## From the Pastor's Desk



**Our Lenten Journey has begun.** Moved by the Spirit, the Lord Jesus went into the desert and remained there for forty days and forty nights; at the end of that experience, he was tempted by the devil... however, strengthened by that experience of communion with His Father in heaven through fasting and praying, he was able to overcome those temptations and thus return to his own people ready to lead them in a journey of Grace and Blessings into the fullness of New Life.

Inspired by this experience of Jesus, year in and year out, God's providence offers His People with the possibility of journeying through Lent into the Grace of New Life. It is important, though, to clearly understand that unless we dare to fully embrace the journey as a Faith commitment, we run the risk to avoid being transformed into New Creatures. By Prayer, Sacrifice and Alms Giving, believers in Christ are called to undertake this forty days of Lent as a drive from death into Life, from darkness to Light, from sin to Grace. That triple practice the Church relies on (Prayer, Fasting/Sacrifice and Alms Giving), suddenly becomes the shortest route to ensure believers with the Gift of New Life and Resurrection, God wishes to bestow on us when Easter arrives. The Triumph of Jesus over death is a gift God wants to share with all believers, however it is not possible to fully enjoy such and incredible gift, unless we have found the courage to get rid from all expressions of death in our life. When touched by sin, we stain ourselves with dis-Grace, therefore, unless we make the conscious move to empty ourselves from any expression of wickedness, the Glory of Easter will not fully shine in our horizon.

Here at the Parish-Shrine, we are offering different moments of prayer, reflection and encounter with the Lord, to make out of the Lenten Season an occasion of transformation and conversion. The evening of Recollection of March 9<sup>th</sup>, the Reconciliation Service on Friday 24th, Weekly Lenten Reflection with Novena and Benediction every Wednesday and Stations of the Cross every Friday, and above all, Sunday Mass... all these religious practices are to be seen as the tools to prepare our hearts for rebirth once the season is over. Let's come to Church this lent, let's profit from the means we are being offered and let's give God the opportunity to guide us into the fullness of life.





### STRENGTH AGAINST TEMPTATION

The first Sunday of the season of Lent always includes a Gospel account of the temptation of the Lord Jesus in the desert by the devil. This year, the story is set against the backdrop of the first reading from Genesis, which recounts the very first temptation by the devil. That story is set in a garden of delight. The Gospel story is set in the desert. As believers, we know that temptation comes our way in our own gardens of delight as well as the deserts of our lives. As Lent begins, our attention is drawn to that temptation within each of us to become like God—we want control, power, and answers to all of life's difficult questions. As communities of faith, we are given this season of repentance so that we can join our hearts with others on the difficult journey of conversion. We look to God and to one another for strength against temptation.

### ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old or older on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but are not yet 59. Those who are bound by these regulations may take Only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The Paschal abstinence and fasting are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged on Holy Saturday.



## Mensaje del Párroco

**¡Hemos comenzado nuestra jornada cuaresmal!** Por seis semanas estaremos avanzando hacia la Pascua con el deseo de encontrar Vida Nueva y Resurrección en la Victoria de Cristo sobre la muerte. Inspirados en el Señor Jesús que por cuarenta días y cuarenta noches se internó en el desierto y al final venció las tentaciones de satanás, los creyentes abrazamos esta oportunidad de Cuaresma como una manera de viajar hacia nuestros corazones y encontrar allí todo lo que estorba, todo lo que no ayuda, todo lo que se opone a una relación personal con Dios y a la plenitud de una Vida en la Gracia.



### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Luego de una larga peregrinación, una imagen de Cristo llegó al pueblo de Esquipulas, Guatemala, el 9 de marzo de 1595. Dicha imagen negra de Cristo crucificado fue esculpida por Quirio Cataño a pedido de los habitantes del pueblo recién evangelizado.

En 1595, la recién esculpida estatua de Cristo iba rumbo a su destino, pero por cada pueblo que pasaba la gente pedía que lo dejaran una noche para que los fieles pudieran admirarla y rendirle culto a Cristo. Por tanto, la imagen tardó varios meses en llegar a su destino final.

Recientemente, una réplica del Cristo Negro de Esquipulas también tuvo problemas en llegar a su destino. Dicha copia, hecha en Guatemala para la comunidad guatemalteca de Los Ángeles, California, tuvo problemas al cruzar la frontera entre México y Estados Unidos, ya que las autoridades de inmigración no permitieron pasarla por falta de documentos. Los fieles no tuvieron otra opción que pasarlal, a precio de "mordidas" y a escondidas, por lo cual se le llama el Cristo "Mojado" de Esquipulas. Cristo tuvo que entrar en este país como muchos inmigrantes latinos, a escondidas.

## Fr. Feccia's Reflection



**1a domenica di Quaresima — Anno “A” \* Premessa.** Il tempo liturgico della quaresima è caratterizzato da due *tematiche*: la dominazione penitenziale e la chiara ispirazione battesimale. Particolarmente espressive di questi valori sono le letture bibliche domenicali: il vangelo della tentazione (1<sup>o</sup> domenica), seguiti per l’anno “A”, dai tre vangeli classici della primitiva iniziazione cristiana: la samaritana, il cieco guarito, la risurrezione di Lazzaro... vangeli che ci


descrivono la natura stessa della vita cristiana, vista come esigenza di conversione (samaritana), come vita nella luce della fede (cieco guarito), come risurrezione a vita nuova (risurrezione di Lazzaro).

Non è ormai fuori moda la quaresima, questa «*decima dell’anno*» offerta a Dio? Una lunga quaresima di quaranta giorni di digiuno nel deserto dove il corpo e l’*anima del nuovo Adamo si fanno più liberi* e la sua coscienza diventa più limpida e trasparente. Solidale con tutti coloro che sono costretti a *subire* la fame e l’*oppressione*, Gesù, nuovo Mosè rivive i quarant’anni di lotta di Israele nelle solitudini dell’*esodo*. «*Nel deserto io valgo quanto le mie divinità*» (S.Exupery). Raccontando col linguaggio vivo delle immagini questa prova, i vangeli suggeriscono che Gesù, *vero Dio e vero uomo, fu tentato da satana tutta la sua vita*.

Molto più tardi egli stesso descriverà ai discepoli i tentativi compiuti dal suo avversario per *offuscare in lui la coscienza della proposta missione*. Avrebbe accettato di essere povero, ignorato, debole? sarebbe stato capace di non cedere con la realtà dell’*incarnazione rinunciando a servirsi come un superuomo dei miracoli, dell’autorità, della potenza di attrazione*? Sarebbe stato il figlio-servo, secondo il cuore di Dio, o un Prometeo che *conta soltanto sulle proprie forze per rubare il fuoco dal cielo*? Ogni volta che Gesù, *nel suo cuore di carne, ha conosciuto la tentazione di un messianismo temporale l’ha respinta per appoggiarsi unicamente alla parola di Dio. Ha fuggito le folle che chiedevano prodigi e volevano farlo re. Ha allontanato decisamente Pietro che cercava di distoglierlo dalla strada della passione. Ha voluto bere il calice amaro della propria morte, rinunciando a salvare se stesso quando è stato inchiodato sulla croce*.



## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In recent years, there has been a resurgence of interest in various forms of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Some people suggest that this recovers an ancient tradition in the church, when in fact the practice belongs to a later time. The custom of showing the consecrated host to the people, encased in a vessel called a monstrance, developed in a period of history when even very pious people received Communion only rarely. The opportunity to see the host raised high above the head of the priest at Mass, or to see the host exposed outside of Mass, was thought by many to be a form of spiritual Communion. Without question, our Catholic practice of reserving the consecrated host both for adoration and Communion of the sick and dying is a cherished tradition.

Over the next few weeks, we'll look at how these traditions developed and how the Church envisions reservation and adoration today. We do this by the light of the liturgical reforms that have restored a heightened appreciation for how receiving the Body and Blood of Christ is central to our worship. "Perpetual Adoration," "Reservation," "Benediction," and "Reposition" are all part of the Catholic vocabulary. Often the terms are misused, and a tangled history—as well as widely varying practices in our parishes—adds to the confusion. 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
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
