

From the Pastor's Desk

BAPTISM OF JESUS. With the feast of the Baptism of Jesus, we concluded the **Christmas season** and enter the **Ordinary Liturgical Time**. The Liturgy of the **Baptism of Jesus** marks the third manifestation of the Lord. After being adored by the **shepherds on Christmas night** and the **Three Kings in the Epiphany**, today we find him on the **banks of the Jordan River**, where John baptized with water and preached the conversion of hearts. The Baptist speaks very clearly of his mission: "**I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with Holy Spirit and Fire**". So, Jesus stands in line to be baptized. Committed in prayer, immersed himself in the water disappearing from the gaze of those presents. We trust that Jesus lived in the Jordan a "**fundamental moving experience**", as we say spiritually, that marked his future life forever. At that moment, he left the Baptist, his village of Nazareth and guided by the Spirit, he began to travel the roads of Galilee announcing the Good News of God. Jesus lived a very strong manifestation in the scene of baptism, as the text says: "**from heaven a voice is heard: You are my beloved son; with you I am well pleased**". This is what Jesus heard interiorly from God: "**You are mine. You are my son. Your being is sprouting from me. I am your Father. They are true expressions of affection. Know that I love you dearly. It fills me with joy that you are my beloved son; I feel happy**". From now on, Jesus will not call God, by any other name, but **Abba, Father**. From this experience emerges two attitudes that Jesus lived and tried to spread in all his ministry: **profound trust in God and docility to the Father**. Jesus trusts God spontaneously. He abandoned himself to him without misgivings or calculations. He trusts in God. He acts as a dear son. That is why he teaches everyone to call God "**Father**". He repeats to them over and over again: "**Do not be afraid. Trust in the Father**". All his life was focused on doing the Will of the Father. May as we participate in the Baptism of Jesus renew our baptismal commitment and strive to do God's will to enjoy the grace of **being a new creature** in an enthusiastic and generous experience.

Justice, Only Justice, You Shall Pursue

(Deuteronomy 16:20)

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2019 theme has been selected, and finds its origins in Deuteronomy. “**Justice, Only Justice, You Shall Pursue**” (Deuteronomy 16:20) was chosen for its powerful message of promoting truth, equality and unity. The traditional period in the northern hemisphere for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is January 18 to 25. The initial work on the theme for this year’s Week of Prayer was prepared by a group of representatives from different parts of Indonesia, including the Communion of Churches in Indonesia and the Indonesian Catholic Bishops’ Conference. The texts were finalized during a meeting of the International Committee of the Faith and Order Commission of the World Council of Churches and the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity.

“Every year, Christians across the world gather in prayer for growth in unity. We do this in a world where corruption, greed and injustice bring about inequality and division. We are called together to form a united witness for justice and for Christian Unity that becomes a means of Christ’s healing grace for the brokenness of the world. Only by heeding Jesus’s prayer “**that they all may be one**” can we witness to living unity in diversity.”

The Christians of Indonesia found that the words of Deuteronomy, “**Justice, and only justice, you shall pursue ...**” (Deut.16:18-20) spoke powerfully to their situation and needs, and recognized this common need throughout the world.

Del Escritorio del Párroco

Domingo del BAUTISMO DE JESUS. Con la fiesta del Bautismo de Jesús concluimos el tiempo navideño y entramos en el Tiempo Ordinario Litúrgico. La Liturgia del Bautismo de Jesús marca la tercera manifestación del Señor. Luego de haber sido **adorado por los pastores** en la noche de Navidad y **los Reyes Magos** en la Epifanía, hoy lo encontramos en las **orillas del Jordán**, allí donde Juan bautizaba con agua y predicaba la conversión de los corazones. El Bautista habla muy claro de su misión: *"Yo los bautizo con agua, pero vendrá, pues de mi aquel que es más fuerte: El los bautizará con espíritu santo y fuego"*. Así que, Jesús se pone en fila para que lo bautice. Aquel día Jesús, recogido en oración, se sumergió en el agua hasta casi desaparecer de la mirada de los presentes. Notamos que Jesús vivió en el Jordán una **experiencia “fundante”**, como decimos espiritualmente, que marcó para siempre su vida futura. En aquel momento deja el Bautista, su aldea de Nazaret y movido por el Espíritu, comenzó a recorrer los caminos de Galilea anunciando la Buena Noticia de Dios. Jesús vivió una manifestación muy fuerte en la escena del bautismo, como dice el texto: *"Los cielos se rasgan y de la voz del cielo se escucha: Tú eres mi hijo querido. En ti me complazco"*. Esto es lo que Jesús escucha de Dios en su interior: *"Tú eres mío. Eres mi hijo. Tu ser está brotando de mí. Yo soy tu Padre. Con cariño le expresa: Te quiero entrañablemente; me llena de gozo que seas mi hijo amado; me siento feliz"*. En adelante, Jesús no lo llamará con otro nombre, sino **Abba, Padre**. De esta experiencia emergen **dos actitudes** que Jesús vivió y trató de contagiar a todos: **confianza increíble en Dios y docilidad al Padre**. Jesús confía en Dios de manera espontánea. Se abandona a él sin recelos ni cálculos. **Confía en Dios. Se siente hijo querido**. Por eso enseña a todos a **llamarle a Dios “Padre”**. Les repite una y otra vez: **“No tengan miedo. Confíen”**. Toda su vida la pasó enfocado en hacer la **Voluntad del Padre**. Que participando en el Bautismo de Jesús renovemos nuestro compromiso bautismal y nos esforcemos de hacer su voluntad y gozar la gracia de ser una nueva creatura en una vivencia entusiasta y generosa.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Il Battesimo di Gesù — Quando Luca si mette a scrivere il suo Vangelo, l'inizio del racconto evangelico è ormai fisso e tradizionale. Le prediche dei missionari cristiani incominciano con il ricordo dell'attività e predicazione del Battista. Ma l'inquadratura storica a grande angolatura è tipica di Luca. Ci ricorda i grandi storici greci. Luca vuole dare una dimensione storica e un significato cristiano: vuole dare valore agli avvenimenti storici e un messaggio specificamente cristologico: non è il potere storico dell'imperatore di Roma, Tiberio Cesare, non è il potere religioso, politico e locale palestinese e nemmeno i pontefici di Gerusalemme, ma la Parola di Dio che arriva a Giovanni, figlio di Zaccaria nel deserto, che guida la storia universale. «La salvezza di Dio» non nasce da un potere politico o religioso, ma unicamente da Dio.

Anche i racconti riguardo gli antichi profeti d'Israele iniziavano con le introduzioni storico-politiche. Ma ora la parola profetica risuona con l'urgenza del tempo ultimo. La parola di Dio chiama fuori dal deserto il figlio di Zaccaria per mandarlo al popolo. Il compito di questo carismatico è quello di preparare la venuta del Signore. Il Battista è ritratto secondo il modello dei missionari cristiani che preparono i neofiti cristiani al battesimo.

Il battesimo di Gesù — Il battesimo di Giovanni è un rito di immersione che può ispirarsi alle abluzioni o battesimo del giudaismo ufficiale, bagno dei proseliti o a quello dei circoli separatisti, quali ad esempio quello degli Esseni o dei discepoli di Qumran. Ma il suo battesimo è qualificato da una innovazione: è giunto il momento, il tempo dei profeti per ricevere il perdono di Dio. Questo però comporta un cambiamento radicale ed un nuovo impegno religioso. L'annuncio dei profeti, che aveva sostenuto la speranza dei deportati del sesto secolo avanti Cristo, ora risuona con un timbro nuovo: «Ogni valle sarà colmata, ogni monte e ogni colle sarà abbassato.» L'immagine del «monte» e del «colle» può significare la fine di ogni prepotere. Ma nella prospettiva di Luca è soprattutto l'impegno per il rinnovamento delle coscienze, della mentalità, ossia di un «ritorno sincero» al Signore.

L'interesse peculiare di Luca — All'appello decisivo alla conversione segue un'istruzione più pacata rivolto al popolo che interroga Giovanni: cambiare vuole dire praticare la fraternità e la giustizia secondo la grande tradizione profetica. Ma dal piccolo catechismo a dialogo emerge anche l'interesse particolare di Luca per i poveri, per le categorie disprezzate, per gli esattori di tasse, per i soldati a servizio del potere. Arriva infine l'immagine della «pula» e del «grano»: la scelta e separazione sarà fatta solo da Cristo: quale mettere nel granaio e quale bruciare nel fuoco.

Per fare nostra la preghiera sacerdotale di Gesù: "che anch'essi siano uno, come Padre, tu ed io siamo uno"




