

Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Risen Lord Jesus,

The news today seems to be dominated by death-dealing forces and foreclosed possibilities. This past year has brought us a plague of gun-violence, streams of helpless refugees in different parts of the world, struggles in our own nation around questions of immigration and racism, countless victims of natural disasters, and large numbers of people who are—in the words of Pope Francis—“discarded.” There seems to be scant room for hope and optimism.

Yet, we know by our own experience as believers and our common bonds of faith that this is not the full story of reality. There, indeed, is other news, the good news of our Easter faith. Christ has conquered all death and evil. Christ is risen!

When we profess our faith in the risen Lord, we do not deny the pain and suffering at work in our world. The risen Christ himself bears his wounds of his suffering, but he is risen. He has conquered sin and death, and our victory is certain. We hold a great hope in him who leads forward. But, it does not end there, for as St. Paul tells us, all of that we celebrate in these days has taken place so that we “might live no longer for ourselves but for him who died for our sakes and was raised.”

In the Archdiocese of Chicago, our commitment to Renew My Church means that we take our Easter faith seriously to the point that it becomes the source of new energy for communities and individuals who share our faith with the world and bring it hope the world cannot take away.

May our faith in the Risen Lord be alive in our hearts, and may we share that gift widely and generously with others.



From the Pastor's Desk



This is the Day that the Lord has made: let's rejoice and be glad, Alleluia!

That's how all witnesses have to be. But the apostles, very sensible of them, took it for "delirium" and things of women. Until the apostles John and Peter went to the tomb, they saw and believed, as well as in the event of the disciples of Emmaus. May this Easter 2018 be for you and I a new life experience in which we pass to the other side in an experience: from death to life, from darkness to light, from sadness to joy... Happy Easter to you and your family. Blessings in the risen one!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Paschal Mystery is the key to our Christian faith: the dying and rising of Jesus that is the pattern of our life. In their first steps on the road of faith, the catechumens feel the cross of glory traced over their eyes, on their lips, across their shoulders, on their ears, over their heart, and on their feet. The mystery is that even death gives way to life for those who are held in the embrace of Jesus. Today, many new Christians arise from the waters of the font. Yet the font is not the destination of their journey. The goal is Pentecost, fifty days from now, and a lifetime of praise to the Father, in Christ, in the embrace of the Holy Spirit, for the sake of the world. "Neophyte," our ancient word for newly-baptized people, means "newly-planted" in Greek. If someone in your parish has just been baptized, welcome them today. The smiles on their faces and the light in the eyes is a foretaste of heaven.



PROCLAIM THE RISEN CHRIST

On Easter morning everything—the spring weather, the flowers, birds and butterflies, the people around us in their finery, the beautiful liturgy and music—everything seems to bear witness that Jesus Christ is risen today! Like the eyewitness accounts in today's scriptures, the glorious and joyful life all around us helps us to believe the good news of the Resurrection and sing "Alleluia!"

In the scriptures today we hear from Peter and Paul and John. All three speak with conviction about witnessing the resurrected Christ. John's Gospel account includes Mary of Magdala, who also was privileged to witness the Resurrection and tell others the good news. On this glorious Easter Sunday can we ourselves give eyewitness accounts that Jesus Christ is risen today, alive and active in our lives?



TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Pascua viene de una palabra hebrea *pesah* que quiere decir "lugar de pastos" e indica el final de un periodo de ayuno. La Pascua Judía celebra la libertad del cautiverio de Egipto. El cristianismo, siendo en su origen una secta judía, tomó la fiesta de la Pascua para celebrar la muerte y resurrección de Jesús quien nos da la libertad del cautiverio pecaminoso de nuestras vidas.

Eventualmente el uso de "Pascua" pasó a indicar cualquier evento en la vida de Jesús que añade a la libertad que nos obtuvo en su vida, cruz y resurrección. He aquí porque tradicionalmente se hablaba de la Pascua del Nacimiento, la Pascua Florida o Pascua de Resurrección y la Pascua del Espíritu Santo (Pentecostés) y todavía en grandes fiestas religiosas del año la gente se saluda con "Felices pascuas".

En EE. UU., Argentina y otros países se celebra la Pascua (*Easter* en inglés) con la búsqueda de huevos multicolores y supuestamente traídos por una coneja. *Easter* era una diosa teutónica cuyos símbolos eran el huevo y la coneja, símbolos de vida y fertilidad que pasaron a representar la nueva vida que se nos da al ser liberados del pecado por la Pascua de Jesús.

Una scelta per la vita



Scegliere Cristo significa *operare per la vita*. Ciò che vediamo attorno a noi – odio, morte, violenza, discriminazioni, male, egoismo nelle sue molteplici forme – non è la vera realtà. Se «crediamo» in Cristo risorto, signore della vita, vincitore del male, dell'ingiustizia, della morte, dobbiamo *operare* nel senso della sua risurrezione; far sì che nella comunità degli uomini dei credenti si viva in modo sempre più profondo il significato della risurrezione; si costruisca progressivamente la «vita nuova», il «mondo nuovo» (o la «nuova creazione») che i primi discepoli hanno intravisto nel Risorto. E' compito dei cristiani testimoniare che la vita può essere più ricca, più gioiosa, più piena, se contemplata e vissuta in riferimento al mistero del Cristo pasquale che passa attraverso la morte soltanto per risorgere.

Ogni volta che il male è vinto e guarito, ogni volta che un gesto di amicizia rivela ad un fratello l'amore del Padre, ogni volta che si compie un sacrificio per l'«altro», ogni volta che riusciamo a vivere, o aiutiamo gli altri a vivere una gioia più piena e più vera, realizziamo la Pasqua. Allora la morte è vinta; si afferma quel «mondo nuovo» in cammino verso il giorno nel quale la «gloria della risurrezione» sarà pienamente rivelata e attuata (cf orazione dopo la comunione).

Pasqua del Signore: con Cristo risorgiamo a una «Vita nuova»

L'annuncio pasquale risuona oggi nella Chiesa: Cristo è risorto, egli vive al di là della morte, è il Signore dei vivi e dei morti. Nella «notte più chiara del giorno» la parola onnipotente di Dio che ha creato i cieli e la terra e ha formato l'uomo a sua immagine e somiglianza, chiama a una vita immortale *l'uomo nuovo*, Gesù di Nazaret, figlio di Dio e figlio di Maria. Pasqua è dunque annuncio del fatto della risurrezione, della vittoria sulla morte, della vita che non sarà distrutta. Fu questa la realtà testimoniata dagli apostoli; ma l'annuncio che Cristo è vivo deve risuonare continuamente. La Chiesa, nata dalla Pasqua di Cristo, custodisce questo annuncio e lo trasmette in vari modi ad ogni generazione: nei *sacramenti* lo rende attuale e contemporaneo ad ogni comunità riunita nel nome del Signore; con la propria *vita* di comunione e di servizio si sforza di testimoniano davanti al mondo.




