### From the Pastor's Desk

II SUNDAY O.T. & WEEK OF PRAYER FOR THE UNITY OF CHRISTIANS: "We were treated with an unusual request" (Acts 28: 2). This second Sunday of ordinary time invites us to reflect once more on the Baptist's testimony and on Jesus' mission as "**the lamb of God sent to free us from sin**". We also welcome the call of the Pontifical Council for the Promotion of Christian Unity, January 18-25, 2020. Christians, disciples of Jesus Christ, Lord and Savior, are called every year to pray for unity, thus honoring our faith in: "**One Lord, one faith, one baptism**" (Eph. 4: 5). Ecumenism, as the way Christians do to seek to manifest more fully the unity of the Church in the midst of history and of our time, implies that we recognize that God is the center and protagonist of our lives. Praying together is a very important first step to be the men and women who build ties of fraternity and in building bridges, instead

of walls that divide and exclude others. The Lord himself with his Holy Spirit is building unity, moving to the conversion and reception of all towards the salvation and a participation in his life. United in the Holy Spirit of unity, we can pray together and ask that we be better missionary - disciples every day. The bishops of the Episcopal Commission of Interconfessional Relations have also made public a message in which they explain that this year, the Octave of prayer is inspired by the story of the storm that suffered the ship that took St. Paul to Rome with some prisoners and that they ended up rescued in Malta "with true humanity from the natives of the island and from the main servant, Publio, who welcomed the shipwrecked in his own home and helped them with the admiration of many". This is a very typical story - say the bishops - if we think of the many migrants and refugees who are crossing the Mediterranean nowadays in search of a safe harbor. Thousands of them flee their home countries persecuted for their faith or their ideas. Today many people face the same fears in the same seas. The same sites that are named in the reading (27:21; 28: 1), also appear in the stories of today's migrants. In other parts of the world many others undertake equally dangerous trips by land and sea to escape natural disasters, wars and poverty. Their lives are also at the mercy of immense forces, cold and indifference, not only belonging to nature, but also political, economic and human. This indifference of the human being assumes several forms: the indifference of those who sell sites, extorting desperate people or selling ships that are not suitable for sailing; the indifference of those who decide not to send rescue ships; or the indifference of those who force to move boats with migrants from their shores. These are just some examples. As united Christians facing the migration crisis, these stories challenge us: do we join the cold forces of indifference or show "an unusual request", making us witnesses of God's loving providence for all people? The stories contrasted with the reality of the gospel and make a strong call to the unity of action of all Christians, so that we can treat those who ask us for help with caring humanity. The countries from which these migrants come from, suffer from social ills and disorders that force them to seek better living conditions somewhere else. It is necessary to help countries that migrants leave, promoting in them respect for human rights, religious freedom and social welfare that are not now legitimately offer to those who are forced to emigrate ... We pray that this week of prayer help us as Christians to grow in unity and solidarity.




## WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY JANUARY 18–25, 2020

## Del Escritorio del Párroco

**II DOMINGO T.O. & SEMANA DE ORACION POR LA UNIDAD DE LOS CRISTIANOS:** “Nos trataron con una solicitud poco común”, (Hechos 28:2).Este segundo domingo del tiempo ordinario nos invita a reflexionar una vez más en el testimonio del Bautista y en la misión de Jesús como “**cordero de Dios enviado a librarnos del pecado**”. En este espíritu acogemos la llamada del Consejo Pontificio para la Promoción de la Unidad de los cristianos, enero 18-25, 2020. Los cristianos, discípulos de Jesucristo, Señor y Salvador, somos llamados cada año a orar por la unidad, honrando así nuestra fe en: “**Un solo Señor, una sola fe, un solo bautismo**” (Ef.4:5).El ecumenismo, como el camino que hacemos los cristianos por buscar manifestar de manera más plena la unidad de la Iglesia en medio de la historia y de nuestra época, implica que

reconozcamos que Dios es el centro y protagonista de nuestras vidas. Orar juntos es un primer paso muy importante para ser estos hombres y mujeres que construyen lazos de fraternidad y puentes de encuentro, en vez de muros que nos dividen y excluyen. El Señor mismo con su Espíritu Santo va construyendo unidad, moviendo a la conversión y acogida de todos los medios de la salvación para participar de su vida. Unidos en el Espíritu Santo de la unidad podemos orar juntos y pedir que cada día seamos mejores discípulos misioneros. Los obispos de la Comisión Episcopal de Relaciones Interconfesionales también han hecho público un mensaje en el que explican que este año el Octavario se inspira en la narración de la tempestad que sufrió la nave que llevaba a san Pablo a Roma con algunos prisioneros y que acabaron socorridos en Malta “**con verdadera humanidad por los nativos de la isla y por el personaje principal, Publio, que acogió en su propia casa a los náufragos y los auxilió hasta la admiración**”. Este es un relato de gran actualidad- afirman los obispos-, si pensamos en las travesías de los emigrantes y refugiados en busca de puerto seguro en el Mediterráneo. Miles de ellos huyen de sus países de origen perseguidos por su fe o sus ideas. Hoy en día muchas personas se enfrentan a los mismos miedos en los mismos mares. Los mismos sitios que se nombran en la lectura (27:21; 28:1), aparecen también en las historias de los migrantes de hoy. En otros lugares del mundo muchos otros emprenden viajes igualmente peligrosos por tierra y por mar para escapar de catástrofes naturales, de guerras y de la pobreza. También sus vidas están a la merced de inmensas fuerzas, frías e indiferentes, no solo pertenecientes a la naturaleza, sino también políticas, económicas y humanas. Esta indiferencia del ser humano asume varias formas: la indiferencia de aquellos que venden plazas a personas desesperadas en buques que no son aptos para navegar; la indiferencia de los que deciden no mandar naves de rescate; y la indiferencia de los que alejan de sus costas a pateras con migrantes. Estos son solo algunos ejemplos. Como cristianos unidos que enfrentan la crisis migratoria, esta historia nos reta: **¿nos unimos a las frías fuerzas de la indiferencia o mostramos “una solicitud poco común”, haciéndonos testigos de la providencia amorosa de Dios para todas las personas?** El relato contrastado con la realidad de cada día es una fuerte llamada a la unidad de acción de todos los cristianos, para que tratemos con solicita humanidad a cuantos nos piden ayuda. Los países de los que proceden los emigrantes padecen males sociales y desórdenes que les obligan a buscar unas condiciones de vida mejor entre nosotros. Es necesario ayudar a los países que los emigrantes abandonan, promoviendo en ellos el respeto a los derechos humanos, la libertad religiosa y el bienestar social que ahora no pueden legítimamente ofrecer a cuantos se ven obligados a emigrar... **Rezamos porque esta semana de oración nos ayude como cristianos a crecer en la unidad y solidaridad.**

«Nos mostraron una humanidad poco común» (Cf. Hch 28, 2) es el lema de la Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos que se celebrará del 18 al 25 de enero de 2020.

**II DOMENICA T.O. & SETTIMANA DI PREGHIERA PER L'UNITÀ DEI CRISTIANI:** "Siamo stati trattati con una richiesta insolita" (Atti 28: 2). Questa seconda domenica del tempo ordinario ci invita a riflettere ancora una volta sulla testimonianza del Battista e sulla missione di Gesù come "**l'agnello di Dio venuto per liberarci dal peccato**". In questo spirito accogliamo la chiamata del Pontificio Consiglio per la Promozione dell'Unità dei Cristiani, 18-25 gennaio 2020. I cristiani, discepoli di Gesù Cristo, Signore e Salvatore, sono chiamati ogni anno a pregare per l'unità, onorando così la nostra fede in: "**Un solo Signore, una sola fede, un solo battesimo**" (Ef 4, 5). L'ecumenismo, è l'impegno di tutti i cristiani i quali cercano di manifestare pienamente l'unità della Chiesa nel mezzo della storia e dei nostri tempi, affermando che Dio è il centro e il protagonista della nostra vita. Pregare insieme è un primo passo molto importante per essere questi uomini e donne che costruiscono legami di fratellanza e costruiscono ponti, invece di muri che ci dividono ed escludono. Il Signore stesso con il suo Spirito Santo sta costruendo unità, muovendoci verso la conversione e la ricezione della salvezza per godere della sua stessa vita. Uniti nello Spirito Santo dell'unità possiamo pregare insieme e sforzarci di essere migliori discepoli missionari ogni giorno. I vescovi della Commissione episcopale per le relazioni interconfessionali hanno anche reso pubblico un messaggio in cui spiegano che quest'anno l'ottava si ispira alla storia della tempesta che ha subito la nave che portava San Paolo a Roma con alcuni prigionieri e che sono stati riscattati a Malta "con una vera umanità che i nativi dell'isola e il gran servitore, "Publio", hanno esercitato accogliendo i naufraghi, nella sua stessa casa e aiutandoli sotto l'ammirazione di molti". Questa è una storia molto attuale - affermano i vescovi - se pensiamo ai migranti e ai rifugiati che attraversano oggi giorno il Mediterraneo in cerca di un porto sicuro. Migliaia di loro fuggono dai loro paesi di origine perseguitati per la loro fede o le loro idee. Oggi molte persone affrontano le stesse paure negli stessi mari. Gli stessi siti citati nella lettura (27:21; 28: 1), compaiono anche nelle storie dei migranti d'oggi. In altre parti del mondo molti altri intraprendono viaggi altrettanto pericolosi via terra e via mare per sfuggire a catastrofi naturali, guerre e povertà. Le loro vite sono anche in balia di forze immense, fredde e indifferenti, non solo appartenenti alla natura, ma anche a politiche, economie e atti disumani. Questa indifferenza dell'essere umano assume diverse forme: l'indifferenza di coloro che vendono luoghi a persone disperate su navi che non sono adatte alla navigazione; l'indifferenza di coloro che decidono di non inviare navi di soccorso; e l'indifferenza di coloro che spostano le barche con i migranti dalle loro coste. Questi sono solo alcuni esempi. Come cristiani uniti che affrontano la crisi migratoria, questa storia ci sfida: ci uniamo alle fredde forze dell'indifferenza o mostriamo "una richiesta insolita", rendendoci testimoni dell'amorevole provvidenza di Dio per tutte le persone? Queste storie, in contrasto con le realtà di ogni giorno, sono un forte richiamo all'unità d'azione di tutti i cristiani, in modo che possiamo uniti trattare a coloro che ci chiedono aiuto con una risposta di vera umanità. I paesi da cui provengono i migranti soffrono di malattie e disturbi sociali che li costringono a cercare migliori condizioni di vita tra di noi. È necessario aiutare i paesi che escono i migranti, promuovendo in essi il rispetto dei diritti umani, della libertà religiosa e del benessere sociale che ora non possono legittimamente offrire a coloro che sono costretti ad emigrare ... Preghiamo perché questa settimana di preghiera ci aiuti come cristiani a crescere in unità e solidarietà.


