From the Pastor's Desk

Sunday XXV O.T. This weekend, we continue our spiritual journey with Jesus who begins his journey from Galilee to Jerusalem and firmly marks his messianic reality of fidelity to the Father. This journey that the Lord carries out with the disciples is the symbol of the journey of life, the journey of spiritual growth and also of the journey that in each liturgical year we are called to travel with the Lord, Sunday after Sunday. Along the way, Jesus speaks with the disciples, but this time he does not show himself as the teacher, but rather as the friend who opens his heart to his closest friends. And he says to them: "The Son of man will be delivered into the hands of men and they will kill him ...". This is the second time Jesus speaks to them of what awaits him. We remember what we heard last Sunday, how Peter had tried to dissuade Jesus from his journey of suffering and is severely reprimanded.

However, Jesus feels the need to open up again. Obviously he is oppressed by great anxiety. It will be the same one that he will feel in the garden of Gethsemane and that will make him sweat blood. However, once again, none of the disciples understands the heart and thoughts of Jesus. Arriving in Capernaum, Jesus asks them: "What did you discuss along the way"? The disciples remain silent. They are ashamed. Mark tells us that, along the way, they had discussed who was the most important. Certainly, it is shameful to see Jesus, who walks towards "the cross", and those who accompany him closely are cut up in stupid ambitions. Once at home, Jesus teaches them. I guess, they need it. These are his first words: "Whoever wants to be the first to be the last of all and the servant of all." In the group that follows Jesus, he who wants to excel and be more than the others, has to put himself in the last place, behind everyone else; so he can see what they need and how he can be a servant of all. True greatness consists in serving. Jesus does not oppose the disciples seeking a primacy, but reverses the sense of that primacy: "the first is the one who serves, not the one who commands". Look at the example he offers us. He sits down and calls his disciples.

Then he brings a child close and puts him in the middle of everyone so that they fix their attention on him. At the center of our Christian communities should always be that child, symbol of the weak and helpless, those in need of welcome, support and defense. Then Jesus embraces the child. Meanwhile he tells them: "He who welcomes a child like this in my name welcomes me, and he who welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me". The teaching of Jesus is clear: the way to welcome God is to welcome his Son Jesus present in the little ones, the helpless, the migrants, the poor and the sick. Following the example of St. Padre Pio, whom we celebrate the Feast today, may you and I become servants of the needy as he did. **Saint Padre Pio pray for us!**

Brief history of San Fr. Pio.



Francesco Forgione, known as Padre Pio, was born in 1887 in Pietrelcina (Benevento) from Orazio and Maria Giuseppa De Nunzio. He was baptized the day after his birth. Already from his childhood he caressed the dream of consecrating his life to the Lord. He was admitted as a novice in the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin in Morcone (Benevento). On 10 August 1910 he was ordained priest in the Cathedral of Benevento. Thus began his priestly life, but due to a rather fragile health, he traveled to various convents before arriving at San Giovanni Rotondo on July 28, 1916, where he lived until the

day of his death on September 23, 1968. At the age of five he received frequent visits of Jesus and Mary, he also saw the angels, but because he thought everyone had these faculties he did not mention it to anyone. In 1911 he reported to his confessor and provincial superior the appearance of red marks and severe pain in his hands and feet. On 5 August 1918 transverberation (spiritual perforation of the heart with bleeding) was manifested and then on September 20, 1918, he received the stigmata (the bleeding wounds of Christ) both at the hands and at the feet and chest before the Crucifix of the old church choir. Shortly before his death, the wounds healed and miraculously disappeared. Padre Pio founded Prayer Groups to heal and give comfort to people and founded a hospital "Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza. On 20 March 1983 the diocesan process of his canonization begins. In 1990, after having collected the testimonies in 104 volumes, the case passes to Rome at the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. Following the favorable opinion expressed on 13 June 1997 by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, Padre Pio was beatified on 2 May 1999 by John Paul II and on 16 June 2002 he was canonized by Pope John Paul II himself. We venerate him with faith in our Church today and pray that he intercedes for us and helps us become saints as he is a saint. **Saint Padre Pio prays for us.**

Del Escritorio del Párroco

Domingo XXV T.O. En este fin de semana continuando nuestro camino espiritual con Jesús que empieza su camino de Galilea a Jerusalén y marca con firmeza su realidad mesiánica de fidelidad al Padre. Este viaje que el Señor lleva a cabo junto a los discípulos es el símbolo del camino de la vida, del itinerario del crecimiento espiritual y también del camino que en cada año litúrgico estamos llamados a recorrer con el Señor, domingo tras domingo. Por el camino, Jesús habla con los discípulos. Pero esta vez no se muestra como el maestro, sino más bien como el amigo que abre su corazón a sus amigos más íntimos. Y les dice: "El Hijo del hombre será entregado en manos de los hombres y los matarán...". Esta es la segunda vez que Jesús les habla de lo que le espera. Recordamos lo que escuchábamos el domingo pasado, como Pedro había intentado disuadir a Jesús de su camino de sufrimiento y es duramente reprendido. Sin embargo, Jesús siente la necesidad de sincerarse de nuevo. Evidentemente le opriime una gran angustia. Es la misma que sentirá en el huerto de Getsemaní y que le hará sudar sangre. No obstante, una vez más, ninguno de los discípulos comprende el corazón y los pensamientos de Jesús. Al llegar en Cafarnaúm, Jesús les pregunta: ¿"De qué discutían por el camino"? Los discípulos se callan. Están avergonzados.

Marcos nos dice que, por el camino, habían discutido sobre quién era el más importante. Ciertamente, es vergonzoso ver a Jesús, que camina hacia "la cruz", y los que los acompañan de cerca se pierdan en estúpidas ambiciones. Una vez en casa, Jesús se dispone a darles una enseñanza. La necesitan. Estas son sus primeras palabras: "Quien quiera ser el primero que sea el último de todos y el servidor de todos". En el grupo que sigue a Jesús, el que quiera sobresalir y ser más que los demás, ha de ponerse al ultimo lugar, detrás de todos; así podrá ver qué es lo que necesitan y podrá ser servidor de todos. La verdadera grandeza consiste en servir. Jesús no se opone a que los discípulos busquen una primacía, pero invierte el sentido de dicha primacía: el primero es el que sirve, no el que manda.

Miren el ejemplo que les ofrece. Se sienta y llama a sus discípulos. Luego acerca un niño y lo pone en medio de todos para que fijen su atención en él. En el centro de nuestras comunidades cristianas tendría siempre que estar ese niño, símbolo de las personas débiles y desvalidas, los necesitados de acogida, apoyo y defensa. Luego Jesús abraza al niño. Mientras tanto les dice: "El que acoge a un niño como éste en mi nombre a mí me acoge, y el que me acoge a mí acoge al que me ha enviado". La enseñanza de Jesús es clara: el camino para acoger a Dios es acoger a su Hijo Jesús presente en los pequeños, los indefensos, los migrantes, los pobres y los enfermos. A ejemplo de San Padre Pio que celebramos la Fiesta el día de hoy, podamos tu y Yo hacernos siervos de los necesitados como él lo hizo. **San Padre Pio ruega por nosotros!**

Breve historia de San Padre Pio.



Francesco Forgione, conocido como Padre Pío, nació en 1887 en Pietrelcina (Benevento) de Orazio y Maria Giuseppa De Nunzio. Fue bautizado el día después de su nacimiento. Ya desde su infancia acarició el sueño de consagrar su vida al Señor. Fue admitido como novicio en la Orden de los Frailes Menores Capuchinos en Morcone (Benevento). El 10 de agosto de 1910 fue ordenado sacerdote en la catedral de Benevento. Así comenzó su vida sacerdotal, pero debido

a una salud bastante frágil, viajó a varios conventos antes de llegar a San Giovanni Rotondo el 28 de julio de 1916, donde vivió hasta el día de su muerte el 23 de septiembre de 1968. A la edad de cinco recibió visitas frecuentes de Jesús y María, también vio a los ángeles, pero porque pensaba que todos tenían estas facultades, no se lo mencionó a nadie. En 1911, informó a su confesor y superior provincial de la aparición de marcas rojas y dolor severo en manos y pies. El 5 de agosto de 1918 se manifestó la transverberación (perforación espiritual del corazón con sangrado) y luego, el 20 de septiembre de 1918, recibió los estigmas (las heridas sangrantes de Cristo) tanto en las manos como en los pies y el cofre antes del Crucifijo del viejo coro de la iglesia. Poco antes de su muerte, las heridas sanaron y milagrosamente desaparecieron. El Padre Pio fundó grupos de oración para sanar y dar consuelo a las personas y fundó un hospital "Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza". El 20 de marzo de 1983 comienza el proceso diocesano de su canonización. En 1990, después de haber recogido los testimonios en 104 volúmenes, el caso pasa a Roma en la Congregación para las Causas de los Santos. Tras la opinión favorable expresada el 13 de junio de 1997 por la Congregación para las Causas de los Santos, el padre Pío fue beatificado el 2 de mayo de 1999 por Juan Pablo II y el 16 de junio de 2002 fue canonizado por el propio Papa Juan Pablo II. Lo veneramos con fe en nuestra Iglesia hoy y oramos para que interceda por nosotros y nos ayude a ser santos como él es un santo. San Padre Pio ora por nosotros.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Venticinquesima Domenica del T.O. — Ciclo “B”. Il figlio dell'uomo è in cammino sulla strada che lo porta alla passione. I suoi discepoli non lo comprendono, sono perplessi e smarriti. Nonostante tutto Gesù si sforza di condurli con sé, iniziandoli a poco a poco al ruolo di messaggeri di un messia sofferente. Ma come è difficile per loro accettare un simile insegnamento! Mentre avanzano verso Gerusalemme, quanto bisogno hanno di uscire dalla loro cecità.

«*Di che cosa stavate discutendo lungo la via?*» Gesù si rende subito conto di come sono lontani dall'avere compreso: stanno discutendo di chi sarà il più grande nel regno temporale che essi attendono. Abituati alla loro condizione, sognano un avanzamento che dia loro prestigio e potere, che li innalzi ai posti di comando. Volete essere i primi? dice Gesù. Siate gli ultimi! Volete essere grandi? Fatevi piccoli! Volete dominare? Fatevi servi! È un paradosso che non si fonde su considerazioni teoriche, ma sull'esempio concreto che il Servo sofferente continua ad offrire ai suoi.

E noi, di che cosa discutiamo lungo la strada della nostra vita? forse ci troveremmo molto imbarazzati, se Gesù interrogasse anche noi in questo modo. Parlando di ciò che più gli sta a cuore, ciascuno rivela il proprio intimo. qualcuno sogna di avere potere e autorità? Si chieda piuttosto in che modo potrà meglio servire gli altri, in che modo potrà andare incontro a chi ha bisogno di aiuto. Come i genitori, che dovrebbero quasi istintivamente mettere tutta la loro autorità ai servizio dei figli, subordinandola al loro vero bene, così dovrebbe fare ogni cristiano desideroso di conformarsi al modo di essere di Gesù, accogliendo come suoi inviati i piccoli e i deboli. Non c'è modo migliore per raggiungerlo e per unirsi a lui in questo viaggio attraverso la Galilea che egli compie in segreto con i suoi.

Lotta per i primi posti — Gesù tenta di spiegare le sue parabole con più precisione ai discepoli, in casa, lontano dalla folla. Nonostante ciò, essi non capiscono, non si vogliono arrendere all'idea di una conclusione così tragica — che invece sarà un intermezzo — delle loro speranze. Hanno ancora molta vanità e molti interessi, cercano nel regno di Gesù una posizione di prestigio, discutono fra di loro per avere i dicasteri più importanti. Non hanno ancora imparato la semplicità e la povertà del vangelo, raffigurate in quel bambino che Gesù così amorevolmente tiene in braccio, simbolo di se stesso.

Breve storia di San P. Pio.



Francesco Forgione, conosciuto come Padre Pio è nato nel 1887 a Pietrelcina (Benevento) da Orazio e Maria Giuseppa De Nunzio. Fu battezzato il giorno dopo la sua nascita. Già dalla sua infanzia ha accarezzato il sogno di consacrare la sua vita al Signore. È stato ammesso come novizio nell'Ordine dei Frati Minori Cappuccini a Morcone (Benevento). Il 10 agosto 1910 è stato ordinato sacerdote nel Duomo di Benevento. Inizia così la sua vita sacerdotale,

ma a causa di una salute piuttosto fragile, ha peregrinato in vari conventi prima di arrivare a San Giovanni Rotondo il 28 luglio 1916, dove ha vissuto fino al giorno della morte avvenuta il 23 settembre 1968. All'età di cinque ha ricevuto visite frequenti di Gesù e Maria, vedeva anche gli angeli, ma poiché pensava che tutti avessero queste facoltà non ne faceva parola con nessuno. Nel 1911 riferisce al suo confessore e padre Provinciale l'apparizione di segni rossi e un forte dolore alle mani e ai piedi. Il 5 agosto 1918 si manifesta la trasverberazione (perforazione spirituale del cuore con sanguinamento) e poi il 20 settembre 1918 ricevette le stimmate (le piaghe di Cristo sanguinanti) sia alle mani, sia ai piedi e al torace davanti al Crocifisso del coro della vecchia chiesina. Poco prima della sua morte, le ferite, rimaste aperte e sanguinanti, guariscono e miracolosamente scompaiono. Padre Pio ha fondato *Gruppi di Preghiera* per guarire e dare conforto all'anima e un ospedale cui scelse il nome di *Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza*. Il 20 marzo 1983 inizia il processo diocesano della sua canonizzazione. Nel 1990, dopo aver raccolto le testimonianze in 104 volumi, la causa passa a Roma presso *Congregazione per le Cause dei Santi*. A seguito del parere favorevole espresso il 13 giugno 1997 dalla Congregazione per le Cause dei Santi, Padre Pio è stato beatificato il 2 maggio 1999 da Giovanni Paolo II e il 16 giugno 2002 è stato canonizzato dallo stesso papa Giovanni Paolo II. Lo veneriamo con fede nella nostra Chiesa perché interceda per noi e ci aiuti a diventare santi come lui è santo. **San Padre Pio prega per noi.**


