From the Pastor's Desk

XXX SUNDAY in O. T. This Sunday, we find Jesus as he leaves Jericho on his way to Jerusalem, accompanied by his disciples and the crowd. Suddenly they hear a few screams. It is a blind beggar, Bartimaeus, that from the edge of the road, he calls on Jesus: "**Son of David, have mercy on me**". His blindness prevents him from enjoying life like others. We know, he was unable to journey to Jerusalem, because God's representatives would not allow the blind to enter the temple: the blind could not enter the sacred space. They were also unable to have a normal life, marginalized, and abandoned by the people.

Bartimaeus only depends on the compassion of Jesus. We know the blind don't see, but you know he could listen and he listens to the voice of Jesus that reaches him through the crowds: "**Get up, rise, he is calling you!**"! The blind man jumps up: drops the cloak, which is preventing him from getting up, takes a leap in the midst of his darkness and runs to Jesus. Jesus stops, starts the conversation with him, talks to him, shows interest in him and seeing his situation asks: "**What do you want me to do?**" Bartimaeus, in the simple way he uses to pray, says: "**Rabbuni, I want to see**"! Bartimaeus recognized the light even without seeing it. That is the reason why he came immediately to be able to see. Jesus says to him: "**Go, your faith has saved you**". This is the healing that we need today as christians. The qualitative leap that can change and transform your life and mine, and offer a new face to our Church. This is the spirit that you and I need to have in the Church. We need to be positive, especially in these times of passivity and scandals. We need to return to Jesus who is calling us. This is the first step towards a blissful transformation. Therefore, we need to put ourselves in an attitude of listening so that we can meet personally the Lord Jesus. On the other hand, we have to avoid the attitude of the disciples and of the people, who are bothered with the cries of the poor, those in need, or those who are seeking hospitality. Keep in mind, there is no christianity of Jesus without listening and responding to those who are suffering. We know, we can meet them any time and any where. This week's topic in all the newspapers and newscasts, where about what?: "**THE CARAVAN**". I have read and heard several reflections, many worthy of praises, but to be honest, many were heartfelt opinions, and others pretty shameful for human and Christian values. I wonder how Jesus would respond to those asking for help and compassion, but I believe Jesus would remind us the attitude of a true christian, the one of the Good Samaritan, which is the one that He shows with the blind person: "**What do you want me to do for you?**"

The Scalabrinians, we stand in solidarity with The Caravan and we served them in Cd. Guatemala, Tecún Umán, Border Guatemala/Mexico and in several points of Mexico with food and lodging, and we have posted the following message of solidarity.

Who knows what accumulation of misfortunes and privations makes them look so painful a path! ... How many disappointments, how many new pains does the uncertain future prepare for them? How many will achieve victory in the struggle for existence? How many will succumb among citizen tumults or in the silence of the uninhabited space? (Bishop Scalabrini at the Train Station of Milan)

The Missionaries of Saint Charles-Scalabrinians, who serve in the Province of Saint John the Baptist, before the dramatic situation that thousands of Honduran Brothers and Sisters who are living their exodus. We aware of the inherent dignity that every human being possesses, and knowing that their journey while it tires, hurts and threatens, it can also become a space of hope.

We express our deep concern and our evangelical solidarity,

and we make an appeal to the Communities of Faith and the People of Good Will, to join efforts, so that this drama becomes a less painful odyssey. We believe that it becomes a situation that encourages us to celebrate the Universal Fraternity with them as their journey toward a new life engaging and challenging us, as well as they invite us to convert to an outstretched hand and an open heart, toward those who need us the most.

Del Escritorio del Párroco

XXX DOMINGO T.O. Este domingo nos encontramos con Jesús que sale de Jericó camino a Jerusalén. Va acompañado de sus discípulos y de la muchedumbre. De pronto se escuchan unos gritos. Es un mendigo ciego, **Bartimeo** que, desde el borde del camino, se dirige a Jesús: **"Hijo de David, ten compasión de mí"**. Su ceguera le impide disfrutar de la vida como los demás. El nunca podrá peregrinar hasta Jerusalén. Los representantes de Dios le cerrarían las puertas del templo: los ciegos no podían entrar en el recinto sagrado. Eran imposibilitados a tener una vida normal, marginados y abandonados por la gente. A Bartimeo, sólo le queda pedir compasión a Jesús. Sabemos el ciego no ve, pero si sabe escuchar la voz de Jesús que le llega a través de sus enviados: ¡**"Ánimo, levántate, que te llama"**! El ciego reacciona de forma admirable: suelta el manto que le impide levantarse, da un salto en medio de su oscuridad y se acerca a Jesús. Jesús se detiene, comienza la conversación con él, le habla, muestra interés por él y por su situación y le pregunta: **“Qué quieres que te haga”?** Bartimeo, del mismo modo que antes había orado con simplicidad, le dice: **“Rabbuní, ¡quiero ver”!** Bartimeo reconoció la luz incluso sin verla. Por eso recobró inmediatamente la vista. Jesús le dice: **“Vete, tu fe te ha salvado”**. Esta es la curación que necesitamos hoy los cristianos. El salto cualitativo que puede cambiar y transformar tu vida y la mía y ofrecer un rostro nuevo a nuestra Iglesia. **Este es el espíritu que tú y Yo necesitamos tener en la Iglesia**. Animarnos mutuamente a reaccionar positivamente, sobre todo en estos tiempos de pasividad y escándalos. **Tenemos que volver a Jesús que nos está llamando**. Este es el primer paso hacia una gozosa transformación. Por lo tanto, tenemos que ponernos en actitud de escuchar para encontrarnos personalmente con el Señor. De otro lado tomariamos la actitud de los discípulos y de la gente, que se molestan de los gritos de los que viven mal, necesitados o que nos piden hospitalidad. Recordémonos, **no hay cristianismo de Jesús sin escuchar y atender a los que sufren**. Sabemos, los podemos encontrar en cualquier momento. Tema de esta semana en todos los periódicos y noticieros, ¿qué fue?: **“LA CARAVANA”**. He leído y escuchado varias reflexiones, muchas dignas de elogios, por las honestas, sinceras opiniones que expresaban y otras de vergüenza humana y cristiana. Creo que Jesús respondería, a los que piden ayuda y compasión, con la única postura cristiana, la del Buen Samaritano, que es la que Él tuvo ante el ciego: **“Qué quieres que haga por tí”?**

Los Scalabrinianos nos solidarizamos con La Caravana en Cd. Guatemala, en Tecún Umán, Frontera Guatemala con México y en varios puntos de México con comida y hospedaje y publicamos el siguiente mensaje de solidaridad.

*¿Quién sabe qué cúmulo de desventuras y privaciones les hace parecer dulce un paso tan doloroso!...
¿Cuántos desengaños, cuántos nuevos dolores les prepara el porvenir incierto? ¿Cuántos conseguirán la victoria en la lucha por la existencia? ¿Cuántos sucumbirán entre los tumultos ciudadanos o en el silencio de la llanura deshabitada? (Mons. Scalabrin en la estación de Milán)*

Los Misioneros de San Carlos-Scalabrinianos, que sirven en la Provincia de San Juan Bautista, ante la dramática situación que miles de Hermanos y Hermanas Hondureños están viviendo en su éxodo, conscientes de la dignidad inherente que todo ser humano posee, y sabiendo que el camino mientras cansa, lastima y amenaza, también puede volverse espacio de esperanza, **manifestamos nuestra profunda preocupación y nuestra solidaridad evangélica**, y hacemos un apelo a las Comunidades de Fe y a las Personas de Buena Voluntad, a sumar esfuerzos, para que este drama se vuelva una odisea menos dolorosa, y se transforme en una situación que nos anime a celebrar la Fraternidad Universal, hermanándonos con quienes al avanzar nos interpelan, y nos invitan a convertirnos en mano tendida y corazón abierto, hacia quien más lo necesite.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Trentesima Domenica del T. O. — Anno “B”. Sulla strada che sale a Gerusalemme, Gesù cammina davanti ai discepoli che lo seguono spaventati, più ciechi che mai. Non riescono a comprendere perché il Figlio dell'uomo debba soffrire e morire. Eppure basterebbe seguirlo risolutamente per conoscere nella profondità della sua umiliazione, la sua era identità di Figlio di Dio.

Nel riferire l'episodio della guarigione di Bartimeo, Marco pensa sicuramente al di là dei Dodici, alla comunità del suo tempo, chiamata a seguire Gesù sulla via della passione, ma tanto lenta ad intraprendere con coraggio questo cammino.

Paradossalmente l'uomo cieco, che siede sul bordo della strada a mendicare, riesce a percepire molto meglio della folla chi è Gesù. Esprimendo la sua convinzione con molte grida, Bartimeo balza in piedi e lascia ogni sostegno per precipitarsi con fede verso colui che lo chiama e che sta per guarirlo. È il miracolo della chiaroveggenza della fede che non solo salva, ma mette in moto il dinamismo della conversione, immagine del vero discepolo e di tutta la comunità dei credenti, il cieco guarito si pone immediatamente a seguire Gesù lungo la strada.

Simbolo «di coloro che stavano nelle tenebre e dell'ombra della morte »(Lc 1,78), Bartimeo così diventa il modello di tutti quelli che desiderano di uscire dalle tenebre per potersi mettere in cammino al seguito di Gesù. Per essi c'è un liberatore; io lo farò vedere loro »(Pascal). Vedere l'amore che viene sotto il segno della croce. Vedere la dolcezza delle mani di Dio che raccolgono tante lacrime e tanti morte incomprensibili. Vedere il volto del Figlio di Dio levarsi come un sole di giustizia, sull'orizzonte dei poveri. Vedere la risurrezione già operante in tanti impulsi di rinnovamento, nella chiesa e nel mondo. Con l'aiuto del figlio di Davide, sapere entrare anche noi nel numero degli uomini che credono, che invocano, che vedono? «Rabbunì, che io abbia la vista!»

Degli occhi per vedere.— Gesù si prepara ad affrontare la passione. Gli apostoli pensano solo alla gioia e al trionfo, non riescono a capire le previsioni dolorose del maestro. La guarigione di Bartimeo, così come rende a lui la vita, aprirà anche i loro occhi? La nostra fame di gioia terrena falsa a volte il nostro sguardo, fino a renderlo cieco dinnanzi alle esigenze della salvezza. La fede soltanto può darci una chiara visione del senso della nostra storia; il cammino che porta alla gloria del risorto passa per l'umiliazione del Golgotha. E se Cristo si presenta a noi sotto l'aspetto del povero e del sofferente, i nostri occhi sapranno riconoscerlo e il nostro cuore donargli un po' di amore?




