

From the Pastor's Desk



In this Sunday of the ordinary time, we start the continuous reading of the gospel of St. Mark in this Cycle B, the more ancient and first gospel, **known as the gospel of the discipleship**. The fragment of the gospel that we meditate comes after a few verses of the witness and preaching of John the Baptist, the Baptism of Jesus and the temptation in the desert. Today's gospel presents to us two explicit invitations to meditate on our vocation, style and meaning of life with the expression: **"The Kingdom of God is near, repent and believe in the gospel"** and the second: **"come with me, I will make you fishermen"**. This is the Good News that Jesus proclaims, **the closeness of God's Kingdom to us**, and we know, that He will develop it throughout His preaching and ministry. This is also the Good News that invites and challenges us to embrace and to live our life in the **spirit of conversion and faith**. Today's gospel offers another explicit invitation to all of us committed Christians with a petition **to leave something in order to embrace something new** that Jesus expects from you and I. Simon and Andrew, James and John, the two pairs of brothers leave the nets, the father, the work, the style and way of life to become his disciples. What Jesus hopes, it is to follow Him and become fisherman. Like them, you and I are called to renew our faith in Jesus and our discipleship's commitment. I do believe, **Jesus calls and offers us a full, fulfilling and meaningful life**. While we thank God for the Christian journey, we live with Jesus, we ask ourselves: **How could I live better my Christian discipleship as a father, mother, son, daughter, young person, priest and ...?**

THE DEMANDS OF DISCIPLESHIP

Today we encounter readings that already have a Lenten feel about them. Nineveh undergoes a forty-day fast, the psalmist reminds us that God alone can show sinners the way, Paul shows us how fleeting the things and events of this world are, and Jesus cries out "Repent!" before he calls his new followers. "Come after me," Jesus says, but if we are to truly live out the commands and demands of our discipleship through baptism, we must first know our need for conversion, our repentance, our need to believe in the gospel fully. Today's Gospel opens with the stark reminder of what befell John the Baptist for completely living out his vocation as the herald of Christ and the gospel: he was arrested, imprisoned, and martyred. Though few of us will experience consequences that extreme, we must all be ready to risk some sort of rejection as, heeding the call of Jesus, we live out the kingdom of God at hand, repent of our sins, and believe in the good news of salvation.

En este domingo del tiempo ordinario comenzamos la **lectura continuada del evangelio de San Marcos**, el más antiguo y primero evangelio, conocido como el **evangelio del discipulado**. El fragmento que meditamos hoy viene luego de los versículos del testimonio y predicación de Juan el Bautista, del Bautismo de Jesús y de las tentaciones en el desierto. El evangelio de hoy nos ofrece dos invitaciones explícitas para meditar sobre **nuestra vocación, estilo y sentido de vida** con las expresiones: “**El Reino de Dios está cerca, conviértanse y crean en el Evangelio**” y la segunda: “**vengan conmigo y los haré pescadores de hombres**”. Esta es la Buena Noticia que Jesús anuncia, la proximidad del Reino de Dios, que se irá desarrollando con su predicación y prodigios a lo largo de todo su ministerio. Es esta la Buena Noticia que nos invita y reta a abrazar y a vivir: el **espíritu de conversión y fe**. Además, el evangelio de hoy nos ofrece otra invitación explícita a nosotros cristianos comprometidos con una petición de **dejar algo para abrazar algo nuevo** que el Señor Jesús espera de tú y Yo. Simón y Andrés, Santiago y Juan, dos parejas de hermanos dejaron las redes, el padre, los jornaleros, el ciclo vital y personal; los que Jesús quería: que fueran con él y fueran pescadores de hombres. Como ellos, tú y Yo somos llamado a **renovar nuestra fe en Jesús y nuestro camino de discipulado**. Jesús nos llama y nos ofrece una **vida plena, satisfecha y significativa**. Mientras los invito a agradecer a Dios por el camino hecho en nuestra misión cristiana, hoy con Jesús nos preguntamos: **¿cómo podría vivir mejor mi discipulado cristiano como papá, mamá, joven, sacerdote y?**

Fr. Feccia's Reflection



Terza Domenica del T.O. — Tutto comincia con una buona notizia. Che alle origini del Cristianesimo ci sia una buona notizia può sembrare evidente. Eppure... Se ci pensiamo bene, dobbiamo riconoscere che spesso ci figuriamo la nostra fede alla stregua delle altre grandi religioni, come un insieme di credenze, un sistema di concetti spirituali e morali, ereditati da coloro che li ricevettero da Dio e li trasmisero infallibilmente alla chiesa. Parlando della sua infanzia vissuta in un ambiente cristiano tradizionale, Sartre riflette su questo retaggio di «*verità*» che rappresentano altrettante certezze in una società in cui ci

sono fratture culturali. «*Quelle verità appartenevano a tutti, ma nessuno aveva bisogno di farle proprie, era il patrimonio comune*». In una situazione di questo tipo, si può ancora parlare di «*buona notizia?*»

All'origine del cristianesimo non c'è un insegnamento celeste che ha seminato nelle coscienze religiose alcune verità divine, provenienti dalla verità prima. La fede ha inizio e si sviluppa a partire da un **avvenimento decisivo, da una venuta, da una parola che è Gesù Cristo**. La buona notizia di Dio è il suo figlio Gesù, che può dire: il regno di Dio è in mezzo a voi, perché egli è in mezzo a noi. In lui e per mezzo di lui, Dio instaura il suo regno che opera la salvezza dell'umanità.

Da questo punto di vista, il «*primo pescatore di uomini*» è Gesù stesso. Egli non conquista gli uomini imponendosi loro con durezza, ma annunciando loro che tutto, nel mistero cristiano, è *buona notizia*. I dogmi cristiani hanno un'attrattiva particolare: i sacramenti, le beatitudini, la chiesa, il perdono dei peccati sono altrettante buone notizie che si riassumono nella persona di Gesù, che ci salva e ci rivela l'amore del Padre. Il cammino della fede e della conversione consiste semplicemente nell'accogliere questa certezza e nel seguire Gesù senza condizioni. Siamo agli antipodi di un patrimonio di «*verità*» che nessuno ha bisogno di fare proprie, perché non investono la vita concreta.

La Chiesa non è una sala di cultura— L'insegnamento di Gesù sconvolge la vita degli uomini, scuote le coscienze, proibisce qualsiasi attendismo e opportunismo. Il regno di Dio è imminente e viene per mezzo di Gesù. Non si tratta di ascoltare una dottrina, ma di convertirsi e di aderire alla persona del Messia. La tiepidezza non è tollerata, l'esitazione non ha ragione di essere. Dio viene. Alcuni lo comprendono. I più decisi abbandonano tutto per consacrarsi unicamente al vangelo. Mediante l'esempio e la testimonianza dei cristiani, Gesù sprona ogni uomo a rimettere tutto in questione.




