Pastor's Desk

XIII Sunday of Ordinary Time. We begin today the month of July, the month that marks the celebration of the 125 years of the Veneration and the Feast of the Virgin of Mount Carmel. Emanuella De Stefano began this Feast in thanksgiving to God for the miracle received through the intercession of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel whom she had prayed pleading for her husband's healing. Mark presents us a common story in the public life and ministry of Jesus where a multitude gathered around Jesus, seeking healing and consolation. They are two people with different religiosity and experiences that approached Jesus.

One is the leader of the synagogue of Capernaum, who opened his way among the people to present a petition to Jesus: **"My daughter is about to die; come, impose your hands on her, so that she may be saved and live."** He is totally desperate and overwhelmed with the impotence of the people. He knew the only hope lies in the Lord. While Jesus is on his way with Jairo, leader of the synagogue, a woman who has been bleeding for twelve years without doctors being able to do anything, she too is desperate. She thinks that the only one who can help her is Jesus. The woman is shy and is not looking for attention or to bother. However, she has such confidence in the good young prophet that she believes that it will be enough to touch his clothes to heal. She opened her way among the people and touched the clothes of Jesus. She thought about doing everything secretly. By the way, nobody noticed anything. But Jesus did, and he notice an energy that came out of Him and addressed the disciples and asked them who has touched Him. That woman answered the gaze of Jesus and fell at His feet. And Jesus said: "Woman, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your illness». Immediately the flow of blood stopped and the woman was cured.

In these days, who did not live despairing moments in front of the stories and images that came to us from migrant children separated from the parents, from migrants trapped in the seas for days, victims of poverty or others escaping violence and seeking refuge. The clashed with bureaucratic systems awakened in many conscious citizens and Christians actions of solidarity that raised their voices to denounce such aberrant decisions of indifference. Many of us sympathized with the leader of the synagogue or with the hemorrhaisa with a feeling of helplessness and despair for their situations. However, from their outcome there is much we can learn from those two people: Jairo, who removed his leadership pride, the arrogance of power and the security of social dignity, to end up kneeling and not be ashamed to beg for help. His words were not a long speech, but a simple and moving prayer. Jesus did not lose a moment to reach out and help her daughter. Jesus also encouraged him not to lose hope. You wanted your daughter to be healed, said Jesus to the desperate man: "Do not fear; only have faith ». Upon arriving at Jairo's house, Jesus saw the weeping and screaming of the people and told them to calm down because "the girl has not died; she is asleep ». He took her by the hand: "The girl got up at once," wrote the evangelist, "and started walking" and she had come back to life. On the other hand, the faith of that woman - that is, her trust in Him - made Jesus to fulfill the miracle. May these testimonies also encourage you and me to move from despair, sadness, weariness to trust, hope and peace, because Christ is with us and is our hope and strength..

Mensaje del Párroco



Domingo XIII del Tiempo Ordinario. Comenzamos hoy el mes de Julio, mes patrio y que para nosotros marca la **celebración de los 125 años de Veneración y de la Fiesta de la Virgen del Carmen.** Emanuella De Stefano comenzó esta Fiesta en acción de gracias a Dios por el milagro recibido por la intercesión de la Virgen del Carmen en haber escuchado su plegaria y haberle concedido la sanación de su esposo. Marcos nos presenta un relato bien común en la vida pública y ministerio de Jesús en donde una muchedumbre de necesitados se agolpa alrededor de Jesús, **buscando curación y consuelo.** Son dos personas con religiosidad y vivencias diferentes que se encuentran

con Jesús. Uno es un líder de la sinagoga de Cafarnaún, que abriéndose camino entre la gente, se acerca y le implora a Jesús: **«Mi hija está a punto de morir; ven, impón tus manos sobre ella, para que se salve y viva».** Está **totalmente desesperado** y frente a la impotencia de los hombres, la única esperanza está en el Señor.

Mientras va de camino con Jairo líder de la sinagoga, **una mujer que lleva doce años sufriendo hemorragias** sin que los médicos puedan hacer nada, **está desesperada.** Piensa que el único que puede ayudarla es precisamente Jesús. La mujer es tímida y no quiere atención ni molestar. Tiene tanta confianza en aquel joven profeta bueno que cree que **es suficiente tocarle los vestidos para curarse.** Se abre paso entre la gente y llega a tocar los vestidos de Jesús. Pensó en hacerlo todo a escondidas. Por cierto, nadie se dio cuenta de nada. Pero Jesús sí, y advierte la fuerza que sale de él y se dirige a los discípulos y les pregunta **quién me ha tocado.** Aquella **mujer contesta a la mirada de Jesús y se echa a sus pies.** Y Jesús le dice: **«Hija, tu fe te ha salvado. Vete en paz y queda curada de tu enfermedad».** Desde aquel momento se corta el flujo de sangre y la mujer se cura.

En estos días quienes no vivió **sentimientos desesperantes** delante de las historias e imágenes que nos llegaban de niños migrantes separados de los papas, de migrantes atrapados en los mares, víctimas de pobreza o que se escaparon de la violencia buscando refugios, y topándose con paredes burocráticas que despertaron en muchos conscientes ciudadanos y cristianos acciones de solidaridad en levantar sus voces para denunciar tales aberrantes decisiones de indiferencias. Muchos nos sentimos muy próximos al jefe de la sinagoga o a la hemorraisa con un **sentimiento de impotencia y desesperación.** Que nos enseñaron esas dos personas: Jairo que se despoja de su orgullo de jefe, de la arrogancia del poder y de la seguridad de la dignidad social. Se arrodilla y no se avergüenza de suplicar ayuda. Sus **palabras no son un largo discurso sino una oración simple** y al mismo tiempo dramática. Jesús no deja que pase ni un momento y **«se fue con él».** Quizás también Jairo está a punto de resignarse. Pero Jesús le anima a no perder la esperanza. El quería que su hija se curase. Jesús le dice a aquel hombre desesperado: **«No temas; solamente ten fe».** Al llegar a la casa de Jairo, Jesús ve el llanto y los gritos de la gente y les dice que se tranquilicen porque **«la niña no ha muerto; está dormida».** La toma por la mano y la pone en pie: **«La muchacha se levantó al instante -precisa el evangelista- y se puso a andar»:** había vuelto a la vida.

De otro lado, la fe de aquella mujer -es decir su confianza en él- hace que Jesús cumpla el milagro.

Que estos testimonios nos anime también a tú y a mí a pasar de la desesperación, tristeza, cansancio a la confianza, esperanza y paz por que Cristo está con nosotros.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Tredicesima Domenica del T.O. — Anno "B" — Il brano evangelico di oggi ci conduce a riflettere sulla vita e sulla speranza di una vita senza fine. La vita è la realtà in cui siamo immersi, noi e coloro che amiamo, tanto più sorprendente in quanto urta, nella sua fragilità contro la malattia, e alla fine contro il limite ineluttabile della morte. È possibile credere nella vita e sperare, nonostante tutto?

I due racconti ci offrono un modello di fede semplice e fiduciosa, quella di Giairo che vede morire la figlia di dodici anni, e quella della donna disperata che sente la vita sfuggirle a poco a poco nel suo sangue. Queste due storie concatenate insistono infatti sul medesimo punto. Ingenua, quasi superstiziosa la fede dell'emoissa, che tocca furtivamente Gesù nella speranza di essere guarita: il Cristo non la rimprovera, ma l'aiuta a raggiungere la consapevolezza di un atteggiamento personale che salva e dona la pace. Ben più grande, e quasi folle, la fede di Giairo, che non ha che il suo silenzio da opporre al disfattismo della folla. Per la gente che gli sta attorno, è fin troppo chiaro che di fronte alla morte nessuno può fare nulla; per Gesù la morte è soltanto un sonno che conduce, attraverso la fede a un'alba di risurrezione. Nella parole che egli usa, è già presente l'interpretazione cristiana del battesimo come partecipazione alla risurrezione del Cristo. *«Svegliati, o tu che dormi, déstati dai morti e Cristo ti illuminerà»* (Ef. 15, 14)

Come non pensare a ciò che dice Péguy a proposito della speranza? Essa dorme in ciascuno di noi, e bisogna regolarmente svegliarla, farla alzare, metterla in cammino. Una meraviglia possibile soltanto nella fede in colui che può condurre le nostre notti più buie a un'alba di pasqua.

I miracoli di Gesù — Il Cristo, assumendo la nostra condizione umana, incontra delle situazioni disperate, la malattia e la morte. Egli partecipa a tali situazioni; ma prova per esse anche un vivo senso di ribellione. Egli vuole un'umanità dalla quale tutto ciò sia bandito, e, appena se ne presenta l'occasione compie il miracolo per manifestare la sua ribellione al male e la sua fiducia assoluta nel Padre. Il miracolo è come un grido di rivolta contro il male. Ma è anche un annuncio profetico di salvezza e di liberazione. Gesù non si limita a colpire il male dall'esterno; ha scelto di vivere egli stesso la disperata situazione umana, ma possiede la certezza di ricevere nella risurrezione (a cui fa già allusione quella della figlia di Giairo) un'umanità nuova, libera da ogni male.

Il cristiano di fronte alla morte

Per il cristiano è possibile una doppia considerazione nei confronti della morte. La morte è tremenda e terribile, perché è il prezzo del peccato, e tutto il nostro essere «mortale» vi si ribella. Ma la morte è anche la «porta aperta» sui cieli nuovi e sui mondi nuovi che abbatte la fragile parete e ci permette di gettarci nelle braccia del Padre.

Ecco perché accanto ad espressioni di angoscia e di paura, troviamo, nella agiografia cristiana, esempi non solo di calma e di pace di fronte alla morte, ma addirittura di desiderio che le distanze siano accorciate. Ricordiamo solo san Paolo: «Desidero che questo mio corpo sia disciolto e possa incontrarmi con Cristo»; e san Francesco d'Assisi, il cantore di «sorella morte», che dice:

«Laudato si', mi Signore, per sora nostra morte corporale,
da la quale nullu homo vivente pò skappare.
Guai a quelli che morranno ne le peccata mortali;
beati quelli che trovarà ne le tue sanctissime voluntati,
che la morte secunda noi farà male».
