

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

In brushing up for "Catholic Jeopardy," it might help to know that there is only one feast on the calendar for a thing, rather than a person or mystery. It's for a chair: Saint Peter's chair in fact

After the Resurrection, there can be no doubt that the disciples reserved a special place for Simon Peter in the upper room. Later, Peter became the bishop of Antioch in today's Syria, the place where we were first called "Christians." From there, he went to Rome, the center of the Empire, where it is said that Peter sat in a chair in the house of Priscilla and Aquila to instruct his flock. Jesus, in entrusting the keys of the Kingdom to Peter and his successors, entrusted his compassion and mercy to them, and charged them with pointing to the Kingdom of God. Compassion and mercy are to resonate through their teaching.

Since the ancient sign of a teacher is the chair ("disciple" literally means one who sits at the feet of a teacher), Peter's chair has long been treasured. Today there is a symbolic shrine of Peter's chair above the main altar of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. This monument is the last work of Bernini, a huge bronze throne supported by four doctors of the Church: Augustine and Ambrose from the Western Church, and Chrysostom and Athanasius from the East. High above it is the alabaster window of the descent of the Holy Spirit.

**Pilgrimage to St. Martha Church**


On **Sunday, February 26**, some members of Altar & Rosary will be going on a pilgrimage to St. Martha's Church in Morton Grove. They will depart Our Lady of Mt. Carmel at 10:00 am in order to attend 11:00 am mass and a tour by Fr. O'Neil, Pastor of St. Martha's.

The church is home to over 1500 relics, statues, and other religious artifacts which go back centuries. Their collection even includes hair from the Blessed Mother. After the tour, there will be a stop for lunch before heading back to Mt. Carmel, which should be at approximately 3:30 pm.

Total cost of the pilgrimage will depend on how many people are going and if we need to rent a bus. Currently we have access to a 16 passenger van and several members offered to drive and take people with them. If we have enough drivers, the only cost will be a collection to give Fr. O'Neil for St. Martha's. Lunch will be on your own.



**SABIDURÍA DIVINA**

Y en el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús se adelanta. ¿Si te golpean, pon la otra mejilla? ¿Tratar a los enemigos como si fueran amigos? Y así otra vez, estamos tentados a pensar que son bonitos ideales, pero no muy prácticos en el “mundo real”.

Pablo hace eco a las palabras de Jesús cuando les dice a los corintios que lo que parece ser sabiduría de los hombres es absurdo para Dios. La sabiduría divina brilla sobre los buenos y los malos, llueve sobre los honestos y deshonestos, sin distinción. Debemos examinar nuestra sabiduría y sentido común para ver cómo estos se comparan con la sabiduría de Dios, y hacer los ajustes correspondientes.

**TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE**

Aún lo recuerdo, estaba viajando en el metro de la ciudad de Roma cuando subieron dos mujeres con niños. Vestían como si fueran a una fiesta de disfraces. Noté que todas las personas las evitaban. Eran gitanas, esas a las que mi mamá y mis tías me iban a dar si no me portaba bien. Los gitanos no tienen una buena reputación entre las naciones. Tienen la misma reputación de los pastores de Palestina que vivieron en tiempos de Jesús. Se piensa que son ladrones e inmorales, gente a la que hay que tenerle miedo.

Sin embargo, decimos que Jesús es nuestro Buen Pastor. En Jesús, todas las personas que jamás creeríamos capaces de alcanzar la santidad, lo logran. Tal es el caso del Pelé o Zeferino Jiménez, un gitano que en 1936 fue fusilado por militares españoles. El motivo de su muerte fue la enseñanza y difusión de la fe en Cristo. Su muerte fue la cumbre de una vida de fe como franciscano seglar. El ejemplo de vida que este gitano nos dio, logró hacer que los españoles lo respetaran y olvidaran sus prejuicios en contra de su gente. Además de eso, evangelizó a sus hermanos gitanos.



## Fr. Feccia's Reflection



**Settima Domenica del T.O. — Ciclo "A".** Nel brano evangelico di oggi si insiste ancora una volta sul compimento della legge dettato da Gesù, nuovo Mosé.

È necessario anzitutto superare la legge del taglione, comune alle civiltà antiche, che a noi può sembrare molto dura, ma che aveva rappresentato a suo tempo un innegabile progresso rispetto alla proliferazione anarchica della vendetta individuale. All'epoca di Gesù non veniva più applicata con il primitivo rigore, ma il principio rimaneva valido. Che la pena sia proporziona-

ta alla colpa non è uno dei fondamenti del diritto penale? Gesù mette in discussione questo diritto, considerato legittimo in nome di una giustizia più alta. All'opposto della vendetta regolamentata, che rischia sempre di innescare la spirale della violenza, Gesù predica la non violenza che rinuncia a rispondere al male con le stesse armi.

E non è ancora tutto. L'antico testamento raccomandava già di amare il prossimo come se stessi. Ma col termine prossimo si intendeva il compatriota, il giudeo, o al massimo lo straniero che aveva fissato la propria dimora in Israele o l'immigrato che era stato accolto e assimilato al popolo giudaico. Per Gesù invece, ogni uomo, fosse anche un nemico o un persecutore, diventa il prossimo. All'odio istintivo egli oppone l'amore, un amore operante come si esprime attraverso gesti concreti: l'ospitalità offerta allo straniero, la preghiera per i persecutori.

Ingenuità, utopia? Basta guardarsi intorno per verificare che un gesto di pace spesso è molto più efficace di una conferenza sul disarmo, che la giustizia non si realizza se non attraverso la carità, che la pazienza è la forza dei non violenti. Ma soprattutto, basta guardare Gesù, modello perfetto di tali atteggiamenti, che costituiscono l'essenza stessa del cristianesimo.

**Siamo tutti figli di Dio**— L'idolo che vogliamo servire al quale siamo fedeli (il nostro «buon Dio»), non assomiglia affatto al Dio del Vangelo. Noi vogliamo un Dio indulgente con i buoni e severo con i cattivi, un Dio che dia ragione alle nostre discriminazioni e distinzioni. Tutte le differenze, anche le più enormi, che noi stabiliamo fra gli uomini, sono irrilevanti e non esistono agli occhi di Dio. A tutti, senza distinzioni, egli distribuisce i segni del suo amore. È questo il motivo per cui, come figli di uno stesso Padre, non possiamo più tener conto delle distinzioni, neppure fra cristiani e non-cristiani, fra credenti e atei, fra buoni e cattivi. Tutti sono figli di mio Padre, quindi miei fratelli.

**Non dobbiamo anche farci perdonare?**

Nel nome della religione e di Cristo i cristiani si sono divisi, lacerando così il corpo di Cristo. Hanno visto nel fratello un nemico, si sono «scomunicati» a vicenda, chiamandosi eretici, bruciando libri ed effigi... E' stato versato sangue, è esploso odio nelle guerre di religione. L'orgoglio, il disprezzo e la mancanza di carità hanno caratterizzato le diatribe teologiche e gli scritti apologetici. I nemici di Dio, della Chiesa, della religione sono stati combattuti con le armi e con l'odio. Sono state lanciate campagne e crociate. Oggi la Chiesa ha superato, o si avvia a superare, tanti di questi limiti. Non ci sono più eretici, ma fratelli separati; non ci sono più avversari, ma interlocutori; non guardiamo più a ciò che divide, ma prima di tutto a ciò che unisce; non condanniamo in blocco e aprioristicamente le grandi religioni non cristiane, ma vediamo in esse autentici valori umani e precristiani che ci consentono di entrare in dialogo.

Ma l'intolleranza e la polemica sono sempre in agguato. Non capita forse che esercitiamo all'interno della stessa nostra Chiesa quell'aggressività e quella polemica eccessiva che prima era rivolta verso l'esterno? Quanti cristiani impegnati, venuto a mancare il bersaglio al di fuori, si sono rivolti a cercare i loro «nemici» all'interno della Chiesa e li combattono con puntiglio, senza amore e senza perdono!




