It is characterized by an intense thirst for an immediate and direct experience of God. The Carmelite spirituality is centered on prayer, understood as loving friendship with God, and contemplation as the free gift of God. Carmelite spirituality is focused on attention to one's relationship with Jesus, "a life of allegiance to Jesus Christ". One fosters and facilitates relationship with God, through prayer and contemplation, namely meditation on the word of God, liturgy, silence, solitude, asceticism and the daily celebration of the sacred liturgy, the Eucharist. We know that Carmelite spirituality, as any other great spirituality teaches that authentic prayer and contemplation should always be accompanied by and promotes growth in the human and theological virtues with a life of service and charity in the spirit of the gospel commandment of Jesus to love of God and to love your neighbor.

## THE MEANING OF MOUNT CARMEL



Mount Carmel is the biblical site where the prophet Elias battled the 450 priests of Baal in a public spiritual contest which led to their defeat and ruin as Scriptures aptly recorded. (1 Kings 18:19-40). It was also here where Elias sent his servant seven times to the mountaintop to look for rain after years of drought which ended as he proclaimed, "Behold a little cloud arose out of the sea like a man's foot." (1 Kings 18:44). We can find Mount Carmel on the Mediterranean coast of Israel, overlooking the modern-day city of Haifa. It rises 1742 feet above sea level and towers above the Mediterranean coastline and its limestone rocks form a cliff-like landscape. The name "Carmel" means, in Hebrew (**Hakkarmel [with the definite article]**), "the garden" or "the garden-land" because of its renowned lush and verdant beauty during ancient times. (Isaiah 35:2) It is known for its cover of flower blossoms, flowering shrubs, and fragrant herbs. Such was its charm and appeal that it was compared to the beauty of the bride in Solomon's song. (Song of Songs 7:5) Nowadays it comes in various names as Antelope-Nose, Har Karmel, Holy Headland, Jebel Kurmul, Mar Elyas, Mount of User, Rosh-Kedesh.

### **Remember OLMC Church in your will.**

To help us continue and preserve the tradition of devotion to our Blessed Mother, we ask you to remember Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church of Melrose Park, IL (our legal name) in your Will. Remember: in Illinois a Will may be handwritten, but the signing of any Will must be witnessed by two attesting witnesses to be valid. You can always change the contents of a Will, since a Will with a more recent date voids and supersedes a Will written earlier. Please consult with your attorney for legal advice.

Following is an example for making an outright bequest to the Church:

"I give, devise or bequeath to Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish 1101 N. 23rd Ave., Melrose Park Illinois, 60160, the sum of (\$) to be used for the maintenance, repair, and improvement of the Church and its grounds." Or you can direct your bequest to a specific purpose; please discuss your wishes with the Pastor.

If you do decide to remember OLMC Church in your Will, please send us a letter advising us of this fact. Also, please leave instructions in the Will that OLMC Church be contacted at the time that the Will is registered with the courts, so that we may learn of your intentions. Thank you for your generosity and support towards our Parish Community.

May Our Lady of Mount Carmel look after you, and be forever by your side.

## OLMC Archival News

The parish of Our Lady of Mount Carmel is proud to announce of our mission of having created a Parish Archive system in 2012, but it requires updating. Can you help us?

Our Mission in creating a parish archive system is fourfold:

- 1) to locate whatever available documents and memorabilia was left by previous generations, in the hopes of uncovering usable data to build upon or upright treasures from the past
- 2) To evaluate, catalog, and preserve all that is donated by individual parishioners, by the various parish societies and organizations, by the public, and by former parishioners that have moved out of town
- 3) To facilitate and encourage the documentation of significant parish events of the present, for many of the records created and maintained today will become our historical collective memory of tomorrow;
- 4) And to eventually create a permanent historical exhibit for all to enjoy.

Due to the fact there existed no assigned space serving as a depository to encourage the preservation of material documenting the development of our parish, very little remains for us for the early years. Most likely, after the owners of the treasured documents departed, the bulk of the material was discarded by others. Let us act today, and keep this unfortunate scenario from taking place tomorrow.

Your involvement is critical to the new archive in donating material that you own, and in seeking out material from people that you know. If so requested, we can make copies of material that people entrust to us, and then return the originals. Convince others that now, we can assure everyone that what they donate to the parish archive will be safe as it has been in their home, and will remain so for generations to come. This is a time of commitment to do all that we can in Honor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

We need to examine those forgotten boxes residing in closets, basements or attics for any type of memorabilia, correspondence, printed material, newspaper articles, old church bulletins, photos, slides, film, videos, old certificates, flyers of past events, etc. Also, names and dates of early Feast committee members and members of the various Societies, including the *names* of our pastors and clergy, and the names of the nuns and priests who were born in Melrose Park. Information relating to the genealogy of our predecessors who played a particular role in our parish would be invaluable. Do not write on the originals, rather make all notations on a separate piece of paper, or do so lightly in pencil (inks have harmful acids).

Also, we ask that you put down on paper what you yourself remember, and what you have heard from your parents and older relatives, for in doing so you will honor their memory. Recording verbal information from those older than you might open new windows into forgotten areas. Your written contribution need not be in some elegant format, nor does it have to read like a novel; it simply needs to be informative. Your story could relate to something quaint, or something important. It could describe segments of your personal story growing up in Melrose Park, or recall the early years of our parish, and the town.

For those involved in managing and sustaining the archive, the process does not end. You can help them by looking for dormant material, but also by providing information obtained through actual personal research, by interacting with others, and by offering relevant suggestions and information.

The new archive will be managed by our dedicated parishioner, Victor Nicodemo. The realization of the archive is the fulfillment of one of his dreams spanning the course of many years.

## Fr. Feccia's Reflection

**Quindicesima domenica del T.O. — Anno "C"** — Un episodio, tutto sommato, abbastanza banale. Gesù lo racconta per rispondere alla domanda di un dottore della legge: «*Chi è il mio prossimo?*» L'interlocutore di Gesù sa che il cammino verso la vita si svolge nel concreto di un'esistenza animata dall'amore di Dio e del prossimo. Ma per identificare quest'ultimo vuole una regola chiara e sicura. L'aneddoto di Gesù è rivolto a far esplodere la ristrettezza di questa preoccupazione.

Un viaggiatore anonimo, selvaggiamente assalito e rapinato da alcuni banditi, viene abbandonato come morto sul bordo della strada. Uno dopo l'altro, passano due rappresentanti qualificati della religione giudaica. Si ponevano il problema teorico di chi fosse il loro prossimo? Fatto sta che nessuno dei due assiste il ferito. Chi si ferma è un uomo che apparentemente non si preoccupa molto di morale e di religione: un samaritano. L'incontro col malcapitato non rappresenta per lui una questione di casistica, ma una realtà che gli colpisce il cuore. Ascoltando soltanto la propria compassione, tratta la vittima come vorrebbe essere trattato al suo posto. Il dottore della legge riconosce che il samaritano è stato «*il prossimo a colui che è incappato nei briganti.*»

Definizione sorprendente di prossimo! Per comprenderla bisogna rifarsi a ciò che è stato detto poco prima: «*Amerai il prossimo tuo come te stesso.*» Non ai tratta più di definire il prossimo a partire da se stessi, come se si fosse il centro di tutto: si tratta piuttosto di collocare se stessi a partire dall'altro. Questo è il capovolgimento operato dal vangelo, la «*grande inversione di marcia*» (M. Pomilio) che sola può dare inizio al cammino dell'uomo verso Dio. Quando il Cristo è venuto sulla terra, si è identificato con l'umanità ferita: come un buon samaritano, ne ha avuto compassione. «*Va' e fa anche tu fa lo stesso,*» diventando il prossimo di chiunque ha bisogno di te.

**Il mio prossimo**— Chi è il prossimo? In un certo senso siamo noi stessi. Il prossimo è colui che si avvicina a qualcuno, ai più lontani, ai più bisognosi di aiuto. L'umanità è ai margini della strada, oppressa e disprezzata, malgrado tutte le organizzazioni di beneficenza e di assistenza, malgrado le religioni e le buone intenzioni. Ma il Cristo passa e, per esserne accanto, si fa degno di disprezzo come un samaritano, il rivale della religione ufficiale, l'escluso della società. D'ora in poi l'uomo non vivrà più solo di organizzazioni o di devozioni, potrà appoggiarsi su di un amore forte; potrà rialzarsi e rialzare gli altri accompagnandoli anche nella vergogna. L'amore vince tutti gli ostacoli e non distingue tra amici e nemici.
