From the Pastor's Desk

XXXI SUNDAY T.O. On Friday, November 1st, we have commemorated ALL SAINTS. Men and women who have distinguished themselves through history for their exemplary Christian life, witnessing in an admirable and extraordinary way the theological and cardinal virtues. The saints are those people who made their lives a total donation to God in an experience of prayer, service, charity, goodness, forgiveness, penance and love. On November 2nd, we remembered ALL THE DEAD, our beloved ones whom we miss, love and believe are enjoying the glory of eternity with the Risen Lord. On November 4th we remember the great saint that our founder Blessed John B. Scalabrin, father of the Migrants, left us as a great missionary example for his great zeal in loving God and God's people. San Carlos was born in the castle of Arona, next to Lake Maggiore, on October 2nd, 1538. From the earliest years, he showed great seriousness and devotion. At twelve, he

received the tonsure. His older brother, to whom most of the inheritance corresponded, suddenly died after falling from a horse. He considered the death of his brother as a warning sent from heaven, to be prepared because the least expected day, God comes through death to ask us for accounts. This motivated him to take Jesus' words very seriously; "**H**e who saves his life loses it, but he who spends his life for Me will save it". He was from a very rich family. Incidentally, there was no lack of accusations that his election as secretary of the Vatican State was due to nepotism (he was a nephew of the Pope), however, his enormous fruits of holiness show that it was an election of the Holy Spirit. He renounced his wealth and was ordained a priest and later archbishop of Milan. As bishop, his diocese that brought together the regions of Lombardy, Venice, Switzerland, Piedmont and Liguria. He attended them all. His shield carried only one word: "**H**umilitas", **humility**. He, being noble and rich, lived close to the people, depriving himself

of luxuries. He was rightly called "**f**ather of the poor". He said that a bishop too careful of his health fails to become a saint and that every priest and every apostle should have plenty of work to do, instead of having plenty of spare time. For those in need, he was supremely understanding. He was very friendly and attentive to his collaborators, but demanding. And for himself he was very demanding and severe. He was also the target of a vile attack, while praying in his chapel, but left unharmed, generously forgiving the aggressor. He founded seminars to form well-prepared priests, and drafted such wise regulations for those institutes that many bishops copied them to organize their own seminars. Together with San Pío V, San Felipe Neri and San Ignacio de Loyola, he is one of the four prominent figures in the counter-reform. He died young and poor, having greatly enriched many with grace ... he died saying: "**I'm coming, Lord, I'm coming**". In Milan almost nobody slept that night, at the tremendous news that his beloved Cardinal archbishop was dying. **Saint Charles Borromeo pray for us!**

A 1974 graduate of Fenwick High School and a 1978 graduate of the University of Notre Dame, Father Shea joined the Franciscans in 1980 and was ordained a priest in 1987. Father Ed has spent most of his priesthood in parish work, including four years as the priest-presider for the St. Giles Family Mass Community in Oak Park. He was pastor of a church in Joliet and St. Joseph Parish in Chicago. Father Ed is currently stationed at St. Peter's Church in downtown Chicago. During the past several years he has done a good deal of itinerant preaching in the Chicago area and beyond. He is a Franciscan priest who loves to sing and tell stories; more than anything he thrives on celebrating the sacraments of the church. A true follower of St. Francis, Father Ed finds reasons to rejoice often in the goodness of God's presence in our world.

XXXI DOMINGO T.O. El Viernes, 1 de Noviembre hemos celebrado la vida de TODOS LOS SANTOS. Hombres y mujeres que se han distinguido a través de la historia por su ejemplar vida cristiana, testimoniando de una manera admirable y extraordinaria las virtudes teologales y cardinales. Los santos son aquellas personas que hicieron de sus vidas una donación total a Dios en una vivencia de oración, servicio, caridad, bondad, perdón, penitencia y amor. El 2 de noviembre hemos recordado TODOS LOS DIFUNTOS, nuestros seres queridos que extrañamos, queremos, amamos y creemos gozan la Gloria de la eternidad con el resucitado en el cielo. El 4 de noviembre recordamos un gran santo que nuestro fundador el Beato Giovanni B. Scalabrin, padre de los Migrantes, nos dejó como gran ejemplo misionero por su gran celo en el amar a Dios y las almas. San Carlos nació en el castillo de Arona, junto al lago Maggiore, el 2 de octubre de

1538. Desde los primeros años, dio muestras de gran seriedad y devoción. A los doce años, recibió la tonsura. Su hermano mayor, a quien correspondía la mayor parte de la herencia, murió repentinamente al caer de un caballo. El consideró la muerte de su hermano como un aviso enviado por el cielo, para estar preparado porque el día menos pensado llega Dios por medio de la muerte a pedirnos cuentas. Esto lo motivó a tomar muy en serio las palabras de Jesús; "**Quien ahorra su vida, la pierde, pero el que gasta su vida por Mí, la ganará**". Era de familia muy rica. Por cierto, no faltaron las acusaciones de que su elección como secretario del Estado del Vaticano fue por nepotismo (era sobrino del Papa), sus enormes frutos de santidad demuestran que fue una elección del Espíritu Santo. Renunció a sus riquezas y fue ordenado sacerdote y mas tarde arzobispo de Milán. Como obispo, su diócesis que reunía a los pueblos de Lombardía, Venecia, Suiza, Piamonte y Liguria. Los atendía a todos. Su escudo llevaba una sola palabra: "**Humilitas**", humildad. El, siendo noble y riquísimo, vivía cerca del pueblo, privándose de lujos. Fue

llamado con razón "**padre de los pobres**". Decía que un obispo demasiado cuidadoso de su salud no consigue llegar a ser santo y que a todo sacerdote y a todo apóstol deben sobrarle trabajos para hacer, en vez de tener tiempo de sobra para perder. Para con los necesitados era supremamente comprensivo. Para con sus colaboradores era muy amigable y atento, pero exigente. Y para consigo mismo era exigentísimo y severo. Fue también blanco de un vil atentado, mientras rezaba en su capilla, pero salió ilesa, perdonando generosamente al agresor. Fundó seminarios para formar sacerdotes bien preparados, y redactó para esos institutos unos reglamentos tan sabios, que muchos obispos los copiaron para organizar según ellos sus propios seminarios. Junto con San Pío V, San Felipe Neri y San Ignacio de Loyola, es una de las cuatro figuras más grandes de la contrarreforma. Murió joven y pobre, habiendo enriquecido enormemente a muchos con la gracia ... murió diciendo: "**Ya voy, Señor, ya voy**". En Milán casi nadie durmió esa noche, ante la tremenda noticia de que su queridísimo Cardenal arzobispo, estaba agonizando. **¡San Carlos Borromeo ruega por nosotros!**



Zaccheo e... noi?!

La Parola di questa domenica si può definire la ricerca di Dio e l' «abbraccio misericordioso» per ognuno di noi. Siamo ormai finendo l'anno della fede, indetto dal Papa, quale tempo favorevole per sentirsi accolti nel cuore di Gesù che ci tende la mano pronto a venire a casa nostra. Un pittore inglese dipinse un Gesù che bussa dietro una porta chiusa, mentre infuria la tempesta e Lui è in mezzo a erbacce e rovi. Poiché la maniglia è solo dalla parte di dentro, non può entrare finché qualcuno non apre. Bellissima immagine di Dio e noi! Siamo solo noi che possiamo aprire la porta a Cristo, gli unici che possiamo invertire le rotte verso la sorgente della vita, in grado di lasciarsi accogliere da Colui che ha «compassione di tutti in vista del pentimento» (Sap.11,23). E' quello che dice la prima lettura di oggi. Il Signore poco per volta ci conduce verso la salvezza e ci chiede docilità nel seguirlo sulla via della vita. Anche nella seconda lettura San Paolo invita la comunità di Tessalònica a vivere nella concretezza la sua appartenenza a Cristo e a tradurre la sua fede in gesti coraggiosi. Paolo invita a non fuggire alla fatiche dell'oggi e a non lasciarsi vincere dalla tentazione di evadere fuori del tempo, reclamando come imminente la venuta del Signore. La fede passa per la croce della prova e per scelte di vita che costano. Tutto questo si realizza in Zaccheo che con coraggio ha tradotto quel «briciolo di fede in fondo al cuore» in un forte e chiaro gesto: «salì sull'albero per vedere Gesù». Luca nel Vangelo di questa trentunesima domenica continua a passare in rassegna i pubblici peccatori (vi ricordate domenica scorsa il fariseo e il pubblico nel tempio?). Anche Zaccheo è un pubblico, appaltatore della tasse, ricco, malvisto e ladro. Zaccheo significa: «Dio si ricorda». Il capo degli esattori delle tasse viene riscattato da Gesù, egli, abituato ad estorcere fino all'ultimo spicciolo riceve gratuitamente la salvezza. Se Giosuè ha assistito alla caduta delle mura di Gerico, Gesù costata l'ingresso da parte di un ricco nel regno dei cieli. Poco prima aveva detto: «E' più facile per un cammello passare per la cruna di un ago che per un ricco entrare nel regno dei cieli! (Lc 18,25). Zaccheo, piccolo di statura, cioè con poca fede, compie un gesto grande, sale su un sicomoro, ma ecco, che si sente chiamare: «Zaccheo, scendi subito, perché oggi devo fermarmi a casa tua». A volte siamo noi che tentiamo con le nostre opere di conquistare Dio, invece è Lui che in Cristo viene a curare noi! Apriamogli le porte, fisicamente e spiritualmente. Saliamo, diamoci cioè da fare, lasciamoci trovare da Gesù che ci cerca sul sicomoro. Tante volte il cuore non ha bisogno di parole, basta uno sguardo. «Andrò in cerca della pecora perduta... Ci sarà più gioia in cielo per un peccatore pentito che per novantanove giusti che non hanno bisogno di conversione» (Lc 15, 4.7). Zaccheo, pieno di gioia, accoglie Gesù, ma la folla subito inizia a mormorare scandalizzata (come siamo tutti bravi in questo!): «è andato ad alloggiare da un peccatore!». Ma Zaccheo ormai ha trovato la vera ricchezza: Gesù, e ci spiazza con la sua immediata risposta: «Ecco, Signore, io dò la metà dei miei beni ai poveri e se ho frodato qualcuno, restituisco quattro volte tanto». E la risposta del Signore? Eccola: «oggi la salvezza è entrata in questa casa». Il Santo Abate Benedetto ci incoraggia: «mai disperare della misericordia di Dio» (RB 4,74). Dio si ricorda di ognuno di noi e notte e giorno ci cerca. Nonostante la nostra «piccola statura» non ci scoraggiamo, la preghiera è il nostro «albero», la nostra salvezza e ci sentiremo anche noi chiamare per nome: oggi devo fermarmi a casa tua!


