

Last Thursday I had the joy of celebrating 21 years of ordination to the priesthood. Time flies... I cannot believe over two decades have passed by since the day the bishop laid His hands on me, conferring in my life the incredible Grace of Christ's priesthood. That was a beautiful summer morning in my home town, despite the rainy season, we enjoyed the sunshine the entire day. No doubt God was good to me, and the many who joined the celebration that memorable day. I wish to continue leading this Faith community on the ways of the Gospel, hopefully God's Grace will assist us all in our struggle to become a Christ-like community, one where the Kingdom of heaven conquers our worldly manners while celebrating the Beauty of having been chosen by God in Christ Jesus our Savior.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Roman Canon, called Eucharistic Prayer I, is probably seldom heard in your parish. Some priests will choose it for at least one of the Masses of Christmas, or the Easter Vigil. Such sparing use of this prayer seems strange, especially since it was the only Eucharistic Prayer in the Latin Rite for many centuries, from as long ago as 500 right up to 1970.

In 1965, the vernacular language was approved for the canon of the Mass. Almost immediately, some experimental texts began to surface in the Netherlands, and priests began to use new Dutch texts without permission. By 1966, Pope Paul VI had set up a committee to consider whether or not it was time to approve such experimentation and extend it to non-Dutch churches. No sooner had the committee been formed than other individuals copied the Dutch by just plunging on ahead. The Dutch bishops had approved the use of the new prayers nationwide in 1968, and Flemish bishops in Belgium quickly agreed. By then, German translations of the Dutch prayers were in wide use, and before long nearly one hundred Eucharistic Prayers, all unapproved, were in circulation in France. The Vatican heard the widespread desire for more variety in Eucharistic Prayer forms, and, with the pope's approval, the process of creating new official prayers began.

NOTHING TO FEAR

A rabbi was asked why God sends trials and troubles into human lives. "Because God gets lonely for his people" was the reply. There is some resonance with this wisdom in today's Gospel, as Jesus makes his disciples get into a boat without him and goes off alone while they venture into stormy waters. Of course, neither Jews nor Christians believe that the Almighty plays this sort of whimsical game with them, but there is some truth in the statement that we don't turn to God for saving help until we're in a bind. Peter's role today, as it is throughout the New Testament, is to be a sign or to represent each member of the church and the whole church. Our story is the tale told about Peter's faith today. What can bolster our faith is that even when Christ calls us to face bravely the tempests of life, if we are walking through them with our eyes fixed on him in faith, we have nothing to fear. Even when we falter or sink, simply crying "Lord, save me!" is enough to help us know the steady grasp of God's hand. Then, sheltered inside the walls of faith, the storms we endure lose their power over us.



NADA QUE TEMER


A un rabino le preguntaron por qué Dios envía pruebas y tribulaciones a los humanos. "Porque Dios siente la ausencia de su pueblo", fue la respuesta. Hay ecos de esta sabiduría en el Evangelio de hoy, cuando Jesús hace que sus discípulos se suban a la barca sin él y se va por su cuenta mientras ellos se aventuran en aguas turbulentas. Por cierto, ni judíos ni cristianos creen que el Todopoderoso hace este tipo de jugadas antojadizas con ellos, pero tiene algo de verdad la afirmación de que no acudimos a Dios pidiendo que nos salve sino cuando estamos en un apuro. Hoy el papel de Pedro, como aparece en todo el Nuevo Testamento, es ser un signo o representación de cada miembro de la Iglesia y de toda la Iglesia. Nuestra historia es el relato que se narra hoy sobre la fe de Pedro. Lo que puede aumentar nuestra fe es que aunque Cristo nos llama a encarar con valentía las tormentas de la vida, si las atravesamos con los ojos de la fe fijos en él, nada hemos de temer. Aunque demos un traspie o nos hundamos, basta gritar "¡Señor, sálvame!" para conocer la firmeza con la que Dios nos toma de la mano. Entonces, protegidos dentro de los muros de la fe, las tormentas que nos azoten no nos vencerán.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Frecuentemente, los santos y santas son personas molestas que desafían tanto a los fieles como a los infieles. Tal es el caso del agustino Ezequiel Moreno Díaz (1848-1906), obispo de Pasto, Colombia.

Nació en La Rioja, España, en el seno de una familia pobre. En 1865 ingresó en la orden de los agustinos y fue enviado como misionero a Filipinas. Luego se ofreció como misionero en Colombia donde buscó renovar la orden de los agustinos. En 1895 el Papa León XIII lo nombró obispo de Parma, lugar en el que le esperaba un martirio moral de calumnias, desprecios y humillaciones por parte de las autoridades civiles. Sus mensajes y desafíos pastorales llevaron a los fieles a un mayor fervor apostólico a tal grado, que incomodó al gobierno.


En 1898 buscó renunciar a su puesto como obispo para no continuar como causa de polémicas y problemas para la Iglesia. El Papa no permitió su renuncia, más bien lo animó a seguir promoviendo el celo apostólico por el bien del pueblo. La polémica nunca debe desanimar a los fieles en Cristo cuando se trata de mejorar la vida moral de la sociedad en la que se encuentran.



«Tu sei veramente il Figlio di Dio!».

Già gli ebrei nel vecchio testamento imploravano così il Signore: «Risveglia la tua potenza e vieni in nostro soccorso». Ci piace pensare e credere all'onnipotenza di Dio soprattutto se la immaginiamo a nostro uso e consumo. Ricorre frequentemente per i religiosi di ogni tempo la tentazione che induce a pensare che dalla fede e dalla fedeltà debba scaturire quasi come dovuta una adeguata ricompensa. Che Dio ce lo debba... Oppure, ancor peggio, che la nostra fede debba essere continuamente alimentata da prodigi. Ecco la voce stridula di Pietro: «Signore, se sei tu, comanda che io venga da te sulle acque». Gesù acconsente, ma poi dimostra a Pietro e a tutti noi che la fede non serve tanto per camminare sulle acque, ma piuttosto per stare con i piedi per terra e saperci muovere speditamente verso la meta finale della nostra esistenza. Sono le prove della vita, per Pietro la violenza del vento, a saggiare l'autenticità e la fermezza della nostra fede. Non possiamo esaurire la pratica religiosa facendo i cristiani della domenica. La fede deve diventare lampada ai nostri passi luce sul nostro cammino. Cala altrimenti il buio e con il buio anche il più leggero fruscio ci sembra tempestoso e genera in noi la paura. L'intervento di Gesù chiamato dalle fede e invocato dall'imminenza del pericolo, il «Signore, salvami!» di Pietro, ci fa scoprire l'atteggiamento premuroso e provvisto nei nostri confronti, anche quando la fede vacilla. «Subito Gesù stese la mano, lo afferrò e gli disse: «Uomo di poca fede, perché hai dubitato?». Quella mano tesa, quel dolce rimprovero generano la fede negli astanti più che il camminare di Gesù sulle acque. «Quelli che erano sulla barca gli si prostrarono davanti, esclamando: «Tu sei veramente il Figlio di Dio!».

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Dio è con noi: è vicino e assiste la sua Chiesa

Dio viene incontro all'uomo specialmente nei momenti di necessità, quando questi lo invoca con fede. Il Dio dei profeti e di Gesù è colui che prende le difese dei poveri e dei deboli, e che delude le speranze di coloro che vogliono disporre della sua potenza. Egli non è nei fenomeni naturali grandiosi e violenti: vento, terremoto, fuoco; ma nel soffio leggero della brezza, quasi a significare la spiritualità e l'intimità delle manifestazioni di Dio all'uomo.

La comunità cristiana vive un'esistenza travagliata dalle ostilità delle forze avverse, che si manifestano nelle persecuzioni e nelle difficoltà esterne ed interne. Con le sue sole forze essa non giungerebbe al termine del suo cammino. Ma Gesù risorto è presente in mezzo ai suoi: anche se invisibile, egli li assiste.

La Chiesa rivive, così, l'esperienza del pellegrinaggio dell'Esodo. La fede sua, come quella di Pietro, è messa a dura prova, ma la mano di Gesù che salva dal baratro non cessa mai di stendersi. Gesù offre dunque alla sua Chiesa la vittoria sulle forze del male e la sicurezza nelle prove, ma richiede come condizione essenziale una fiducia senza tentennamenti.

Solo la fede è vittoriosa, la fede del cristiano che marcia incontro al Signore risorto, nel mezzo della tempesta. Una fede che qualche volta, come quella di Pietro, spinge ad andar lontano, a lasciare le tranquille sicurezze della terraferma per andare al largo.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Before long, as we've seen, the four newly constructed Eucharistic Prayers became two. The old Roman Canon faded away into relative disuse after 1600 unbroken years, sometimes heard only at Christmas Midnight Mass or the Easter Vigil. The new Eucharistic Prayer IV, at least in its English form, grates a bit on most hearers, and besides is meant only for Ordinary Time. The reconstruction of the ancient prayer of Hippolytus, Eucharistic Prayer II, is the most familiar, but its brevity sometimes creates an imbalance with the Liturgy of the Word. No wonder that as soon as the creative juices began to flow at the Vatican, people worldwide were trying their hands at new prayers.

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In 1967, even before the final shape of the new Mass was announced, bishops were asking to adapt that celebration for the needs of children. They wanted to clarify what ought to happen when large numbers of children are at Mass: what could be adapted, omitted, or shortened. Experimentation had already begun.

Separate Liturgies of the Word for children were by this time commonplace in Holland and elsewhere in Europe. Catechists were saying that many of our liturgical forms were too complex for the children in their charge, and priests were making adaptations on their own. Clearly, the Vatican had to take this seriously.

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
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
