### From the Pastor's Desk




**We are already in the second half of our Lenten Season!** Little by little, the spirit has been guiding us through this journey of faith and, all of the sudden, we find ourselves almost at the threshold of the Holiest week of the Year. Our penance and self-imposed sacrifices have been the perfect tools to carve in our hearts the image of an authentic follower of Christ. Those extra spiritual exercises and liturgical practices, proper to the season, have allowed us to experience God in innovative ways. Fasting and abstinence have colored this time with that particular tone proper to the penitential seasons of the Church and -hopefully- all of these exercises will allow our restored hearts to contain the Feast of Life when Easter comes.

In a very special way, the Word of God proclaimed to us from the Gospel of John these last Sundays has provided our wondering hearts with a very inspiring message. The third, fourth and this fifth Sunday of lent we have been able to reflect on Jesus as: The Living Water (gospel of the Samaritan Woman), as the Light of the World (gospel of the blind man) and as True Life (gospel of Lazarus). All this is a preparation to the Narrative of the Passion that we are about to hear during the celebration of the Sunday of Passion. By meditating on these important passages of the Gospel, we are called to allow Jesus into our hearts while we ask Him to transform our existences, moving us from the dryness of the desert into the springs of Living Water that flow from his Word, from the darkness of sin into the radian clarity of Grace that flows from faith in Him, and ultimately, from the night of the tomb, into the fulness of Life that comes from His desire to impregnate the whole of humanity with Salvation.

As we prepare ourselves to celebrate the mysteries that gave us life, let us work our best to become committed Christians, willing to share with those around us the joy of the Gospel and the certainty of God's love for all.

**JESUS' MINISTRY SUMMARIZED**

The story of the raising of Lazarus from the dead is the single longest story (apart from the Passion) in the Gospel of John. In it we find a summary of most of Jesus' ministry. We see his very human nature as he is moved by Martha and Mary's sorrows and as he himself weeps at the tomb of Lazarus. He is the wisdom of God's Word made flesh as he explains to his followers that the death of Lazarus will serve as a sign of the glory of God. He crowns the miracles he works in John's Gospel (which began with the most "human" miracle of making new wine at Cana's wedding) by raising Lazarus from the dead—a "preview," if you will, of his own death and resurrection to come. This portrait of Jesus reminds us, as we near the end of our Lenten journey, that he is with us, knows us, understands us in every moment of our lives. He knows the joy of our human feasting, he knows the sorrow of our weeping. As we prepare to walk with him through the days of Holy Week, we are filled with faith that—through Christ—God's glory will be with us in every moment of our lives and—with Christ—in our life everlasting.

**ABSTINENCE AND FASTING**

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old or older on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but are not yet 59. Those who are bound by these regulations may take Only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The Paschal abstinence and fasting are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged on Holy Saturday.

#### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Vicente Ferrer, patrón de los obreros de la construcción, falleció el 5 de abril de 1419. Este santo varón nació en Valencia, España, en 1350, vivió y predicó el Evangelio en una época muy difícil del cristianismo. Además de la peste, guerras y otros problemas sociales, la Iglesia estaba dividida por dos o tres hombres que insistían ser el verdadero Papa.

Vicente, un religioso dominico, dedicó su vida a reconstruir la Iglesia promoviendo la virtud de la caridad interna y externa mediante una predicación que relacionaba la Palabra de Dios con la vida cotidiana. Vicente se valía de la teología, poesía, repetición y otros medios para inculcar la sabiduría bíblica en sus oyentes. De esta manera supo construir la fe tanto en los fieles y en la Iglesia como comunidad.

Los cuadros de este santo español normalmente lo presentan con una llama ardiente en una mano y en la otra, con una Biblia abierta. De esta manera los artistas subrayan el amor ardiente que los cristianos debemos tener por la Palabra de Dios, un amor que Vicente edificaba en el corazón de los fieles.

### Fr. Feccia's Reflection



**Quinta domenica di quaresima, "Anno A"** — Legato alla morte di Gesù, come riferiscono diversi particolari del racconto evangelico, il «*riscveglio*» di Lazzaro, nel testo di Giovanni, è il segno per eccellenza. Con questo miracolo, Gesù penetra nel paese della morte. La malattia e il decesso dell'amico, il dolore dei parenti, l'incredulità dei vicini gli fanno udire il sogghigno dell'ultimo nemico che gli rimane da vincere. Di fronte alla tomba Gesù è turbato, come sarà turbato al Getsemani: sa quello che lo aspetta.

Tuttavia, dal momento che è uscito allo scoperto e ha usato entrare nell'atrio dell'avversario, dal momento che ha affrontato consapevolmente il rischio di perire anch'egli andando in aiuto di Lazzaro, Gesù sta già forgiando gli strumenti della sua vittoria. Non bada alla propria angoscia, si sottrae al fascino del nulla, e non abbandona i suoi amici, dando già, in questo modo, la propria vita per loro. L'odore della morte può farlo vacillare per un istante, ma Gesù sa che non resterà prigioniero della tomba perché sente uscire dal profondo di se stesso la parola potente che libera e rimette in cammino: «*Lazzaro, vieni fuori!*» Questa incursione nel paese della morte ci fa dunque vedere Gesù più vivo che mai. Vivo e capace di dare la vita a coloro che ama. A tutti quelli che hanno paura di rischiare la propria vita e che la custodiscono gelosamente, egli dice: «*Io sono la risurrezione e la vita*» e questo non significa soltanto che è capace di rovesciare le pietre tombali degli altri, e persino la propria. La risurrezione è la sua persona stessa, propagatrice di vita, «*Dio ci ha dato la vita eterna, e questa vita è nel suo Figlio*». (1Gv.5,11). Credere in lui vuol dire bere alla sorgente della vita, mettersi in piedi, liberandosi dalle bende sotto cui si stava irrigiditi per paura di essere vivi, e cominciare a produrre segni di vita intorno a sé.

**Faccia a faccia con la morte.**— Dopo i racconti della samaritana e del cieco-nato, ecco la terza narrazione costruita sul medesimo schema: un dialogo dal duplice significato, in cui sonno e risveglio designano la morte e la risurrezione. Ognuno di questi racconti pone in evidenza il fatto che Gesù nel battesimo si presenta come la sorgente d'acqua viva, la luce, la vita. Accanto a questi significati battesimali, il racconto di Lazzaro sviluppa più chiaramente degli altri, il tema pasquale: La Passione si profila all'orizzonte («*Andiamo a morire con lui!*»); la morte viene incontro a Gesù, nella persona dell'amico, ed egli ne resta turbato, ci sono le lacrime di Marta dinanzi alla tomba e, in fine, il ritorno alla vita. Tutti questi particolari annunciano in modo evidente l'imminenza della morte e della risurrezione di Gesù.



## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Not until the thirteenth century do we find a mention of a locked tabernacle. There's some evidence for eucharistic towers also, but often these were in an obscure corner of the church, or even in the off-limits sacristy. Many of us grew up "making visits" to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, but it's clear this would raise some medieval eyebrows in confusion! To the present day, the Eucharist is always reserved only in a side chapel in many cathedrals. The principal focus in a cathedral is always on the altar, symbol of Christ, and on the cathedra, symbol of the pastoral ministry of the bishop.

In your parish church there is probably a "sanctuary lamp," a permanently lit candle or oil lamp indicating the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Sometimes it's in a red glass, not for any particular reason except that it's easy to find. There is a story of a bishop missioned to Papua New Guinea who was distressed to find no sanctuary lamps burning in his new diocese. The people patiently explained that their churches were woven of grass, and that they decided to place a chief's standard, a trident, in front of the tabernacle. That was a sign in their culture that the "chief" was at home, like raising the flag over Buckingham Palace. The bishop, an Irish import, didn't appreciate the British reference, so he ordered the candles back. The first church to burn to the ground was the cathedral, and after two more, the chief's tridents returned.
