From the Pastor's Desk



Sunday of the Good Shepherd, 55 World Day of Prayers for Vocations with the theme: **Listen, Discern, Live the call of the Lord.** We know that in October the Synod of Bishops will be celebrated, which will be dedicated to young people, in particular to the relationship between **young people, faith and vocation.** On that occasion we will have the opportunity to deepen into how the call to joy that God directs us, is the center of our life and how this is the "project of God for men and women of all time." Also in these restless times in which we live, the Paschal mystery reminds us that God always meets us and seeks us, through the

often dusty roads of our life and, knowing our anxious longing of love and happiness, calls us to joy . In the diversity and uniqueness of each vocation, personal and ecclesial, **we need to listen, discern and live this word that calls us from above** and that, while allowing us to make our talents fruitful, also makes us instruments of salvation in the world and guides us to full happiness. These three aspects - listening, discernment and living - also mark the beginning of the mission of Jesus, who, after the days of prayer and struggle in the desert, goes to his synagogue in Nazareth, and there he listens to the Word discerns the content of the mission entrusted to him by the Father and announces that he has come to fulfill it "today" (Lk 4,16-21). **Listening to the Lord's call** - it must be said - is not as evident as everything we can hear, see or touch in our daily experience. God comes in a silent and discreet way, without imposing on our freedom. Thus it may happen that his voice is silenced by the numerous worries and tensions that fill our mind and our heart. It is necessary then to prepare ourselves to listen deeply to his Word and life, to pay attention to the details of our daily life, to learn to read events with the eyes of faith, and to remain open to the surprises of the Spirit. Jesus was also called and sent; for this he had to silently listen and read the Word in the synagogue and thus, with the light and strength of the Holy Spirit, he was able to fully discover its meaning, referring to his own person and to the history of the people of Israel. **Discerning Jesus teaches us**, reading in the synagogue of Nazareth the passage of the prophet Isaiah, discerns the content of the mission for which he was sent and announces it to those who waited for the Messiah: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me. He has sent me to evangelize the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives, and recovery of sight to the blind; to release the oppressed; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor" (Lk 4,18-19). In the same way, each one of us can discover his own vocation only through spiritual discernment, a "process by which the person comes to realize, in dialogue with the Lord and listening to the voice of the Spirit, the fundamental choices, beginning with that of the state in life».

Living, Jesus announces the newness of the present hour, which will enthuse many and harden the hearts of others: the time has been fulfilled and the Messiah announced by Isaiah is here, anointed to free the prisoners, return sight to the blind and proclaim the merciful love of God to every creature. The Lord keeps calling today to follow him. **We can not wait to be perfect to respond with our generous "here I am", nor to frighten ourselves of our limits and our sins, but to listen to his voice with an open heart, discern our personal mission in the Church and in the world, and live it in the today that God gives us.** May Mary Most Holy, who as a young woman living in obscurity heard, accepted and experienced the Word of God made flesh, protect us and accompany us always on our journey. May this exhortation of POPE FRANCIS help us to live our vocation with joy and respond with generosity in doing his will and realize our own state of life.

Mensaje del Párroco



Domingo del Buen Pastor, 55 Jornada Mundial de Oraciones por las Vocaciones con el tema: Escuchar, Discernir, Vivir la llamada del Señor. Sabemos que en octubre se celebrará el Sinodo de los Obispos, que estará dedicado a los jóvenes, en particular a la relación entre **los jóvenes, la fe y la vocación**. En dicha ocasión tendremos la oportunidad de profundizar sobre cómo la llamada a la alegría que Dios nos dirige, es el centro de nuestra vida y cómo esto es el «proyecto de Dios para los hombres y mujeres de todo tiempo». También en estos tiempos inquietos en que vivimos, el misterio Pascual nos recuerda que Dios siempre nos sale al encuentro y nos busca, por los caminos a veces polvorientos de nuestra vida y, conociendo nuestra ardiente nostalgia de amor y felicidad, nos llama a la alegría. En la diversidad y la especificidad de cada vocación, personal y eclesial, se **necesita escuchar, discernir y vivir esta palabra que nos llama desde lo alto** y que, a la vez que nos permite hacer fructificar nuestros talentos, nos hace también instrumentos de salvación en el mundo y nos orienta a la plena felicidad. Estos tres aspectos —**escuchar, discernimiento y vida**— encuadran también el comienzo de la misión de Jesús, quien, después de los días de oración y de lucha en el desierto, va a su sinagoga de Nazaret, y allí se pone a la escucha de la Palabra, discierne el contenido de la misión que el Padre le ha confiado y anuncia que ha venido a realizarla «hoy» (cf. *Lc 4,16-21*). **Escuchar la llamada del Señor** —cabe decir— no es tan evidente como todo aquello que podemos oír, ver o tocar en nuestra experiencia cotidiana. Dios viene de modo silencioso y discreto, sin imponerse a nuestra libertad. Así puede ocurrir que su voz quede silenciada por las numerosas preocupaciones y tensiones que llenan nuestra mente y nuestro corazón. Es necesario entonces prepararse para escuchar con profundidad su Palabra y la vida, prestar atención a los detalles de nuestra vida diaria, aprender a leer los acontecimientos con los ojos de la fe, y mantenerse abiertos a las sorpresas del Espíritu. También Jesús fue llamado y enviado; para ello tuvo que, en silencio, escuchar y leer la Palabra en la sinagoga y así, con la luz y la fuerza del Espíritu Santo, pudo descubrir plenamente su significado, referido a su propia persona y a la historia del pueblo de Israel. **Discernir nos enseña Jesús**, leyendo en la sinagoga de Nazaret el pasaje del profeta Isaías, discierne el contenido de la misión para la que fue enviado y lo anuncia a los que esperaban al Mesías: «El Espíritu del Señor está sobre mí, porque él me ha ungido. Me ha enviado a evangelizar a los pobres, a proclamar a los cautivos la libertad, y a los ciegos, la vista; a poner en libertad a los oprimidos; a proclamar el año de gracia del Señor» (*Lc 4,18-19*). Del mismo modo, cada uno de nosotros puede descubrir su propia vocación sólo mediante el discernimiento espiritual, un «proceso por el cual la persona llega a realizar, en el diálogo con el Señor y escuchando la voz del Espíritu, las elecciones fundamentales, empezando por la del estado de vida». **Vivir**, Jesús anuncia la novedad del momento presente, que entusiasmará a muchos y endurecerá a otros: el tiempo se ha cumplido y el Mesías anunciado por Isaías es él, ungido para liberar a los prisioneros, devolver la vista a los ciegos y proclamar el amor misericordioso de Dios a toda criatura. El Señor sigue llamando hoy para que le sigan. **No podemos esperar a ser perfectos para responder con nuestro generoso «aquí estoy», ni asustarnos de nuestros límites y de nuestros pecados, sino escuchar su voz con corazón abierto, discernir nuestra misión personal en la Iglesia y en el mundo, y vivirla en el hoy que Dios nos da.** María Santísima, la joven muchacha de periferia que escuchó, acogió y vivió la Palabra de Dios hecha carne, nos proteja y nos acompañe siempre en nuestro camino. Que esta exhortación de PAPA FRANCISCO nos ayude a ti y a mi a vivir con alegría nuestra vocación y responderle con generosidad en hacer su voluntad y realizar nuestro estado de vida. Amen.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Quarta Domenica di Pasqua, Anno "B" — Quando Gesù afferma di essere il vero pastore, l'unico pastore, il suo discorso non ha niente di idillico. Si tratta della rottura definitiva con i capi religiosi di Israele, mercenari, a cui non importa delle pecore. «*Il tuo servo, —ricorda Davide a Saul,— custodiva il gregge di suo padre, e veniva talvolta un leone o un orso a portar via una pecora del gregge. Allora io inseguivo, lo abbattevo e strappavo la preda dalla sua bocca*»(1 Sam. 17, 34-35).

Questo è il modo di agire di Dio e del Cristo, che ha riportato la vittoria pasquale e ha dato la sua vita per coloro che il Padre gli aveva affidato.

Forse a noi non piace molto essere paragonati a un gregge... Tuttavia l'immagine della pecora, sotto certi aspetti, suggerisce bene la nostra condizione: privi di qualsiasi mezzo di difesa contro il lupo rapace, e fra tutti gli esseri viventi senza dubbio il meno dotato di senso dell'orientamento, la pecora si affida di istinto al pastore perché la difenda e la conduca. Quando l'uomo peccatore, convertendosi, ritrova la strada dell'ovile, riscopre anche la vera libertà, nell'esperienza d'amore che viene sotto la guida del pastore vero.

In definitiva, se il vangelo chiede ai cristiani il sacrificio del loro individualismo, in compenso garantisce loro lo sviluppo della loro personalità. La vocazione cristiana è infinitamente varia e diversificata: agli antipodi dell'isolamento orgoglioso di chi pretendesse di vivere il vangelo restando separato dai fratelli in Cristo, ma anche agli antipodi dell'anonimato passivo di chi, perdendosi nella massa, si accontentasse di un atteggiamento di inerte docilità. La vocazione cristiana è il frutto dell'amore personale del Cristo per ciascuno di noi, semplici fedeli o pastori. Poiché tutti quanti non siamo che pecore dell'unico capo: Cristo.

Il Buon Pastore — Ciò che viene messo in luce in questa lettura è lo zelo del pastore, e non la docilità sciocca e incosciente delle pecore. Gesù non ci invita a rinunciare a noi stessi o a praticare una cieca sottomissione. Egli è il buon pastore, in opposizione a tutti coloro che si proclamano guide dei popoli, duci e capi, ma sono semplicemente attori in cerca di gloria. Cristo non è un capo che manipola le folle: propone a ciascuno l'amicizia del Padre. E non è d'accordo con tanti di noi, che pretendono di fare un gregge chiuso e perfetto: lui va a cercare le pecore lontane.


