

From the Pastor's Desk

IV SUNDAY of LENT, known as Sunday in LAETARE, (that is, JOY) from the first word of the liturgy. It is an invitation to take a moment to interrupt the severity of the Lenten season and **rejoice**. The liturgy exhorts us to rejoice at the approach of the Passover of the Lord, the victory over sin, darkness and death. Our Lenten journey continues today with the rich and moving **parable of the merciful father and prodigal son**. This parable underscores Jesus' mission to welcome sinners. The

narration of the parable begins with the request of the youngest son to obtain immediately his inheritance. Once obtained, he leaves home. His life, initially full of satisfactions, but soon he is affected by the violence of the famine and by the abandonment of friends. Finding himself alone, he looks for work and he has no other recourse than to take care of pigs. He realizes his mistakes and it is overwhelming and embarrassing for him to remember the beautiful days when he was at his father's house. It is precisely the bitterness of current life, in which he has fallen, that makes him return in his great mistake. Hence, the decision to return to his father's house. Identified his mistake he said: "**I will get up and go to my father ...**". This is the time of return, of repentance, of conversion, of reconciliation ... In all his surprise, the father was waiting for him, and when the son was still far away, the father ran and threw himself to the son's neck and kissed him effusively. The father does not know yet why the son returns, nor does he know what he will say to him, but it does not matter. What matters is that the son had returned; and as soon as he gets to his side, he does not let him say anything and hugs him. The son's heart softens and his tongue also becomes loose. He says a few words, but the father seems not to hear him, and after having dressed him in new clothes, with his shoes and the ring on his finger, he orders them to immediately prepare a big party. The time of the return culminates with a greatest joy for his father who orders a great party with the fattest calf. This provokes the resentment of his older brother who refused to understand the great accomplishment; he does not even want to enter the party room. Moreover, he reproaches his father: "**I have been serving you for so many years, and I never failed to comply with an order from you, and you have never given me a chance to have a party with my friends**". Now that your son has returned, who has devoured your hacienda with prostitutes, you have killed for him the fattened calf! "**The father responds with sweetness to that hardened hearted son:**" You are always with me and what is mine is yours, but it was necessary to hold a party, because, this brother of yours has come back alive". The eldest son, despite being the house all the time, was far from the father's heart. His heart was full of pride for his alleged rights, and he remains outside, alone. Please, be happy, because this brother of yours had died and has come back to life. "**Let this lent be a time to rediscover the awareness of one's own sin, one's own weaknesses, and reach out to God and allow ourselves to be covered with His mercy, forgiveness and love.**



Illinois Bishops Warn Against Extreme Abortion Legislation in General Assembly

As Illinois faces so many pressing issues involving human life and dignity, it is incomprehensible that our elected officials have decided the pressing issue of the day is to enhance the chances that the lives of the most vulnerable and voiceless will be taken. Their efforts, similar to recent actions in New York and Virginia, focus on corrupting our God-given right to life and sowing unnecessary division.

House Bill 2495 and Senate Bill 1942, misnamed the Reproductive Health Act, include so many harmful provisions the full effect of these bills can hardly be imagined. We know the legislation:

- seeks to define abortion as health care and a fundamental right;
- removes abortion clinics from a regulatory framework designed for significant medical procedures;
- attacks a carefully constructed agreement in law on how hospitals care for the victims of sexual assault;
- repeals the ban on partial birth abortion;
- repeals legal protections for doctors and hospitals who decline to participate in abortions;
- requires private health insurance in Illinois to fully cover the cost of abortion;
- removes the requirement that only doctors can perform abortions;
- as well as many other changes that in totality require us to treat abortion as a celebrated right instead of a heart-wrenching tragedy.

Abortion is not health care. It is the intentional taking of innocent and defenseless human life. Moreover, provisions in the law that allow healthcare providers to live and work in accordance with their sincerely-held moral beliefs are not wrong. Freedom of religion and conscience protections are fundamental rights, enshrined in our state and federal constitutions, and they must be respected.

House Bill 2467 and Senate Bill 1594 seek to repeal the Parental Notice of Abortion Act. This law, which has been in statute since 1995 and enforced since 2013, ensures parents are involved in profound medical decisions involving their children. Every other state bordering Illinois – Wisconsin, Indiana, Kentucky, Missouri and Iowa – requires at least parental notification. It is a broadly-supported, reasonable safeguard that allows parents to properly exercise love and care for their children. Our government should support families, not undermine them.

Opposition to these bills do not require one to assume a pro-life political position. Opposition should be the natural result of applying reason, fairness and a basic respect for human dignity to the examination of their contents. We cannot further devalue human life to the extent proposed in this legislation without dire consequences for ourselves. We hope to lead all people of goodwill to rise up and be heard in opposition to these terrible efforts. Accordingly, in the days ahead, we will be distributing more information and calls to action. Today, we ask for your prayers and support as you certainly have ours.

Del Escritorio del Párroco

IV DOMINGO de CUARESMA, conocido como domingo en LAETARE, (es decir de la ALEGRÍA) desde la primera palabra de la liturgia. Es una invitación a tomarse un momento para interrumpir la severidad de la temporada de Cuaresma y regocijarse. La liturgia nos exhorta a alegrarnos por el acercamiento ya de la Pascua del Señor, la victoria sobre el pecado, la oscuridad y la muerte. Nuestro camino cuaresmal continua hoy con la rica y conmovedora **parabola del padre misericordioso y del hijo prodigo**. Esta parabola subraya la misión de Jesús de acoger a los pecadores. Comienza la narración de la parabola con la petición del hijo menor de obtener inmediatamente su herencia. Una vez obtenida se va de casa. Su vida, inicialmente esta llena de satisfacciones, pero más tarde se ve afectada por la violencia de la carestía y por el abandono de los amigos. Encontrandose solo, busca trabajo y no le queda otro recurso que ir a cuidar cerdos. Cae en la cuenta de sus errores y le resulta amargo recordar los bellos días en los que estaba en casa de su padre. Es precisamente la amargura de la vida actual, en la cual ha caído, que lo hace volver en su gran equivocación. De aquí la decisión de volver a la casa de su padre. Identificado su error se dijo: “me levantaré y iré a mi padre...”. Este es el tiempo del retorno, del arrepentimiento, de la conversión, de la reconciliación..... Con toda su sorpresa, el padre lo estaba esperando, y cuando el hijo aun estaba: “todavía lejos, conmovido el padre, corrió, se echó a su cuello y lo besó efusivamente”. El padre no sabe aún por qué vuelve el hijo, ni sabe qué le dirá, pero no importa. Lo que le importa es que el hijo había regresado; y en cuanto llega a su lado no lo deja decir nada y lo abraza. El corazón del hijo se ablanda y también su lengua se suelta. Pronuncia pocas palabras, pero el padre parece no escucharlo, y después de haberlo ataviado con vestidos nuevos, con el calzado y con el anillo en el dedo, ordena que preparen inmediatamente una gran fiesta. El tiempo del retorno culmina con una gran alegría en su padre que ordena una grandísima fiesta con el becerro más gordo. Esto provoca el resentimiento de su hermano mayor que parece no entender; ni siquiera quiere entrar en la sala de la fiesta. Es más, le reprocha al padre: “Hace tantos años que te sirvo, y jamás dejé de cumplir una orden tuya, pero nunca me has dado un cabrito para tener una fiesta con mis amigos; y ¡ahora que ha regresado ese hijo tuyo, que ha devorado tu hacienda con prostitutas, has matado para él el novillo cebado!” El padre responde con dulzura a ese hijo de corazón endurecido: “Tú siempre estás conmigo y lo que es mío es tuyo, pero convenía celebrar una fiesta”. El hijo mayor, a pesar de estar dentro de casa, estaba lejos del corazón del padre. Su corazón estaba lleno de orgullo por sus presuntos derechos, y se queda fuera, solo. No consigue y alegrarse como le repite el padre: “porque ese hermano tuyo había muerto y ha vuelto a la vida”. Questa cuaresma sea un momento para reencontrar la conciencia del propio pecado, de las propias debilidades, y extender la mano hacia Dios y dejarnos cubrir de su Misericordia, perdón y amor.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Quarta domenica di quaresima — Per quale motivo la parabola del «*Figlio prodigo*» risveglia sempre in noi una profonda risonanza? Senza dubbio perché raggiunge, al di là delle fibre della nostra sensibilità, la struttura stessa della nostra esistenza nel suo rapporto con Dio e con il suo Figlio Gesù Cristo. Questa parabola infatti ci parla di un padre misericordioso, di un Dio che si

preoccupa di ogni peccatore al punto che non può rassegnarsi all'idea di perdere uno solo dei suoi figli. Un Dio tutto cuore, ridotto a non essere altro che pazienza eternamente aperta, perché non può mostrarsi pienamente padre finché non vede di nuovo profilarsi all'orizzonte la figura del figlio perduto.

Ma se la parabola ci rivela che Dio è un padre per l'uomo e che in ogni momento quest'ultimo può accedere al regno, qualunque cosa abbia fatto, purché ritorni a colui che aveva abbandonato, essa rappresenta anche una rivelazione su Gesù Cristo. Il racconto, infatti, prende le mosse dal suo modo di agire; è per giustificare il proprio comportamento nei confronti dei peccatori che Gesù descrive quel Padre che si precipita incontro a quel prodigo, ed è felice di potergli restituire la dignità perduta.

Non dimentichiamo, in fine, che ogni cristiano rischia di essere un giorno o l'altro, il figlio maggiore che non ha intenzione di fare buona accoglienza, come suo padre, al fratello minore. Ramuz immagina la folla degli eletti che, alla fine dei tempi, si accalcano alle porte del paradiso, frementi d'indignazione di fare buona accoglienza come suo padre, al fratello minore: «*Sembra che perdoni anche agli altri*». Ed ecco tutti quei falsi devoti cacciati all'inferno, perché rifiutano di vedere un fratello nel peccatore perdonato. Il racconto evangelico si ferma prima. La sua conclusione dipende da noi: il fratello maggiore, che noi crediamo di essere, saprà passare dal disprezzo all'amore dei peccatori, dall'idea di un Dio ragioniere a quella di un padre che ama perché vuole salvare.

Il figlio prodigo — Essere onnipotente ed accettare che il figlio minore se ne vada da casa, e accoglierlo poi a braccia aperte quando ritorna; lasciare perdere tutto e andare alla ricerca della pecora smarrita; essere padrone di tutto e mettersi a servire i propri servi: modo divino di comportarsi si chiama "*misericordia*". Ad essa la Chiesa deve la propria esistenza: è stata necessaria questa iniziativa di Dio per fondare il popolo che noi siamo, fatto di figli sperduti e di pecore smarrite. E la Chiesa deve a sua volta essere segno di questa generosità, nei rapporti con tutti gli uomini.


