MISSIONARIES OF ST. CHARLES - Scalabrinians

The Congregation of the Missionaries of St. Charles – Scalabrinians – is an International community of religious serving migrants and refugees of different cultures, religions and ethnicities in 32 countries and on five continents.

The Congregation was founded on November 28, 1887, by Blessed John Baptist Scalabrini (1839-1905), bishop of Piacenza (Italy). It was the period of massive emigration from Italy and Europe toward the Americas. It was a far-reaching phenomenon whose importance Bishop Scalabrini was able to grasp in both its social and religious dimensions.

Our missionary focus has been to be migrants with the migrants and to be in mission with people on the move along with a special priority for the poorest migrants. What has become very obvious is that as we have taken more missionary risks and made an effort to clarify our Charism we have been blessed with more and more vocations.

No matter how inadequate Moses felt to the task God had given him, he persevered—even though he needed help from the people around him. The Israelites especially depended on God for freedom. The woman in the Gospel, desperate and destitute, had no one to depend on, but still she would not give up. She could not afford to bribe the unscrupulous judge, but she pestered him into weariness until finally he met her demands.

We sometimes need to turn to others to help us through difficult times; but if we always turn to God, we won't be disappointed, for our help, the psalm assures us, is from the Lord.



Sin importar lo incapaz que se sentía para las tareas que Dios le había encomendado, Moisés perseveró –aunque con ayuda de las personas que lo rodeaban. Los israelitas dependieron especialmente de Dios para su libertad. La mujer del Evangelio, desesperada y desvalida, no tenía de quién depender, pero aun así no se rindió. No tenía con qué sobornar al inescrupuloso juez, pero lo molestó hasta el cansancio, por lo que finalmente éste cedió a sus demandas.

A veces necesitamos acudir a otros para que nos ayuden en momentos difíciles; pero si siempre acudimos a Dios, no quedaremos defraudados; el Salmo asegura que nuestra ayuda proviene del Señor.

**TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE**

Muy popular entre los latinos es la monjita francesa santa Teresita, con sus rosas y crucifijo en mano. No cabe duda que ella fue una gran mujer, pero no podemos olvidar otra monja carmelita, la Teresota, o sea santa Teresa de Jesús (de Ávila).

En 1970, esta hispana fue la primera mujer nombrada Doctora de la Iglesia gracias a sus profundos escritos. Teresa vivió en el siglo XVI, una época de mucha reforma. Después de haber pasado varios años como religiosa, se dio cuenta que su vida personal necesitaba conversión. Así fue que se puso a orar y practicar el recogimiento del alma. Ella confiesa que pasarían casi 15 años antes de que estas prácticas dieran fruto. Ella no se dejó vencer durante esos quince años y siguió insistiendo en la oración hasta que Dios le concedió visiones y visitas celestiales. Su mística llena de gozos celestiales nunca la separó de la tierra. Ella no se escondía en la oración, más bien salía de la oración para luchar en el mundo. Ella inspiró la reforma carmelitana y sigue inspirándonos hoy con sus escritos.

Ma il Figlio dell'uomo, quando verrà, troverà la fede sulla terra?

Nella parabola del vangelo di oggi, Gesù lega in modo ormai indissolubile due temi importanti per la vita di noi cristiani. La necessità dell'insistenza della preghiera sembra essere il tema principale della parabola del Giudice disonesto. Come egli esaudirà le richieste continue della vedova così il Padre è pronto a soddisfare le nostre preghiere. Potremo sviluppare questo tema, con gli elementi importanti che fornisce Gesù nella parabola stessa. Eppure mancheremo di qualcosa di veramente importante. La scelta dei personaggi, per esempio è significativa. La vedova è una persona che non aveva molte tutele che oggi chiameremo sociali. La stessa legge mosaica aveva cercato di dare delle protezioni per le vedove ed altre categorie deboli come gli orfani e gli stranieri. Negli Atti degli Apostoli, l'istituzione dei diaconi è sorta proprio in relazione alla mancanza verso delle vedove. Il giudice, evidentemente non vuole dare ascolto alla voce di questa donna per non sentirsi troppo compromesso: preferisce esercitare il suo ufficio spianando le difficoltà. Non possiamo però leggere questa parabola senza interpellarcisi con la domanda stessa che pone Gesù sulla fede. Leggiamo in essa una provocazione forte che interessa tutti. Già da come è formulata la stessa domanda capiamo che tutti noi siamo gli interlocutori di Gesù. I Vangeli sono Parola di Dio e per questo eterni nel loro messaggio e destinati a tutti e in tutti i tempi. Nella parabola odierna Gesù esplicitamente si rivolge a tutti. La questione della fede diventa allora basilare e da qui possiamo allora leggere tutta la parabola. La preghiera, anche continuativa, sarà inefficace se non parte da un cuore informato dall'amore della fede. La fede è dono di Dio da coltivare, anche nella preghiera. E allora capiamo bene la domanda di Gesù. Essa contiene anche una promessa: il suo ritorno nella gloria. Preghiamo allora che, in questa attesa fiduciosa, la nostra fede possa incrementarsi in una vita di amore e di sollecitudine verso il prossimo, soprattutto il più debole. Di esempi ne abbiamo quanto vogliamo.

Pregare è fare silenzio per ascoltare Dio

La preghiera cristiana prima che parola implorante è silenzio profondo per ascoltare e accogliere in sé la parola di Dio. Le persone entrano in comunione ascoltandosi. Noi entriamo in comunione con Dio e ci disponiamo a fare la sua volontà ascoltandolo. Come la fede, anche la preghiera nasce dall'ascolto: è una risposta vitale, ma anche verbale. Questa assumerà varie forme: un'azione di grazie, una contemplazione piena di ammirazione, una professione di fede, una dichiarazione di impegno, una domanda.

Anche la preghiera di domanda è una risposta all'invito di Cristo a «pregare sempre, senza stancarsi» (*Lc 18,1*). Ma qual è il significato della preghiera di domanda? Non è certamente quello di pretendere che egli faccia al nostro posto quello che dovremmo fare noi.

La preghiera di domanda è riconoscere il limite della condizione umana, è costatare che la liberazione totale e la piena realizzazione di sé non dipendono unicamente dall'uomo. L'uomo non può salvare se stesso. Manifestare a Dio «tutti» i propri bisogni e desideri è sottoporli alla sua luce, è vedere se sono legittimi o no. L'uomo è veramente ciò che domanda; le richieste gli vengono spontanee: dirle a Dio è vagliarle e purificarle.


