## From the Pastor's Desk

**III SUNDAY OF LENT.** This third Sunday of Lent presents us with the IV chapter of the Gospel of Saint John, the encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman. Tired of the road, Jesus sits down to rest by Jacob's well and spring, near the village of Sychar (Sichem). Suddenly a Samaritan woman comes to draw water and Jesus spontaneously begins to talk to her and asks for water. The woman is surprised that a Jew man asks her for water. In the time of Jesus, there were no good relations between Jews and Samaritans. But Jesus, who thirsty, had sat by the well, dares to make his request to the woman: **"Give me a drink"**. The surprised woman must have wondered, how does this foreigner dare to contact me and ask me to drink? Jesus' response is a profound revelation of his identity and announces: **"If you knew the gift of**

**God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water"**. This verse 10 of the IV chapter of the Gospel of St. John is an affirmation that helps us truly understand who Jesus, the Son of God, is. Continuing the conversation with the woman Jesus manifests in a direct, clear, authentic and empathetic manner who he is. Like a radiography, he makes her go through her entire life without judging her, but making her understands the path of her life. Let's believe it, Jesus doesn't really care on our past actions, he cares about our heart, our love, our affection. Jesus, in effect, wants to involve us in his great design of love to free us from our small or big tragic experiences, that we suffered in the past. As he cared for the Samaritan woman, transforming her from a tough, defensive, aggressive woman who was not admitting the disappointments and failures of her life, for the many husbands she had, in an open and transparent woman. Similarly, Jesus wants to love us, to offer us his living water that cleanses, purifies and pacifies us. We know that the encounter with Jesus is always a personal and docile encounter, as it was for the woman, he helped her to be herself, because he did not attack her or humiliate her with an embarrassing revelation of her story of so many desired and failed lovers. Rather, he understood her. This is what transformed her: to be understood, accepted as she was, and loved. And she, who had gone to get water at the well, becomes a fountain of new life for herself and others. Her story could also in this Lent become our story, if we allow ourselves to be challenged and helped by the Lord. The Gospel says that she left her water jar and went quickly not to her house or her neighbors, but to all the town people to announce that she had probably found the **"Lord"** and told everyone of her extraordinary encounter she had had in the Jacob's well with the man **"the Jewish Master"**. All the people came immediately to the well, where Jesus continued to rest, and after hearing him they affirmed: we believe now, because of what we have heard from him, and not because of what the woman has shared with us. Let us pray in this Lent season for the many people and perhaps some of our family members who have now abandoned God and lost that religious beliefs, often before they have had a personal encounter with Jesus or have a deep experience of God as the Samaritan woman had. Yes, I believe that anyone who welcomes Jesus in his/her life and experiences the gift of God will never abandon him. Let us make the experience of the Samaritan woman, the grace of Jesus and the testimony of the loving Church in this Lent, a moment of living and deep encounter with Jesus that by adoring him in his person, we be strengthened to give a deep meaning to our Christian faith and our belonging to the community of God's people. Amen!

## Del Escritorio del Párroco

**III DOMINGO DE CUARESMA.** Este tercer domingo de Cuaresma nos presenta el IV capítulo del Evangelio de San Juan, el encuentro entre Jesús y la mujer samaritana. Jesús cansado del camino se sienta a descansar junto al pozo y manantial de Jacob, cerca de la aldea de Sicar (Siquém). De pronto llega una mujer samaritana a sacar agua y Jesús espontáneamente, comienza a hablar con ella y le pide agua. La mujer se sorprende como tu hombre y judío me pide a mi agua. En el tiempo de Jesús no reinaban buenas relaciones entre judíos y samaritanos. Pero Jesús que sediento, se había sentado junto al pozo se atreve a hacer su petición a la mujer: "Dame de beber". La mujer queda sorprendida. ¿Cómo este extranjero se atreve a entrar en contacto conmigo y a pedirme de beber? La respuesta de Jesús es una revelación profunda de su

identidad y le anuncia: ***"Si conocieras el don de Dios y quién es el que te pide de beber, sin duda tú misma me pedirías a mí, y yo te daría agua viva"***. Este versículo 10 del cuarto capítulo del Evangelio de San Juan es una afirmación que nos ayuda a comprender verdaderamente quien es Jesús, el Hijo de Dios. Continuando la conversación con la mujer Jesús le manifiesta en una manera directa, clara, auténtica y de empatía quien es él. Le hace como una radiografía de su vida que pone al descubierto su pasado sin juzgarla, sino haciéndole entender el camino de su vida. Creémoslo, Jesús en realidad no quiere nuestras acciones pasadas, él quiere nuestros corazones, nuestro amor, nuestro afecto. Jesús, en efecto, quiere involucrarnos en su gran diseño de amor para liberarnos de nuestras pequeñas o grandes experiencias trágicas, malas o sufridas del pasado. Como el amó a la samaritana transformándola de una mujer dura, defensiva, agresiva para no admitir las desilusiones y los fracasos de su vida, como los muchos maridos que había tenido en una persona abierta y transparente, así Jesús quiere amarnos a nosotros, para ofrecernos su agua viva que nos limpia, alivia, purifica y pacifica. Lo sabemos el encuentro con Jesús es siempre un encuentro personal y dócil como lo fue para la mujer que la ayudó a ser ella misma, porque no la agredió, ni la humilló con una descripción embarazosa de su historia de tantos amores buscados y fracasados, sino que la comprendió. Esto es lo que la conmovió: ser comprendida, conocida tal como era, y amada. Y ella, que había ido a coger agua al pozo, se convierte en una fuente de vida. Su historia es también en esta cuaresma nuestra historia si nos dejamos interpelar y ayudar por el Señor. Dice el Evangelio que ella dejó el cántaro y se fue de prisa no a su casa ni a sus vecinos, sino a todo el pueblo a anunciarles que probablemente había encontrado al "Señor" y les contó a todos de su encuentro extraordinario que había tenido en el pozo de Jacob con este hombre "Maestro Judío". Todo el pueblo vino en seguida al pozo, donde Jesús continuaba esperando, y luego de haberlo escuchado afirmaron: ahorita creemos por lo que nosotros hemos escuchado de él, y no por lo que tu mujer nos ha compartido. Recemos porque en esta Cuaresma muchas personas y quizá muchos de nuestros familiares que ya han hoy en día abandonando a Dios antes de haberlo conocido, alcancen tener la experiencia de Dios y de este Jesús que contagia y los lleven a buscarlo y conocerlo como le pasó a la mujer samaritana. Si, creo que cualquier persona que acoge a Jesús en su vida y experimenta el don de Dios, no lo abandonará jamás. Hagamos de la experiencia de la mujer samaritana, la gracia de Jesús y el testimonio de la Iglesia que esta cuaresma sean para todos nosotros un momento de encuentro vivo y profundo con Jesús que adorándolo en su persona logramos a dar un sentido siempre meas pleno a nuestra fe cristiana y a nuestra pertenencia a la Iglesia pueblo de Dios, como sacramento universal de salvación para todos nosotros. ¡Amen!



**III DOMENICA DI QUARESIMA.** Questa terza domenica di Quaresima ci presenta il IV capitolo del Vangelo di San Giovanni, **l'incontro tra Gesù e la samaritana**. Stanco del viaggio, Gesù si siede per riposare accanto al pozzo e alla sorgente di Giacobbe, vicino al villaggio di Sichar. All'improvviso una samaritana viene ad attingere acqua e Gesù inizia spontaneamente a parlarle e gli chiede dell'acqua. La donna è sorpresa che un uomo ed ebreo le chieda acqua. Al tempo di Gesù non c'erano buoni rapporti tra ebrei e samaritani. Ma Gesù, che aveva sete, si era seduto vicino al pozzo, osa fare la sua richiesta alla donna: **"Dammi da bere"**. La donna è sorpresa e pensa come questo straniero osa parlarle e chiedermi da bere? La risposta di Gesù è una profonda rivelazione della sua identità e annuncia: **"Se tu conoscessi il dono di Dio e chi è che ti dice: Dammi da bere, tu stessa gliene avresti chiesto, ed egli t'avrebbe dato dell'acqua viva"**. Questo versetto 10 del IV capitolo del Vangelo di San Giovanni è un'affermazione che ci aiuta a capire veramente chi è Gesù, il Figlio di Dio. Continuando la conversazione con la donna, Gesù le mostra in modo diretto, chiaro, autentico ed empatico chi è. Le fa come una radiografia della sua vita che la porta a svelare il suo passato senza giudicarla, ma piuttosto facendole capire il cammino della sua vita. Crediamolo, Gesù non si fissa sulle nostre azioni passate, lui vuole i nostri cuori, il nostro amore, il nostro affetto. Gesù, in effetti, vuole coinvolgerci nel suo grande disegno d'amore per liberarci dalle nostre piccole o grandi esperienze tragiche, brutte o sofferte del passato. Mentre parlava con la donna samaritana, la trasformò da una donna dura, difensiva e aggressiva per i fallimenti della sua vita e, i molti mariti che aveva avuto in una persona aperta e trasparente. Gesù ci vuole incontrare per amarci, offrirci la sua acqua viva che ci purifica e ci pacifica. Sappiamo che l'incontro con Gesù è sempre un incontro personale e docile come lo è stato per la donna che l'ha aiutata ad essere sé stessa; perché non l'ha attaccata, né l'ha umiliata con una descrizione imbarazzante della sua storia di tanti amori ricercati e falliti, ma l'ha capita ed accolta. Questo ha contribuito a trasformarla: essere capita, conosciuta ed amata com'era. E lei, che era andata a prendere l'acqua dal pozzo, diventa una fonte di vita. La sua storia, in questa Quaresima deve diventare la nostra storia, se permettiamo a noi stessi di essere interrogati e aiutati dal Signore. Il Vangelo dice che lasciò la brocca e andò rapidamente non a casa sua o dai suoi vicini, ma a tutte le persone del paese ad annunciare che probabilmente aveva trovato il **"Signore"** e raccontò a tutti del suo straordinario incontro che aveva avuto nel pozzo di Giacobbe con il "maestro ebreo". Tutte le persone vennero immediatamente al pozzo, dove Gesù stava riposando, e dopo averlo ascoltato affermarono: ora crediamo per ciò che abbiamo ascoltato da lui, e non per ciò che la donna aveva annunciato. Preghiamo perché questa Quaresima sia per le molte persone e forse molti dei nostri familiari che hanno perso e abbandonato il senso di Dio ancora prima di averlo incontrato, faciano l'esperienza di Dio e di questo Gesù che li cerca, ama e desidera essere conosciuto come è avvenuto con la samaritana. Sì, credo che chiunque accolga Gesù nella sua vita e sperimenti il dono di Dio non lo abbandonerà mai più. Facciamo l'esperienza della donna samaritana, che la grazia di Gesù e la testimonianza della Chiesa in questa Quaresima sia per tutti

noi un momento di incontro vivo e profondo con Gesù, adorandolo nella sua persona riusciamo a dare un significato sempre più pieno alla nostra vita cristiana di fede e alla nostra appartenenza alla Chiesa, popolo di Dio, come sacramento universale di salvezza per tutti noi. Amen!



**THIRD SUNDAY COMMUNAL MASS CELEBRATION: March 2020**
