From the Pastor's Desk

XXVII SUNDAY O.T. & FIESTA OF OUR LADY OF THE HOLY ROSARY. The Gospel this Sunday makes us reflect on the reality of marriage. The occasion is presented with the question that some Pharisees ask Jesus about divorce: "**Can the husband repudiate his wife?**" Jesus answers from a different perspective, going back to the origins of creation, that is, to the roots of man and woman's life. The first pages of Genesis (1:27 & 2:24) show that God united to the creation of the person the command, for the spouses, to form an indissoluble unity. The spouses, says Jesus, form "**one flesh**". Once again, the vocation of men and women to a mutual communion is underlined. The sentiment of Adam's joy to see Eve manifests their vocation to love, and not to the man's dominion over the woman or vice versa. Man and woman are created to love each other. This thought comes from the same creation. True communion is inscribed in the profound motives of human history. The breaking of the marriage bond is always a deep wound to creation itself. In fact, the negative effects, as always, fall on the weakest, on the most defenseless, on children, on the elderly, on the sick. Of course, we know that there are extremely complex situations in the life of a couple that must be considered with understanding and mercy. However, we must safeguard the wealth of a decision that unites for life and the two people who become "**one flesh**". The Church, understood as the family of God, becomes the image of the family that is born of the sacrament of marriage. The Church herself is conceived as a mother who begets, who watches over and who accompanies her children. The Christian community has the maternal duty to support with prayer and concrete gestures of true compassion, love, understanding the married people and if necessary those small and weak ones who also suffer from the lack of family affection. In the Church, more than anywhere else, the words of Genesis must be fulfilled: "**It is not good for man to be alone**". Therefore, yes the Church, which is the family of God, is presented as the family of all; through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin of Mount Carmel and the Holy Rosary, may our parish be the house of communion, where no one is left alone and we are all brothers and sisters. Amen.

Del Escritorio del Párroco

XXVII DOMINGO T.O. y FIESTA DE LA VIRGEN DEL SANTO ROSARIO. El Evangelio de este domingo nos hace reflexionar sobre la realidad matrimonio. La ocasión se presenta con la pregunta que algunos fariseos hacen a Jesús sobre el divorcio: “**¿Puede el marido repudiar a la mujer?**”

Jesús contesta desde un plano distinto, remontándose a los orígenes de la creación, es decir a las raíces de la vida del hombre y de la mujer. Las primeras páginas del Génesis (1:27 y 2:24) hace ver que Dios unió a la creación del ser humano el mandamiento, para los cónyuges, de formar una unidad indisoluble. Los cónyuges -dice Jesús- forman “**una sola carne**”. Se subraya una vez más la vocación del hombre y de la mujer a la comunión recíproca. El sentimiento de alegría de Adán al ver a Eva manifiesta esta vocación al amor, y no al dominio del hombre sobre la mujer o viceversa. **El hombre y la mujer fueron creados para amarse.** Este anuncio nace de la misma creación. La comunión está inscrita en los motivos profundos de la historia humana. La ruptura del vínculo matrimonial es siempre una herida a la creación. De hecho los efectos negativos, como pasa siempre, recaen sobre los más débiles, sobre los más indefensos, sobre los niños, sobre los ancianos, sobre los enfermos. Hay situaciones extremadamente complejas en la vida de pareja que hay que considerar con comprensión y misericordia. No obstante, hay que salvaguardar la riqueza de una decisión que une para toda la vida y que hace de dos personas “**una sola carne**”. La Iglesia, entendida como familia de Dios, se convierte en imagen misma de la familia que nace del sacramento del matrimonio. La misma Iglesia se concibe como una madre que engendra, que custodia y que acompaña. La comunidad cristiana tiene el deber materno de sostener con la oración y de las maneras concretas en una verdadera compasión, amor, comprensión a las personas casadas y apoyar si es necesario aquellos pequeños y débiles que sufren más la falta de cariño familiar. En la Iglesia, más que en ninguna otra parte, deben verse realizadas las palabras del Génesis: “**No es bueno que el hombre esté solo**”. Por lo tanto, sí la Iglesia, que es la familia de Dios, se presenta como la familia de todos; por intercesión de la **Virgen del Carmen y del Santo Rosario** sea nuestra parroquia la casa de la comunión, donde nadie queda solo y todos somos hermanos y hermanas. Amen

Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Ventisettesima Domenica del T.O. — Ciclo "B" — Il fallimento di molti matrimoni provoca ferite profonde e dolorose. Il brano evangelico di oggi ci dice innanzitutto che questa non è secondo la volontà di Dio sulla coppia così come viene espresso dall'autore della Genesi. Ma il racconto di Marco riferisce anche la reazione molto vivace di

Gesù nei confronti di certi uomini della Legge che considerano il matrimonio da un punto di vista puramente giuridico. No! dice Gesù, il matrimonio non è ciò a cui voi lo riducete: un contratto concluso da una volontà umana, che la medesima volontà umana può sciogliere. Il matrimonio è una realtà molto più profonda, in cui Dio stesso è coinvolto. È qualcosa di ben più grande di un semplice soggetto di discussione giuridica. È opera di Dio, e come tale dovete rispettarlo.

La domanda precisa che è stata posta a Gesù riguarda il ripudio, una forma di divorzio del tutto particolare, in cui il marito rinunciando ai propri diritti sulla moglie, le permette di sposare un altro uomo. Nell'ambito del diritto giudaico del tempo, non c'è uguaglianza fra marito e moglie: la donna è proprietà dell'uomo alla stregua degli altri suoi beni, e non ha alcun diritto alla fedeltà dello sposo, che giuridicamente non può essere accusato di adulterio nei confronti di lei. Qui invece Gesù dichiara esplicitamente adulterio il marito che ripudia la moglie, proprio nel momento in cui quest'ultima cessa di appartenergli giuridicamente! Non si poteva buttare all'aria con maggior violenza l'ideologia tradizionale, né tratteggiare con maggior chiarezza il matrimonio come l'unione indissolubile di due persone che si impegnano in esso in condizioni di parità assoluta.

È evidente che questa affermazione di principio non risolve tutti i problemi concreti —e giuridici— che nascono dal fallimento di una coppia. Ma pone quest'ultima di fronte all'amore indefettibile di Dio di cui le persone che si amano devono essere segno in questo mondo: un amore più grande dei nostri peccati.

Ritorno alle origini. Secondo la legge ebraica il divorzio è un privilegio maschile. Secondo Gesù, la responsabilità della decisione è anche della donna; facendo capire questo, egli lancia un messaggio universale, che va oltre tutta la saggezza ebraiche o pagane, del tempo: la donna ha gli stessi diritti e gli stessi doveri dell'uomo. I farisei si limitano al codice di Mosé; Gesù risale al progetto di Dio: non è la legge che è santa, ma l'amore. I discepoli legati anch'essi alla tradizione farisaica, non capiscono; Gesù allora risponde con un gesto significativo: chi non sogna l'innocenza e la santità delle origini, che si rivelano nell'amore e nell'infanzia, non potrà accogliere il regno di Dio che viene.





