## From the Pastor's Desk

**II SUNDAY OF LENT.** The second week of Lent is always the Sunday of the **Transfiguration**. After Jesus announced to his disciples that he was going to Jerusalem to suffer the passion, he reassures them with the anticipated manifestation of his Glory, the **Transfiguration**. It is precisely what happens in Tabor: "**Jesus was transfigured in front of them: his face became bright as the sun and his clothes became white as light**" says the evangelist. Pedro, overwhelmed by this experience proposes to make three tents. His desire to remain there in the company of Jesus, Moses and Elijah is clear, but he is interrupted by a voice - and this is the center of the message - that comes out of a cloud, that envelops everything: "**This is my beloved Son , in whom I am pleased; listen to him**". The voice of the Lord also comes to us, as it did for Peter, James and John. It is the most precious, clearest, brightest Word that the Lord has given us. Peter realizes that this

Jesus who is in front of him is much more than what they had understood until that moment. In this Lent let's listen to him, let's open our heart to him. Conversion, it means listening to Him, and not our thoughts and customs. He has defeated death and made life shine. Let us continue the reflection with the second part of Pope Francis' Lenten message that he presents to us: *God's passionate will to dialogue with his children*. The fact that the Lord once again offers us a favorable time for our conversion should never be taken for granted. This new opportunity ought to awaken in us a sense of gratitude and stir us from our sloth. Despite the sometimes-tragic presence of evil in our lives, and in the life of the Church and the world, this opportunity to change our course expresses God's unwavering will not to interrupt his dialogue of salvation with us. In the crucified Jesus, who knew no sin, yet for our sake was made to be sin (cf. *2 Cor 5:21*), this saving will led the Father to burden his Son with the weight of our sins, thus, in the expression of Pope Benedict XVI, "**turning of God against himself**" (*Deus Caritas Est*, 12). For God also loves his enemies (cf. *Mt 5:43-48*). The dialogue that God wishes to establish with each of us through the paschal mystery of his Son is in putting the paschal mystery at the center of our lives, which means feeling compassion towards the wounds of the crucified Christ present in the many innocent victims of wars, in attacks on life, from that of the unborn to that of the elderly, and various forms of violence. They are likewise present in environmental disasters, the unequal distribution of the earth's goods, human trafficking in all its forms, and the unbridled thirst for profit, which is a form of idolatry. Today too, there is a need to appeal to men and women of good will to share, by almsgiving, their goods with those most in need, as a means of personally participating in the building of a better world. Charitable giving makes us more human, whereas hoarding risks making us less human, imprisoned by our own selfishness. We can and must go even further, and consider the structural aspects of our economic life. For this reason, in the midst of Lent this year, from 26 to 28 March, I have convened a **meeting in Assisi with young economists**, entrepreneurs and change-makers, with the aim of shaping a more just and inclusive economy. As the Church's magisterium has often repeated, political life represents an eminent form of charity (cf. Pius XI, *Address to the Italian Federation of Catholic University Students*, 18 December 1927). The same holds true for economic life, which can be approached in the same evangelical spirit, the spirit of the Beatitudes. I ask Mary Most Holy to pray that our Lenten celebration will open our hearts to hear **God's call to be reconciled to himself**, to fix our gaze on the paschal mystery, and to be converted to an open and sincere dialogue with him. In this way, we will become what Christ asks his disciples to be: **the salt of the earth and the light of the world** (cf. *Mt 5:13-14*). Francis

## Del Escritorio del Párroco

**II DOMINGO DE CUARESMA.** La segunda semana de Cuaresma es siempre el domingo de la **Trasfiguración**. Luego que Jesús anunció a sus discípulos que iba a Jerusalén a sufrir la pasión, los tranquiliza con la manifestación anticipada de su Gloria, la **Trasfiguración**. Es precisamente lo que sucede en el Tabor: "**Jesús se transfiguró delante de ellos: su rostro se puso brillante como el sol y sus vestidos se volvieron blancos como la luz**", señala el evangelista. Pedro, sobre cogido por esta luz, toma la palabra y propone hacer tres tiendas. Está claro su deseo de quedarse allí en compañía de Jesús, Moisés y Elías, pero le interrumpe una voz -y este es el centro del episodio- que sale de una nube, también luminosa, que lo envuelve todo: "**Este es mi Hijo amado, en quien me complazco; escúchenlo**". De la nube que envuelve el libro santo de las Escrituras también sale para nosotros, como lo hizo para Pedro, Santiago y Juan, la voz del Señor. Es la Palabra más preciosa, más clara, más luminosa que el Señor nos ha donado. Pedro se da cuenta que ese Jesús que está frente a él es mucho más de lo que habían comprendido hasta ese momento. En esta cuaresma reconozcámolo, escuchémoslo. Cambiar la propia vida significa escucharle a Él, y no a nuestras razones y costumbres. Él ha vencido la muerte y ha hecho resplandecer la vida. Continuemos la reflexión con la segunda parte del mensaje cuaresmal de Papa Francisco que nos presenta: la *apasionada voluntad de Dios de dialogar con sus hijos*. El hecho de que el Señor nos ofrezca una vez más un tiempo favorable para nuestra conversión nunca debemos darlo por supuesto. Esta nueva oportunidad debería suscitar en nosotros un sentido de reconocimiento. En efecto, Dios ama también a sus enemigos (cf. Mt 5,43-48). El diálogo que Dios quiere entablar con todo hombre, mediante el Misterio pascual de su Hijo, no es como el que se atribuye a los atenienses, los cuales «no se ocupaban en otra cosa que en decir o en oír la última novedad» (*Hch 17,21*). *Una riqueza para compartir, no para acumular sólo para sí mismo*. Poner el Misterio pascual en el centro de la vida cristiana significa sentir compasión por las **llagas de Cristo crucificado presentes en las numerosas víctimas** inocentes de las guerras, de los abusos contra la vida tanto del no nacido como del anciano, de las múltiples formas de violencia, de los desastres medioambientales, de la distribución injusta de los bienes de la tierra, de la trata de personas en todas sus formas y de la sed desenfrenada de ganancias, que es una forma de idolatría. Hoy sigue siendo importante recordar a los hombres y mujeres de buena voluntad que deben compartir sus bienes con los más necesitados mediante la limosna, como forma de participación personal en la construcción de un mundo más justo. Compartir con caridad hace al hombre más humano, mientras que acumular conlleva el riesgo de que se embrutezca, ya que se cierra en su propio egoísmo. Podemos y debemos ir incluso más allá, considerando las dimensiones estructurales de la economía. Por este motivo, en la Cuaresma de 2020, del 26 al 28 de marzo, he convocado en Asís a los jóvenes economistas, empresarios y *change-makers*, con el objetivo de contribuir a diseñar una economía más justa e inclusiva que la actual. Como ha repetido muchas veces el magisterio de la Iglesia, la política es una forma eminentemente de caridad (cf. Pío XI, *Discurso a la FUCI*, 18 diciembre 1927). También lo será el ocuparse de la economía con este mismo espíritu evangélico, que es el espíritu de las Bienaventuranzas. Invoco la intercesión de la Bienaventurada Virgen María sobre la próxima Cuaresma, para que escuchemos el llamado a dejarnos reconciliar con Dios, fijemos la mirada del corazón en el Misterio pascual y nos convirtamos a un diálogo abierto y sincero con el Señor. De este modo podremos ser lo que Cristo dice de sus discípulos: **sal de la tierra y luz del mundo** (cf. Mt 5,13-14). **Francisco**



## II DOMENICA DI QUARESIMA.

La seconda settimana di Quaresima è sempre la domenica della **Trasfigurazione**. Dopo che Gesù annunciò ai suoi discepoli che sarebbe andato a Gerusalemme per soffrire la passione, li rassicura con la manifestazione anticipata della sua Gloria, la **Trasfigurazione**. È esattamente ciò che accade nel Tabor: "Gesù fu trasfigurato davanti a loro: il suo volto brillò come il sole e le sue vesti divennero candide come la luce", dice l'evangelista. Pedro, soprappiuttato da questa esperienza, prende la parola e propone di costruire tre capanne. Il suo desiderio di rimanere lì in compagnia di Gesù, Mosè ed Elia è evidente, ma è interrotto da una voce - e questo è il centro dell'episodio - che esce da una nuvola splendente, che avvolge tutto: "**Questi è il Figlio mio, l'amato:in lui ho posto il mio compiacimento. Ascoltatele**". La voce del Signore arriva anche a noi dalla nuvola, come è giunta per Pietro, Giacomo e Giovanni. È la Parola più preziosa, più chiara, più luminosa che il Signore ci ha dato. Pietro si rende conto che questo Gesù che è di fronte a lui è molto più di quello che avevano capito fino a quel momento. In questa Quaresima riconosciamolo, ascoltiamolo. Per cambiare la propria vita bisogna ascoltarlo, più che fissarsi sulle nostre ragioni e abitudini, perché lui è colui che ha sconfitto la morte e ha fatto brillare la vita. Continuiamo la riflessione con la seconda parte del **messaggio quaresimale di Papa Francesco** che ci presenta: *L'appassionata volontà di Dio di dialogare con i suoi figli*. Il fatto che il Signore ci offra ancora una volta un tempo favorevole alla nostra conversione non dobbiamo mai darlo per scontato. Questa nuova opportunità dovrebbe suscitare in noi un senso di riconoscenza e scuoterci dal nostro torpore. Malgrado la presenza, talvolta anche drammatica, del male nella nostra vita, come in quella della Chiesa e del mondo, questo spazio offerto al cambiamento di rotta esprime la tenace volontà di Dio di non interrompere il dialogo di salvezza con noi. In Gesù crocifisso, che "**Dio fece peccato in nostro favore**" (*2Cor 5,21*), questa volontà è arrivata al punto di far ricadere sul suo Figlio tutti i nostri peccati, fino a "mettere Dio contro Dio", come disse Papa Benedetto XVI (cfr Enc. *Deus caritas est*, 12). Dio infatti ama anche i suoi nemici (cfr *Mt 5,43-48*). Il dialogo che Dio vuole stabilire con ogni persona, mediante il Mistero pasquale del suo Figlio, e farsi che diventi il centro della vita del cristiano, affinché senta compassione per le piaghe di Cristo crocifisso presenti nelle tante vittime innocenti delle guerre, dei soprusi contro la vita, dal nascituro fino all'anziano, delle molteplici forme di violenza, dei disastri ambientali, dell'iniqua distribuzione dei beni della terra, del traffico di esseri umani in tutte le sue forme e della sete sfrenata di guadagno, che è una forma di idolatria. Anche oggi è importante richiamare gli uomini e le donne di buona volontà alla condivisione dei propri beni con i più bisognosi attraverso l'elemosina, come forma di partecipazione personale all'edificazione di un mondo più equo. La condivisione nella carità rende l'uomo più umano; l'accumulare rischia di abbrutirlo, chiudendolo nel proprio egoismo. Possiamo e dobbiamo spingerci anche oltre, considerando le dimensioni strutturali dell'economia. Per questo motivo, nella Quaresima del 2020, dal 26 al 28 marzo, ho **convocato ad Assisi giovani economisti**, imprenditori e *change-makers*, con l'obiettivo di contribuire a delineare un'economia più giusta e inclusiva di quella attuale. Come ha più volte ripetuto il magistero della Chiesa, la politica è una forma eminente di carità (cfr Pio XI, *Discorso alla FUCI*, 18 dicembre 1927). Altrettanto lo sarà l'occuparsi dell'economia con questo stesso spirito evangelico, che è lo spirito delle Beatitudini. Invoco l'intercessione di Maria Santissima sulla prossima Quaresima, affinché accolgiamo l'appello a lasciarci riconciliare con Dio, fissiamo lo sguardo del cuore sul Mistero pasquale e ci convertiamo a un dialogo aperto e sincero con Dio. In questo modo potremo diventare ciò che Cristo dice dei suoi discepoli: **sale della terra e luce del mondo** (cfr *Mt 5,13-14*). **Francesco**


