From the Pastor's Desk



This Fifth Sunday of Easter, the Word of God emphasizes the need to "remain" in Jesus, a theme especially dear to John. In his first Letter he writes: "He who keeps his commandments abides in God and God in him" and in this parable of the vine and the branches, he makes us see that the Heart of his message is: "to remain" and "to dwell". Isaiah, in the admirable "Song of the Vineyard", describes the disillusionment of God with Israel, his vineyard that he had cared for, planted, dug, defended, but from which he has only obtained bitter fruits. In this story, Jesus is a very unique focus, the vine is no longer Israel but himself: "I am the true vine." Nobody had ever said it before. To fully understand these words, it is necessary to place them in the context of the Last Supper, when Jesus pronounced them: Jesus identifies himself with the vine and adds: "I am the vine; you the branches. "The disciples are united to the Master and form an integral part of the vine: there is no vine without branches and vice versa.

The Gospel continues: "Every branch that bears fruit is pruned so that it will bear more fruit".

The spiritual life is always an itinerary and if you want, a growth, there is no age in life that does not require changes and corrections, pruning as the Gospel says. These cuts, sometimes also very painful, purify our lives and make the sap of the Lord's love run with greater freshness. Jesus repeats six times: "Abide in me." We know, it is the condition to bear fruit, not to get dry, avoid being cut and burned.

This is also the path that Mary, her mother, undertook, which "kept all these things and meditated them in her heart". It is the path chosen by Mary, the sister of Lazarus, who stayed at the feet of Jesus to listen to him. It is the path followed by each disciple and that you and I have to walk in order to enjoy the glory of the Risen Lord.

Mensaje del Párroco



Este Quinto domingo de Pascua, la Palabra de Dios subraya la necesidad de "permanecer" en Jesús, un tema especialmente querido para Juan. En su primera Carta escribe: "Quien guarda sus mandamientos mora en Dios y Dios en él" y en esta parábola de la vid y de los sarmientos, nos hace ver que está en el Corazón de su mensaje: "permanecer" y "morar". Isaías, en el admirable "Canto de la viña", describe la desilusión de Dios con Israel, su viña que había cuidado, plantado, cavado, defendido, pero de la que solo ha obtenido frutos amargos. Sin embargo, en las palabras de Jesús hay un cambio bastante singular. La vid ya no es Israel sino él mismo: "Yo soy la vid verdadera". Nadie lo había dicho nunca antes. Para entender completamente estas palabras, es necesario situarlas en el contexto de la última cena, cuando Jesús las pronunció. Jesús se identifica con la vid y añade: "Yo soy la vid; ustedes los sarmientos". Los discípulos están unidos al Maestro y forman parte integrante de la vid: no hay vid sin sarmientos y viceversa.

El Evangelio continúa: "Todo sarmiento que da fruto, lo limpia, para que dé más fruto" como también lo poda. La vida espiritual es siempre un itinerario y si se quiere, un crecimiento, no hay ninguna edad en la vida que no exija cambios y correcciones, podas como dice el evangelio. Estos cortes, a veces también muy dolorosos, purifican nuestra vida y hacen correr con mayor frescura la savia del amor del Señor. Jesús repite seis veces: "Permaneced en mí". Sabemos, es la condición para dar fruto, para no secarse y evitar de ser cortados y quemados.

Este es también el camino que emprendió María, su madre, la cual "guardaba todas estas cosas y las meditaba en su corazón". Es el camino que escogió María, la hermana de Lázaro, que se quedaba a los pies de Jesús para escucharle. Es el camino seguido por cada discípulo y que tu y Yo tenemos que hacer para gozar la alegría del resucitado.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Quinta domenica di Pasqua — Anno “B”. «*Io sono il buon pastore*», aveva affermato Gesù. All'inizio del secondo discorso dopo la Cena, dichiara: «*Io sono la vera vite*». Pronunciando questa frase insolita, forse ha presente la vigna scolpita nella pietra sul frontale del tempio, simbolo del popolo d'Israele. L'immagine si adatta molto bene al contesto dell'ultima cena, in cui Gesù ha dato ai discepoli il vino della nuova alleanza, promesso a Cana. E in ogni caso rievoca nel cuore degli apostoli tutta la storia dei rapporti tra Dio e il popolo eletto.

Segno di benedizione e simbolo di fecondità, l'immagine della vigna è sempre presente nella vita del popolo giudaico, attaccato alla sua terra. Non ci stupisce quindi che sia stata usata per esprimere le peripezie della storia d'Israele. Dalla vigna lussureggiante che aveva strappato dall'Egitto e trapiantato nella terra di Canaan, Dio poteva legittimamente aspettarsi molti frutti: le aveva dedicato tante cure! E invece ne ricevette soltanto frutti dal sapore aspro. Nei profeti, la vigna indica il più delle volte l'Israele infedele e peccatore, infedele all'alleanza e prossimo a ricevere il castigo per la sua malvagità. Solo in epoca tardiva rinacerà la speranza di una vigna splendida, di un popolo fedele e purificato di cui Jahvè sarà il custode, giorno e notte.

«*Io sono la vera vite e il Padre mio è il vignaiolo*». All'attesa divina tante volte delusa, Gesù finalmente risponde: è lui il vero Israele, e il suo sangue fa crescere sul calvario una vigna nuova. Ormai nessuno può portare frutto davanti a Dio se non vive in Gesù, e Gesù in lui, in una reciprocità d'amore da cui soltanto può scaturire una vite feconda: «*Voi in me... io in voi...*»: queste parole ritornano continuamente nel discorso di Gesù come una meravigliosa promessa, che l'eucarestia comincia già a realizzare.

La vite e i tralci — Al termine della cena pasquale, davanti ad una coppa di vino, si rendeva grazie a Dio per il frutto della vite, che rappresentava il popolo ebraico trapiantato dall'Egitto in una terra d'Israele: poi si pregava per la restaurazione e la crescita di questa «*vigna*». Dalla Pasqua di Gesù nascerà una nuova vigna, quella vera, che darà forza e gioia a tutti gli uomini. Perché possiamo portare buoni frutti, noi che siamo i tralci della vigna del Signore, dobbiamo restare intimamente legati a lui, che è il tronco attraverso il quale giunge a noi la linfa. Se non c'è un collegamento perfetto, non dobbiamo meravigliarci che la nostra uva sia così aspra e secca, incapace di riempire di vino nuovo le cantine del mondo.
