

Registrations for the Catechism Classes

When is the last day to register? This is the question I often hear when someone is interested in registering their children for Religious Education. Registrations started on June 4, 2017: Registration closes when the class rooms are filled; the number is limited.

Two consecutive years are required for one to make the First Communion Sacrament. Also two consecutive years are required for one to make the Sacrament of Confirmation. The registration fee is \$ 150 for one Student, \$ 50 for an additional student of the same family; A family of three or more is a total of \$ 225.

The appropriate age for Communion Registration is 7 years old and going to second grade in school; Registrations for the Sacrament of Confirmation is when the student goes to sixth grade. Please register your students as soon as possible. We still have availability for the two programs: Saturdays and Sundays. Enrollment will be on a first come, first serve basis. Nos estamos preparando a celebrar con fe la Fiesta Patronal de nuestro Santuario Parroquial. Es importante que en la medida de lo posible hagamos de estas festividades, una oportunidad para crecer en Fe y Devoción hacia La Virgen Santísima en su advocación del Monte Carmelo. Nuestro pueblo hispano se caracteriza por su fuerte devoción a la Madre de Dios, a quien amorosamente descubrimos también como Madre Nuestra, es por ello que considero importante abrir el corazón estos días a las bendiciones que Dios quiere derramar sobre nuestras vidas a través de Nuestra Señora del Cielo.

Los devotos de *La Madonna* (Como le llaman a la Virgen los Italianos) se han encargado de heredar de padres a hijos esta hermosa tradición que ahora nos toca vivir a nosotros con todo su esplendor. Desde el viernes 7 de Julio se está llevando a cabo el rezo de la novena con predicación cada tarde a las 7:30pm, el jueves 13 comenzará nuestro carnaval en la calle, con venta de comida, entretenimiento en vivo y juegos para los pequeños de la familia. El Domingo 16 como se ha venido haciendo por más de un siglo, la imagen de nuestra Patrona saldrá a recorrer las calles de Melrose Park, acompañada de miles de peregrinos devotos que hacen de esta procesión una autentica manifestación de su Fe. Les invito a ser parte de nuestras festividades y asistir como familia a los diferentes eventos religiosos y de entretenimiento que estamos planeando.



Inscripciones del Catecismo

¿Cuándo se terminan las inscripciones para el catecismo? Esta es la primera pregunta que escucho cuando alguien quiere inscribir a sus hijos en el Programa de educación Religiosa. Las Inscrpciones empezaron el 4 de Junio, 2017: Las inscripciones se cierran cuando se completan las clases. Para más calidad de enseñanza, tenemos cupo limitado.

Dos años consecutivos de preparacion se necesitan para que alguien haga el sacramento de la primera comunión y dos años consecutivos para que hagan el sacramento de la confirmación. El costo de la inscripcion es de \$ 150 por un estudiante y \$ 50 por un hermano/a. Una familia con tres o más hijos paga solamente un total de \$ 225.

La edad mas temprana para inscribir a sus hijos para hacer el sacramento de la primera comunión es cuando el estudiante tiene 7 años de edad y va a la escuela al segundo grado; Inscrpciones para el sacramento de la cofirmación empiezan cuando los estudiantes van al sexto año de la escuela.

Todavía tenemos disponibilidad para los dos días: sabados y domingos. Pero, inscriba a sus hijos tan pronto le sea posible para que tenga oportunidad de escoger el dia que quiere. Para más información llame a la oficina de la parroquia al 708-344-4140

Fr. Feccia's Reflection



Quattordicesima domenica del T. O.— La predicazione di Gesù ha conosciuto l'insuccesso nelle città della Galilea. Nonostante i miracoli compiuti in esse, Gesù non è stato accolto. I sapienti e gli intelligenti si sono chiusi al Vangelo. Forse Gesù si è allontanato dalle folle per riprendere in mano il gruppetto dei discepoli scoraggiati. In ogni caso, è nella preghiera che scopre ancora una volta il disegno del Padre, si sente invadere dalla gioia di fronte alla sua bontà e ripete, in un vibrante *Magnificat*, la beatitudine dei poveri.

Attingendo ai tesori della Scrittura, col tono di un profeta ispirato Gesù canta un inno di lode al Padre suo. Con lo sguardo rinnovato dalla preghiera, contempla il paradosso di una salvezza nascosta agli scribi e ai farisei, ma rivelata agli umili che lo seguono. Se Gesù ha un ruolo tutto particolare in quella rivelazione, è perché vive, nel profondo del proprio essere, da cui sgorga la lode, un rapporto privilegiato con Dio, è il Figlio eterno del Padre. Soltanto lui può sapere fino a che punto Dio è Padre, e soltanto lui può far entrare i suoi discepoli in questo mistero d'amore. Il riposo che Gesù concede loro dopo l'invio in missione è un segno della pace ancora più profonda che troveranno accogliendo il suo insegnamento: egli è il messia «mite ed umile di cuore» che porta unicamente la parola di Dio al di là di ogni interpretazione umana, e che impone soltanto ciò di cui egli stesso si è fatto carico per tutti gli uomini.

Definita dal concilio di Nicea (325), l'identità della natura del Figlio e del Padre, trova nella preghiera di Gesù un'espressione in qualche modo tangibile, a cui ogni cristiano è chiamato a partecipare. Pregare con Gesù significa lasciar cantare in noi il suo Spirito, aprirsi al Nome divino che ci rende figli pronti a compiere la volontà del Padre, esultare col Figlio per le meraviglie che continuano a realizzarsi per azione della sua grazia.

Il Semiatore della parabola — Secondo le abitudini agricole dell'antico oriente, si seminava prima di arare la terra, salvo ripulire il campo dalle pietre e dai rovi. Gesù semina nei luoghi più impensati. Alcuni ripuliscono il campo, altri mieteranno, ma più tardi. Una cosa è certa. Ciò che sarà raccolto deriverà dalla forza della semente, la cui natura stessa è di moltiplicarsi. Il dinamismo della parola di Dio porta la promessa del regno, così come la semente porta quella della messe. Come i saggi dell'antichità, Gesù pone un enigma: chi fa produrre il cento per uno? chi è colui che ha un principio modesto e un avvenire promettente? chi rende fertile il terreno? Vi è una sola risposta: Gesù stesso che è ad un tempo semiatore e seme.

La legge del regno

In realtà, lo sappiamo, Dio si rivela a tutti, ma i sapienti rendono spesso inefficace e vana la rivelazione di Dio. Gli intelligenti e i sapienti sono, qui, i maestri religiosi del tempo: gli scribi, i farisei, conoscitori della Legge e abili manipolatori delle tradizioni. Possedendo la conoscenza della Legge essi diventano oppressori e caricano le spalle dei poveri e degli ignoranti «di pesi insopportabili, e quei pesi voi non li toccate nemmeno con un dito!».

(Lc 11,46). Gesù, invece, chiama a sé coloro che sono stanchi e oppressi, e il giogo che egli impone è dolce e leggero. Il suo giogo, però, non è leggero perché egli sia meno esigente, quasi che la sua fosse una moralità della permissività e della licenza, ma perché è lui a renderne leggero il peso con la sua solidarietà e concreta partecipazione. Lui è il primo dei poveri, dei semplici, dei miti. Lui si carica per primo la croce sulle spalle: è la sua vicinanza che rende sopportabile e leggera la croce di chi lo segue.

La legge del regno di Dio è la legge *del più piccolo, del più povero*. Dio sceglie gli umili, i semplici, gli ignoranti. E la legge del granello di senapa, degli inizi umili e nascosti... Lo fa notare Paolo ai Corinzi, malati di megalomania, desiderosi di doni e carismi vistosi, grandi estimatori della sapienza del mondo:


«Considerate infatti la vostra chiamata, fratelli: non ci sono tra voi molti sapienti secondo la carne, non molti potenti, non molti nobili. Ma Dio ha scelto ciò che nel mondo è stolto per confondere i sapienti, Dio ha scelto ciò che nel mondo è debole per confondere i forti, Dio ha scelto ciò che nel mondo è ignobile e disprezzato e ciò che è nulla per ridurre a nulla le cose che sono, perché nessun uomo possa gloriarsi davanti a Dio» (1 Cor 1,26-29).

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The premier poet of the English language, Geoffrey Chaucer, introduced one of his most beloved characters, the "Wife of Bath," by this telling remark: "Husbands at church door she had five." Four times widowed, she was setting off on a pilgrimage, notably without number five. The church door is a curious detail, pointing to the fourteenth-century wedding custom of marrying on the porch of the parish church. The goal was to give maximum publicity to the consent of the groom and bride, and so consent was moved from the bride's home to a public venue. The priest would stand in the doorway and begin by sprinkling the couple with holy water. He needed to make sure they weren't too closely related and give them some instruction. He would direct the groom to pay the bride's family a dowry, and then announce the monetary amounts to the interested passersby. Only then would the guests enter the church for the wedding Mass, during which the bride and groom would hold lighted candles. The gradual move from home to church and the shift from the bride's father to the priest's authority helped to protect the freedom of brides who weren't quite as confident as the Wife of Bath.
