya festejaba la llegada de un nuevo año con grandes fiestas de primavera. Los judíos, al igual que otros pueblos agrícolas, también celebraban su año nuevo durante la primavera, el primer día de Nisán (a principios de abril).

Fue Julio César quien nos dio la fecha del primero de enero como el inicio de nuestro calendario. En 1582 el Papa Gregorio XIII reformó el calendario para darnos el que actualmente está en uso. No obstante, los cristianos continuaron celebrando el año nuevo en primavera para evitar los excesos del "hombre viejo". Hace 400 años la Iglesia comenzó a celebrar el día primero de enero buscando cristianizarlo lo mejor posible. Por eso en el calendario litúrgico este día es dedicado a María, Madre de Dios.

### Fr. Feccia's Reflection



**Il mistero della vita di Gesù Bambino con i suoi genitori:** la liturgia di oggi ci presenta una meditazione tutta incentrata sul Cristo, che interessa in modo particolare le famiglie cristiane.

«*Da dove viene il messia?*», si domandavano i contemporanei di «Gesù di Nazaret». Ignoravano la sua nascita a Betlemme di Giuda; perciò si stupivano che si presentasse come il messia, uno che veniva dalla Galilea (Giov. 1,46; 7,41). Matteo ripercorre quindi l'itinerario

movimentato dell'infanzia di Gesù; il suo esodo come profugo in seguito alla minaccia di Erode, che costringe i suoi genitori a rifugiarsi in Egitto, dove Gesù rivive il destino del popolo eletto; e infine il ritorno nel paese d'Israele e la scelta di abitare a Nazaret, che giustifica il suo soprannome (Anno A). Fin dalla nascita, Gesù si trova sotto il segno della croce.

Gli episodi della presentazione di Gesù al tempio (Anno B) e del suo ritrovamento a Gerusalemme, durante il suo primo pellegrinaggio pasquale (anno C), sottolineano entrambi la crescita «*in sapienza e grazia*» di un bambino dedito alla propria missione fin dalla più giovane età. La sua vocazione dolorosa e gloriosa insieme, viene annunziata da Luca: «*Gesù sarà segno di contraddizione*», ma anche luce per i pagani e gloria del suo popolo Israele. Nel tempio, a dodici anni, il bambino vivrà anticipatamente il proprio destino pasquale quando, perduto e ritrovato, verrà scoperto il terzo giorno nella casa del Padre.

La santa famiglia non era una famiglia senza problemi. Maria e Giuseppe hanno voluto condividere la condizione di quel figlio sconcertante, seguendo passo per passo nella rivelazione del suo mistero. Ed è proprio per questa loro disponibilità totale che meritano tutta la nostra ammirazione. **Inizi difficili**— Le circostanze obbligano Giuseppe a ritirarsi con la famiglia in Galilea, in una borgata senza gloria, Nazaret. I primi cristiani si riconoscevano in Gesù bambino, perseguitati anch'essi, venivano chiamati con l'appellativo un po' spregiativo «*nazzarenì*». questa è la linea dell'Incarnazione: il figlio di Dio non ha voluto condividere la vita dei privilegiati, ma dei poveri, dei disprezzati, degli esclusi.

### Maria dà al mondo Cristo nostra pace

Nell'ottava del Natale si celebra la festa di «Maria madre di Dio». In verità, le letture bibliche mettono l'accento sul «figlio di Maria» e sul «Nome del Signore», anziché su Maria.

Infatti l'antica «benedizione sacerdotale» è scandita dal nome del Signore, ripetuto all'inizio di ogni versetto (prima lettura); il testo di san Paolo sottolinea l'opera di liberazione e di salvezza compiuta da Cristo, nella quale è incastonata la figura di Maria, grazie alla quale il Figlio di Dio ha potuto venire nel mondo come vero uomo (seconda lettura); il vangelo termina con l'imposizione del nome di Gesù, mentre Maria partecipa in silenzio al mistero di questo suo figlio nato da Dio.

Questa attenzione prevalente al «Figlio» non riduce il ruolo della Madre: Maria è totalmente Madre perché è stata in totale relazione a Cristo, perciò onorando lei è più glorificato il Figlio. Il titolo di «Madre di Dio» sottolinea la missione di Maria nella storia della salvezza: missione che sta alla base del culto e della devozione del popolo cristiano; Maria infatti non ha ricevuto il dono di Dio per sé sola, ma per portarlo nel mondo: «nella verginità feconda di Maria (tu, o Dio) hai donato agli uomini i beni della salvezza eterna» (colletta).


