FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This Sunday, we will be receiving Sr. Socorro of the Carmelite Sisters of St. Teresa who, with her experiences, will motivate us to live the missionary mandate of Jesus: "**go to the whole world and proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom.**" I trust that it will be a successful experience for Sister, to be in our midst, thanks to the warm welcome, prayers and generous support we offer to her missions.

On this Sunday we begin a cycle of 5 Sundays reflecting on the beautiful sixth chapter of the Gospel of Saint John: "**Jesus, Bread of Life**". The scene begins with Jesus going up the mountain, surrounded by the disciples, sitting down, as the teachers used to do, and teaching those around him. "**When Jesus lifted his eyes**" he saw "**a lot of people were coming to him**". Jesus, who felt for them, responded by taking care of them. This makes us see that Jesus not only fed people with the Good News of God, but also worried about the hunger of his children. The question arises: "**How to feed a large crowd in the middle of the desert?**" The disciples find no solution. Philip mentioned that he did not think it possible to buy bread because they did not have money. Andrew explored for what could be shared and he discovered that one boy had five loaves of bread and a couple of fish. But, what is that for so many? For Jesus this is enough. This is Jesus! Jesus, who completely trusts in the Father, knows perfectly well that "**everything is possible for God**". Then he orders the disciples to have the people sit on the grass. The gifts of that young man, without name or face, will make possible what seems impossible. Your willingness to share what you have is the way to feed those people. Jesus will do the rest. Taking the loaves of the young man in his hands, Jesus gave thanks to God and began to "**distribute them**". The scene is fascinating. A crowd, sitting on the green grass of the field, sharing a free meal. It is not a rich banquet. There is no wine or meat. It is the simple food of the people who live by the lake. A fraternal meal served by Jesus to all thanks to the generous gesture of a young man. As it often happens, the disciples wanted to ignore those needy people and say three words to Jesus that show their **lack of solidarity and individualism**: "**Send them away**", so that they go back to their villages, and "**buy something to eat**". The hunger of the people is not their problem. Let each one provide for hisJesus responded with surprising words: "**Give yourselves something to eat**." Do not "**send away**" anyone in these conditions. **The solution is not in money but in solidarity**. With money only those who have it eat. For all to eat, it is necessary to share what we have. With those few poor loaves he satisfied the hunger of five thousand people (who were sitting on the grass). If we all put "**the little we have**" of love, compassion, material goods, availability and solidarity, we know hunger will be defeated and both the one of the heart and of the body. Let our prayer be: "**Give us, Oh Lord our daily bread today.**

DECIMOSÉPTIMO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

**Andrés le dijo a Jesús:
"Aquí hay un muchacho que trae
cinco panes de cebada y dos pescados.
Pero, ¿qué es eso para tanta gente?"**

Juan 6:8-9

DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO

Este domingo, como anunciado, tendremos la visita de la Hna. Socorro de las Carmelitas de Sta. Teresa que con sus experiencias nos motivará a retomar el mandato misionero de Jesús: “**Vayan por todo el mundo y proclamen la Buena Nueva del Reino**”. Confío que será una exitosa experiencia para la Hermana por nuestra calurosa bienvenida, oraciones y generoso apoyo por sus misiones.

En este domingo comenzamos un **ciclo de 5 domingos reflexionando en el hermoso sexto capítulo del evangelio de san Juan: “Jesús Pan de Vida”**. La escena comienza con Jesús que sube al monte, rodeado por los discípulos, se sienta, como acostumbraban a hacer los maestros y enseña a los que están a su alrededor. “Al levantar Jesús los ojos” vio “que venía hacia él mucha gente”. Eso nos hacer ver que Jesús no solo alimentaba a la gente con la Buena Noticia de Dios, sino que le preocupaba también el hambre de sus hijos.

Surge la pregunta: “**¿Cómo alimentar en medio del campo a una muchedumbre?**” Los discípulos no encuentran ninguna solución. Felipe dice que no se puede pensar en comprar pan, pues no tienen dinero. Andrés piensa que se podría compartir lo que haya, pero solo **un muchacho tiene cinco panes y un par de peces**. ¿Qué es eso para tantos? **Para Jesús es suficiente**. Así es Jesús. Jesús, que confía totalmente en el Padre, sabe perfectamente que “**para Dios todo es posible**”. Entonces ordena que hagan sentar a la gente sobre la hierba. Los dones de ese joven, sin nombre ni rostro, va hacer posible lo que parece imposible. Su disponibilidad para compartir todo lo que tiene es el camino para alimentar a aquellas gentes. Jesús hará lo demás. Toma en sus manos los panes del joven, da gracias a Dios y comienza a “repartirlos” entre todos.

La escena es fascinante. Una muchedumbre, sentada sobre la hierba verde del campo, **compartiendo una comida gratuita**. No es un banquete de ricos. No hay vino ni carne. Es la comida sencilla de la gente que vive junto al lago. Una comida fraterna servida por Jesús a todos, gracias al gesto generoso de un joven. Como suele suceder los discípulos querían desentenderse de aquella gente necesitada y le dicen a Jesús dos palabras que muestran su **falta de solidaridad y su individualismo**: “**Despídelos**”, que se vayan a las aldeas, y “**que se compren algo de comer**”. El hambre de la gente no es problema suyo. **Que cada uno se procure su sustento**. Jesús les responde con unas palabras sorprendentes: “**Denle ustedes de comer**”. No hay que “**despedir**” a nadie en esas condiciones.

La solución no está en el dinero sino en la solidaridad. **Con dinero sólo comen los que lo tienen. Para que todos coman es necesario compartir lo que hay**. Con aquellos pocos panes pobres sació el hambre de cinco mil personas (que estaban sentadas en la hierba). Si todos nosotros pusiéramos “**lo poco que tenemos**” de amor, compasión, bienes materiales, disponibilidad, solidaridad y tiempo podríamos derrotar el hambre; tanto la del corazón como la del cuerpo. **Sea nuestra oración: “Danos a todos hoy nuestro pan de cada día”**.

Fr. Feccia's Message

Diciassettesima Domenica del T.O. — Anno “B”.

Una grande folla si accalca attorno a Gesù, la gente accorre da tutte le parti, non tanto per lui, quanto per i miracoli che egli compie guarendo i malati. È l'irresistibile attrattiva che il meraviglioso esercita sul cuore umano. Tuttavia Gesù non rifiuta questo approccio iniziale, per quanto ambiguo possa essere. Con la domanda posta a Filippo, cerca di saggiare la perspicacia della sua fede, e non rinuncia ad affinarla. Ma quando la gente vuole approfittare dei suoi miracoli per impadronirsi di lui, fugge. Ogni volta che una istituzione o un uomo pretende di manipolare Gesù e di servirsene per i propri fini, egli diventa inafferrabile. Due persone intervengono nei preparativi del pranzo. Andrea segnale la presenza di un ragazzo, e quest'ultimo mette in comune quel poco che ha. L'avvenimento è straordinario, ma rispetta l'ordine delle cose: la moltiplicazione dei pani non si produce a partire da niente, ma dalla prima, modesta condivisione di ciò che un bambino aveva nella sua bisaccia. Chi vuole essere una benedizione per gli altri, deve portare a Gesù ciò che possiede. Il Maestro non ci chiede ciò che non abbiamo, ma ci fa vedere che ciascuno offre quello che ha, può compiersi il miracolo delle condivisioni, che basta a saziare tutti.

Per quanto sovrabbondante, non per questo il dono di Dio, è meno prezioso: nulla deve essere sprecato. Non solo del pane eucaristico, ma anche del dono che noi rappresentiamo gli uni per gli altri: i figli per i genitori, il fratello per il fratello, lo sposo per la sposa, l'amico per l'amico. Nulla deve andare perduto del dono di Dio. Tutto deve essere raccolto perché, attraverso la condivisione, continui a moltiplicarsi.

Il Segno del pana — Gesù spezza il pane per nutrire della gente affamata. Questa prodigalità è in se stessa un segno, colui che sazia oggi le folle, può e vuole appagare anche tutta questa fame che è ancora nel cuore dell'uomo. 


