From the Pastor's Desk

XXIX SUNDAY OF O.T. and MISSION SUNDAY. "Go to the whole world and preach the Gospel to all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit". This missionary mandate of Jesus urges us in the context of the Gospel of this Sunday to **"be a servant of servants"** with our Christian life. Jesus is still on his way to Jerusalem and, for the third time, Jesus reveals to his disciples what awaits him at the end of the road, the passion. Two of the disciples who are seeking to sit at the right and left hand of Jesus, it seems are not affected by Jesus' revelation or did not listen to Jesus' words are the sons of Zebedee, James and John who come up to Jesus and ask him for a places at his Kingdom. Before the pretension of the two disciples, Jesus says: **"You do not know what you are asking for. Can you drink the cup that I am going to drink, or be baptized with the baptism with which I am going to be baptized?"** Jesus responds to their demand with two biblical symbols: the chalice and the baptism. Both symbols are interpreted by Jesus in relation to his death. **The chalice is the sign of God's wrath. The Baptism reveals the bloody sacrifice of his passion.** With these two images, Jesus stresses that his journey is not a race to power, rather a journey and mission of service. For this reason, Jesus gathers the Twelve around him and states: **"You know that those who are held as rulers of the nations dominate them as absolute authority and oppressive power".** In your community, however, there will be no place for the power that oppresses, but only the authority of service. Jesus does not want chiefs sitting on his right or left, but servants who like Him, give their lives for others. Jesus leaves things clear. His Church is not built from the imposition of those above, but from the service of the humble ones. There is no hierarchy in it in terms of honor or domination or methods and strategies of power. Remember, the Church of Jesus is raised through the spirit of service. Rightly so, Jesus presents himself as a model to imitate: **"The Son of man has not come to be served, but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many".** May this **Mission Sunday** encourage us to renew our **baptismal missionary spirit of dedication, fidelity and service** to the proclamation of the Good News that Jesus testifies to all of us and that many missionaries have left us with the examples of their lives. Amen.

Del Escritorio del Párroco

XXIX DOMINGO DE T.O. y DOMINGO DE LAS MISIONES. “Vayan por todo el mundo y prediquen el evangelio a todas las naciones bautizándolas en el nombre del Padre y del Espíritu Santo”. Este mandato misionero de Jesús nos urge en el contexto del evangelio de este domingo a “ser siervo de siervos” con nuestra vida cristiana. Estamos todavía de camino hacia Jerusalén y, por tercera vez, Jesús confía a los discípulos el destino de muerte que le espera al final del camino. Dos discípulos, que parece no le afectó en absoluto o no escucharon las palabras del Maestro, los hijos de Zebedeo, Santiago y Juan se acercan a Jesús y le piden los primeros puestos a su lado cuando instaure su Reino. Ante la pretensión de los dos discípulos, Jesús dice: “No saben lo que piden. ¿Pueden beber la copa que yo voy a beber, o ser bautizados con el bautismo con que voy a ser bautizado”? Jesús quiere explicarles las exigencias del Evangelio a través de dos símbolos bíblicos: el cáliz y el bautismo. Ambos símbolos son interpretados por Jesús en relación a su muerte. El cáliz es el signo de la ira de Dios. El bautismo presenta el sacrificio de sangre de su pasión. Es decir, con las dos imágenes Jesús muestra que su camino no es una carrera hacia el poder. Por eso Jesús reúne nuevamente a los Doce a su alrededor: “Saben que los que son tenidos como jefes de las naciones, las dominan como señores absolutos y sus grandes las oprimen con su poder”. En su comunidad no habrá lugar para el poder que opprime, solo para el servicio que ayuda. Jesús no quiere jefes sentados a su derecha e izquierda, sino servidores como Él, que dan su vida por los demás. Jesús deja las cosas claras. Su Iglesia no se construye desde la imposición de los de arriba, sino desde el servicio de los que se colocan abajo. No cabe en ella jerarquía alguna en clave de honor o dominación. Tampoco métodos y estrategias de poder. El servicio es el que construye la Iglesia de Jesús. Dice de sí mismo, presentándose como modelo a imitar: “El Hijo del hombre no ha venido a ser servido, sino a servir y a dar su vida como rescate por muchos”. Este domingo de las misiones nos anime a renovar nuestra misionariedad en el espíritu de entrega, fidelidad y servicio que nos testimonia Jesús y que muchos misioneros nos han dejado como ejemplo de vida. Amen.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Ventinovesima Domenica del T.O — Ciclo "B". Gesù ha appena ricordato per la terza volta la sorte che lo attende a Gerusalemme, ma l'arrivismo dei discepoli prende subito il sopravvento sulla paura che per un attimo li aveva assaliti. Dopo la confessione di Pietro a Cesarea e la discussione lungo la strada per sapere chi di loro fosse il più grande, si capisce facilmente l'ambizione che spinge i figli di

Zebedeo a rivendicare i posti migliori nel regno messianico della fine dei tempi. Nella corsa ai privilegi, i due sanno bene quello che vogliono, così come gli altri dieci discepoli, nonostante la loro virtuosa indignazione.

In realtà non sanno quello che chiedono, e Gesù lo rivela loro, parlando in termini ben diversi di quello che sarà il loro

«ministero» e correggendo la loro ambizione troppo grossolana del merito, secondo la quale l'uomo potrebbe acquistare diritti su Dio, il vero discepolo può aspirare ad una cosa sola: condividere la passione del maestro. Ma non si può rivendicare nessuna ricompensa. Dio è libero di donare a chi vuole. Il cristiano parteciperà semplicemente alla condizione di «servo» che fu quella di Gesù, cioè alla sua vita e alla sua morte per gli altri. La vera grandezza cristiana, infatti, non consiste nel dominare, ma nel servire. Queste sono le basi del governo, di una chiesa costruita sul servizio, secondo l'esempio del figlio di Dio che si china come uno schiavo a lavare i piedi ai suoi discepoli, e offre per la moltitudine degli uomini il sacrificio del servo sofferente.

Troppi spesso, nel corso della storia, il governo della Chiesa è stato esercitato come un potere o una dominazione. I suoi responsabili hanno trascurato di mettere a confronto la propria missione con quella del Cristo morto e risorto. Secondo il vangelo c'è un solo modo di regnare: mettendosi al servizio del Vangelo, mettersi al servizio degli altri. I «principi della chiesa», se di principi si può parlare, non devono avere nessun'altra aspirazione e nessun'altra pretesa.

Capovolgimento di prospettive — Il buon senso ci fa presentire che il successo viene sono alla fine di una lotta. Gli apostoli comprendono in questo modo le parole di Gesù sul suo destino di sofferenza: dopo una fase difficile, egli «sfonderà» e il regno di Dio non sarà più un sogno. Secondo Gesù, invece le persone «arrivate», non trasformano assolutamente nulla. Al contrario, coloro che cambiano il mondo sono proprio gli uomini continuamente contraddetti e minacciati, come lui; è giocando la propria pelle che si instaura il regno di Dio. Il destino del Messia è quello del servo sofferente, che offre la sua vita per gli altri. Solo chi gli assomiglia è grande, e viene riconosciuto come capo nel regno di Dio.
