From the Pastor's Desk


II SUNDAY OF EASTER AND OF THE DIVINE MERCY. The Divine Mercy celebration has been officially declared in the liturgy of the Roman Catholic Church in the year 2000. It is celebrated on the Sunday following the Easter of Resurrection. Divine Mercy is a Christian devotion that focuses on promoting God's mercy and healing and reconciling power, particularly as an act of confidence that God's mercy and His passion is the price He paid for our sins, and that if we trust in Jesus, our sins will be forgiven. The Gospel of this Sunday helps us to understand the meaning of mercy. The evangelist John

takes us to the afternoon of Easter and the evening of eight days later when He presents Himself in the cenacle with his paschal message to enjoy the gift Peace of the Risen One. We observe how the disciples recognize it with difficulty, as we do when we let ourselves be carried away by our thoughts or by our little faith, by our distractions or even by our insensitivity. Jesus gives them the greeting of peace, speaks to them and shows them the wounds on His body. Those wounds open the eyes of the disciples. He has risen and is still wounded. The Risen Jesus carries the wounds forever: he is the merciful one who has the wounds on his body imprinted on Him from the cross, and of all those who are still on the many crosses of this world. The Risen Jesus is someone who continues to be moved by the poor. He is the merciful one, the one who has the heart that lets himself be struck by the wounds and needs of the poor. There is no resurrection without receiving the wounds of humanity on His own body. So the same, it is for the Church, that is a community of disciples with the wounds of the passion of the world. This is how the Lord sends us as a Church to forgive, heal, disarm the hearts of violence. As we said, when Jesus appeared in the cenacle Tomas was not with the other disciples; Jesus returns to the cenacle eight days later; Thomas also was with them, and certainly Thomas was not an evil disciple, on the contrary he was even generous, but he was too sure of himself, sure of his feelings, of his convictions, to the point of saying: "If I do not see in His hands the mark of the nails ... and I do not put my hand in His side, I will not believe "(v. 25). Jesus returns and once again brings His greetings and message of peace; and immediately call Thomas to approach Him: "Put your finger here and see my hands, bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be doubt but a believe" (v. 27). Thomas, in front of Jesus and the signs of the cross, confesses his faith: "My Lord and my God." Jesus answers: "Because you have seen me, you have believed, blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" (v. 29). This news of the Gospel and the beautiful profession of faith of Thomas allow us to enjoy His powerful Mercy and salvation.



Del Escritorio del Párroco

II DOMINGO DE PASCUA Y FIESTA DE LA DIVINA MISERICORDIA. Esta fiesta ha sido declarada oficialmente en la liturgia de la Iglesia católica en el año 2000. Se celebra el domingo siguiente a la Pascua de Resurrección. La **Divina Misericordia** es una devoción cristiana que se enfoca a promover la misericordia de Dios y su poder sanador y reconciliador, particularmente como una acción de confianza en que la misericordia de Dios y su pasión es el precio que el pagó por nuestros pecados, y que si confiamos en Jesús nuestros pecados nos serán perdonados. El Evangelio de este domingo nos ayuda a

entender el sentido de la misericordia. El evangelista Juan nos lleva a la tarde de Pascua y a la tarde de ocho días después cuando se presenta en el cenáculo con su mensaje pascual a gozar la Paz del resucitado. Observamos como los discípulos lo reconocen con dificultad, como nosotros cuando nos dejamos llevar por nuestros pensamientos o por nuestra poca fe, por nuestras distracciones o incluso por nuestra insensibilidad. Jesús les da el saludo de paz, les habla y les muestra las heridas sobre su cuerpo. Aquellas heridas abren los ojos a los discípulos. Ha resucitado y sigue estando herido. Jesús resucitado lleva las heridas para siempre: es el misericordioso que lleva impresas en su cuerpo las heridas de cuando estaba en la cruz, y de todos aquellos que aún hoy están sobre las muchas cruces de este mundo. Jesús resucitado es alguien que sigue conmoviéndose por los pobres. Él es el misericordioso, el que tiene el corazón que se deja golpear por las heridas y necesidades de los pobres. No existe resurrección sin recibir sobre el propio cuerpo las heridas de la humanidad. Así es para la Iglesia: una comunidad de discípulos con las heridas de la pasión. Así nos envía el Señor como Iglesia para perdonar, curar, desarmar los corazones de la violencia. Como decíamos, Jesús cuando apareció en el cenáculo Tomás no estaba con los demás discípulos; Jesús regresa al cenáculo ocho días después; se encuentra también Tomás, que por cierto no era un discípulo malvado, al contrario era incluso generoso, pero estaba demasiado seguro de sí mismo, seguro de sus sensaciones, de sus convicciones, hasta el punto de decir: "Si no veo en sus manos la señal de los clavos... y no meto mi mano en su costado, no creeré" (v. 25). Jesús regresa y una vez más trae su saludo de paz; y llama enseguida a Tomás para que se acerque: "Acerca aquí tu dedo y mira mis manos; trae tu mano y métela en mi costado, y no seas incrédulo sino creyente" (v. 27). Tomás, delante de Jesús y de las señales de la cruz, confiesa su fe: "Señor mío y Dios mío". Le responde Jesús: "Porque me has visto has creído. Dichosos los que no han visto y han creído" (v. 29). Esta bienaventuranza del Evangelio y la Hermosa profesión de fe de Tomás nos permita gozar Su ponderosa Misericordia.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Seconda domenica di Pasqua — «Abbiamo visto il signore!» In assenza di Tommaso, il risorto è apparso ai discepoli, ha mostrato loro i segni della sua passione, ha comunicato loro la pace messianica e, in una Pentecoste anticipata, lo Spirito che, attraverso le loro mani porterà a compimento l'opera della salvezza. Ma Tommaso, un uomo tutto *d'un pezzo*, *che non ha paura di non essere edificante, si impenna: «Se non vedo, non crederò».*

L'apostolo Tommaso è un tipo onesto e franco. Dal vangelo traspare a tratti il suo carattere: non sarà facile portarlo ad accettare il rischio della fede. Lo sentiamo molto vicino a noi, col suo bisogno di cose reali e tangibili, con la sua diffidenza per l'ideologia staccata dal quotidiano. Perché *«ciò che è sorprendente nella fede, è che si possa credere»* (G. Crespy). Il Signore capisce tutto questo, al punto che otto giorni dopo prende in parola Tommaso e va incontro alle sue esigenze: *«Metti la mano nel mio costato, e credi...»*

Quanto a noi, credenti del ventesimo secolo, rimarremo tranquillamente nell'orbita liturgica della pasqua, accontentandoci di ripetere: *«Beati quelli che pur non avendo visto, crederanno?»* L'esperienza di Tommaso deve diventare la nostra, dobbiamo aspirare a vedere la potenza della risurrezione manifestarsi nella nostra vita personale e collettiva, dobbiamo volere che la forza del Signore guarisca le ferite dei nostri fratelli, risvegli gli oppressi, strappi alla morte uomini e donne ancora sprofondate nel peccato.

Dobbiamo dare il nostro contributo. Perché ciò che è sorprendente nella fede, è che si possa credere all'impossibile, e fare di tutto perché si realizzi. Allora, ma allora soltanto Gesù può diventare per ciascuno di noi *«mio Signore e Dio mio»*.

Saper guardare — Giovanni, deportato ad Efeso, scrive ai cristiani perseguitati dall'autorità politica. Un giorno gli è apparso il Cristo sotto le sembianze di figlio dell'uomo, (cioè giudice degli ultimi tempi), di sacerdote vero (l'abito lungo fino ai piedi) e di re (la fascia d'oro). Egli lo vede soprattutto come signore della chiesa (in mezzo a sette candelabri che rappresentano le chiese). È lo stesso Cristo, signore, re, sacerdote, giudice, che noi incontreremo ogni domenica nella lettura del vangelo e nella celebrazione eucaristica.




