

From the Pastor's Desk



The Kingdom of Heaven... likened to a wedding feast! Not far away from the end of the Liturgical year which comes to a close with the Feast of Christ the King, the Sunday liturgies undertake the task of presenting to God's people the Kingdom of heaven, as a way of preparing our hearts to fully understand the Kingship of Our Lord Jesus Christ when the last Sunday of the Liturgical year comes our way. Instructing the hearts of believers in the mysteries of the Kingdom is not an easy task, for it implies awakening our human consciousness to a new level. Being able to fully comprehend the logic of God is not always easy because most of the times it disregards and contradicts our human logic to fully embrace God's ways we must empty our hearts from any type of expectations that might challenge God's manners.

Today's Gospel speaks to us of a wedding feast where many important people were requested to assist, disregarding the invitation, those convoked to be present, decided to ignore the call and moved away with their own plans. Because the Banquet was prepared, the King sent his servants into the streets to invite whomever they found available, they all enjoyed the wedding... except the one who was not properly dressed for the occasion! The surprise of God (His particular preference for the rejected ones, those no one cares about) implies not only the abundant mercy of the Divine, but it also entails the readiness of those God wishes to save and bring into the full possession of the Kingdom. As believers we must be prepared and vigilant because the experience of Salvation is a two way street; God will not make it all in His own, for in his infinite wisdom He provided us with free will and as a consequence we can either embrace His gift or disregard it for the Lord will not force anyone into His ways. He will always respect our decisions and even when they take us away from His mercy and love, he will honor our steps.

As we continue to journey towards the festivity of Jesus Christ as King of the Universe, let us hope that our hearts may be ready to welcome the newness of the Kingdom in our lives, and may we continue to pray: Thy Kingdom come!



Mensaje del Párroco



Amigo, ¿Cómo has entrado aquí sin traje de fiesta? La manera tan sorpresiva como el Rey de la parábola se acerca a este invitado y lo echa fuera de la sala del banquete nos deja sin duda con muchas preguntas en el corazón. Jesús inicia diciendo que muchos habían sido convocados al banquete, pero cada uno de ellos decidió ignorar la invitación y se marchó agobiado por sus propias preocupaciones, en respuesta a esta reacción, el Rey decide invitar a todos los que se encuentren en las veras del camino y con ellos llena la sala de fiestas... sin embargo, uno de entre ellos no estaba propiamente vestido y después de ser avergonzado públicamente, es arrojado fuera de la fiesta. Una enseñanza difícil y desconcertante, sorpresiva y con impacto, muy a la manera de Dios.

La realidad del Reino de los Cielos, continua a ser una de las propuestas más desconcertantes para el corazón creyente, en ella somos llamados a gozar de la plenitud de Dios y de todas las gracias con las que Dios quiera bendecirnos. La Salvación como Don gratuito de Dios se derrama con abundancia en esta propuesta que si bien es difícil de comprender en su totalidad, también es cierto podemos comenzar a gozar desde nuestro aquí y nuestro ahora. Sin embargo, un requisito se vuelve indispensable en toda esta dinámica: somos llamados a colaborar efectivamente en la propuesta de Dios; el Señor no puede conducirnos a experimentar sus gracias si nosotros no estamos preparados y no lo deseamos. Debido a que desde los inicios de la humanidad Dios nos ha dotado de libertad en nuestra voluntad, a menos que nosotros así lo deseemos y que nuestros esfuerzos coincidan con la propuesta del Señor, todos los intentos serán en vano. Estar preparados, desearlo y esforzarnos por concretizar nuestros anhelos son requisitos indiscutibles en la consecución de nuestra Salvación.

Esperemos que al continuar avanzando hacia el término del año litúrgico que siempre culmina con la celebración de Nuestro Señor Cristo Rey del Universo, nuestras liturgias dominicales sigan animando nuestros esfuerzos y continúen instruyéndonos en los misterios del Reino que el Dios Nuestro Señor desea establecer entre nosotros.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection



Trentottesima Domenica del T.O. Anno "A" — Chi non si affretta ad accettare un invito a nozze? È davvero inverosimile il racconto riferito da Matteo! Un re che deve mandare a chiamare per due vuole gli invitati e che reagiscono con l'indifferenza o con un atteggiamento duramente ostile; il passaggio improvviso dalla festa alla repressione degli invitati ribelli, la cui città viene data alle fiamme; i nuovi commensali raccolti a caso lungo le strade per riempire la sala; e quel povero

diavolo buttato fuori nelle tenebre, anche se non ha avuto né il tempo né i mezzi per procurarsi l'abito nuziale. Tutto questo non è naturale. E infatti la parabola si riferisce a una realtà soprannaturale, quella della salvezza: la festa di gioia e di comunione a cui sono invitati, dapprima Israele, e poi la chiesa e tutta l'umanità. La parabola descrive a grandi linee lo sviluppo di questa storia; il rifiuto e l'ostilità d'Israele di fronte all'invito dei profeti e dei giusti, così come all'annuncio del vangelo da parte di Gesù e dei suoi apostoli; la distruzione di Gerusalemme (70 d.C.), che assunse valore simbolico agli occhi della prima comunità cristiana; l'espansione missionaria della chiesa tra i pagani.

Tuttavia, «molti sono chiamati, ma pochi gli eletti». Si può essere cristiani di nome senza impegnarsi in un cammino di conversione, ci si può credere invitati al banchetto del regno e rimanere indifferenti di fronte ai piatti vuoti di tanti bambini sulla terra. È la via battesimale che conta, non il certificato di battesimo; è l'abito di cui parla l'apostolo quando dice che dobbiamo «rivestire l'uomo nuovo, creato secondo Dio nella giustizia e nella santità vera» (Ef. 4,24). Senza questa novità di vita, il biglietto d'invito conterà ben poco agli occhi del re!

Un invito da accogliere — Dio ha in mente una festa universale per l'umanità. Gli inviti sono stati trasmessi dai profeti, poi dagli apostoli; ma si sa che magra accoglienza riceveranno. Il credente, salvo rare eccezioni, preferisce la sua tranquillità, la carriera che a poco a poco si è costruita, i suoi interessi alla gioia universale. A forza di attaccarsi alle piccole cose, i giudei e i farisei hanno dimenticato l'essenziale e hanno perduto tutto, compreso il simbolo della loro gioia, Gerusalemme, rasa al suolo da Tito. Anche l'ostinazione della chiesa su alcune questioni di dettaglio, in passato, ha avuto penose conseguenze per la sua unità. Bisogna che il popolo di Dio ritrovi la sua vocazione universale e si lanci sulle vie del mondo, chiamando ogni uomo di buona volontà.

Assemblea di tutte le nazioni: la Chiesa

Il disegno di riunione di tutte le nazioni si realizza in Cristo. Dio vuole operare questo raduno attraverso il popolo eletto, già precedentemente destinato nei piani di Dio ad essere lo strumento privilegiato del raduno universale. Ma il rifiuto di Israele lo priva del suo privilegio, e la riunione universale si farà attorno al Cristo crocifisso che risuscita dai morti.

Alcuni elementi caratterizzano questo raduno e lo distinguono da quello descritto dall'Antico Testamento. E Dio, attraverso Gesù, che «convoca» questo raduno, ma il suo disegno di riunificazione non potrà riuscire senza *l'attiva partecipazione e collaborazione dell'uomo*. Il disegno di Dio *costituisce un compito per l'uomo*. Il regno di Dio non discende dal cielo come un lampo. Se è vero che Cristo costituisce la pietra d'angolo della costruzione, gli uomini non possono esimersi dal collaborare all'innalzamento dell'edificio.

Più *nessun privilegio* è riconosciuto ad Israele in questa riunione universale. E' l'atto di nascita di un nuovo universalismo, del resto già previsto nell'Antico Testamento. Il convito sul monte il Signore lo preparerà per *tutti i popoli* (prima lettura).



Il miracolo delle lingue e la presenza a Gerusalemme di genti venute da ogni parte del mondo esprimono bene fin dal suo nascere la natura e la missione della Chiesa, il cui mistero può esprimersi proprio in termini di convocazione e di raduno.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In 1971, the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship completed a survey of the presidents of the national liturgical commissions around the world. How were children doing in the liturgical reform? Probably to their surprise, the cardinals learned of special weekday Masses for children designed to teach them how to participate on Sunday, Masses with separate components for children. The decision was made quickly to develop adaptations for Masses where children were a majority of the assembly. Changes would include a simpler structure, understandable texts, a simplified Lectionary, more active participation, and most surprisingly, new Eucharistic Prayers. By 1973 the work was done, and with very specific advice from Pope Paul VI, including the need for two new Eucharistic Prayers, the *Directory for Masses with Children* was published on December 20, a timely Christmas gift for the children of the world.

The prayers are the first to be written fresh in a modern language—not Latin, but French and German—then translated into English, Italian, and Spanish. With a sense of caution, these new prayers were approved for three years, until 1977, but it soon became apparent that they had truly been embraced.
