From the Pastor's Desk

XXXII SUNDAY OF THE O.T. We are coming to the conclusion of this liturgical year and we are at the end of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem. The evangelist Mark emphasizes the difference between the attitude of the crowd and that of the scribes and Pharisees. Jesus listens to the people who follow him and does not want to neglect their needs and even less to abandon them to their destiny. Jesus presents us two strong scenes for our reflection. In the first, Jesus puts people on guard against religious leaders: "Beware of the teachers of the Law"! Their behavior can be hurtful for they often focused on their own interests. In the second, He calls his disciples to take note of the gesture of a poor widow: simple people can teach us to live the Gospel. On the other hand, the powerful ones seek to show off. Jesus reprimands the scribes and adds: "They devour the property and houses of the widows, masking it with long prayers." The houses of the widows are the houses of those who have no one to defend them. Still today there are many houses of widows and orphans that no one defends. Sometimes we see entire countries that are becoming impoverished for the benefit of the few. Yes, there are many widows like that of Sarepta, of whom the first reading speaks. In many houses and in many countries people do not have food for tomorrow. They do not have a future. Let us remember that 250 million people are forced to live outside to their native country. Jesus invites us to ask ourselves: Who will watch over "these needy widows" of today? Who will take care of them? He cares for them the same way, He carefully fixes His eyes on the widow who was giving her alms in the temple. Jesus looks at her while she throws into the treasury the only two coins she has. Obviously, no one notices her gesture. She does not belong to a noble family, so she does not attract the attention. She does neither belong to the world of rich or famous people, so nobody looks at her. However, Jesus looks with admiration to that woman. Only He pays attention at her. The disciples, distracted or concentrated only in themselves, Jesus teaches them to look with love and attention even the smallest things. The eyes of Jesus' love were settled on her. Let us ask the Lord for the grace to trust in Him and be able to share our richness and to entrust our poor heart entirely to the Lord for our happiness and the happiness and good of others.

XXXII DOMINGO DEL T.O. Vamos hacia la conclusión de este año litúrgico y estamos al término del viaje de Jesús hacia Jerusalén. El evangelista Marcos subraya la diferencia entre la actitud de la muchedumbre y la de los escribas y fariseos. Jesús escucha a la gente que le sigue y no quiere desatender sus necesidades y aún menos abandonarla a su destino. Nos presenta dos escenas fuertes en sus significados. **En la primera**, Jesús pone a la gente en guardia frente a los dirigentes religiosos: **¡"Cuidado con los maestros de la Ley"!**, su comportamiento puede lastimar mucho, enfocados en sus intereses. **En la segunda** llama a sus discípulos para que tomen **nota del gesto de una viuda pobre**: la gente sencilla nos podrá enseñar a vivir el Evangelio. De otro lado, los poderosos miran a apantallar. Jesús reprimenda a los escribas, que añade: **"Devoran la hacienda de las viudas enmasquarandola con largas oraciones"**. Las casas de las viudas son las casas de aquellos que no tienen a nadie que les defienda. Todavía hoy hay muchas casas de viudas y de huérfanos a los que nadie defiende; a veces se trata de países enteros que van empobreciéndose a beneficio de pocos. Sí, hay muchas viudas como la de Sarepta, de quien habla la primera lectura. **En muchas casas y en muchas tierras no hay comida para el mañana. No hay futuro.** Fijémonos en los 250 millones de personas obligadas a vivir lejos de su país nativo. ¿Quién velará por **"estas viudas y necesitados"** de hoy en día? ¿Quién se ocupará de ellas-ellos? Jesús se fija en ellas-ellos, los mira. Él los -las mira del mismo modo que fijó su mirada en la viuda que echaba su limosna en el templo. Jesús la ve mientras echa en el tesoro las dos únicas monedas que tiene. Evidentemente, nadie se percató de aquel gesto. No es de familia noble, así que no atrae la atención; no pertenece al mundo de las personas ricas o famosas, así que nadie se fija en ella. Sin embargo, Jesús mira con cariño y admiración a aquella mujer. Solo Él la ve. A los discípulos, distraídos o atentos solo a lo que impresiona, Jesús les enseña a mirar con amor y atención incluso las cosas más pequeñas. Sobre ella se habían posado los ojos de amor de Jesús. Pidamos al Señor la gracia de también nosotros saber confiar y desprendernos de nuestras riquezas y ofrecer nuestro pobre corazón enteramente al Señor por nuestra felicidad y bien de los demás.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Trentaduesima Domenica del T.O. — Ciclo "B" — Il vangelo di questa domenica contrappone i gesti ostentati di scribi ambiziosi e avidi di ricchezze all'atteggiamento umile e pieno di fede di una vedova povera. Nella trama del vangelo di Marco, è significativo che la critica rivolta alla corsa di privilegi e agli onori, a cui fa eco l'elogio della generosità di

una donna del popolo, venga collocato proprio a questo punto. Gesù infatti sta per entrare nel santuario del cielo, dopo avere offerto tutto se stesso e dopo avere conosciuto la più profonda umiliazione.

Possiamo immaginare i diversi sentimenti di coloro che portano la loro offerta al tempio. Fierezza e presunzione dei ricchi, desiderosi di mettere in mostra la loro generosità, che tuttavia intacca appena i loro beni. Discrezione e umiltà di una vedova povera che fa scivolare due monetine nella cassetta, privandosi del necessario, come un tempo la vedova di Sarepta aveva donato con fede al profeta Elia quel poco che le rimaneva per non morire di fame. Chi sarà preferito da Dio? Un rabbino del tempo di Gesù aveva già osservato che «*due tortore offerte da un povero*» hanno più valore di mille sacrifici del re Agrippa. Gesù, parola di Dio, lo conferma, additando ai suoi discepoli l'offerta del povero, che prefigura l'offerta che egli stesso farà del proprio corpo e del proprio sangue, sotto gli umili segni del pane e del vino.

Col suo obolo, la vedova offriva a Dio tutto quello che aveva per vivere. Nell'Eucarestia, Gesù ci dona realmente se stesso con tutto quello di cui abbiamo bisogno per vivere. Da che parte vogliamo stare? Con gli scribi che si preoccupano di fare bella figura rinunciando soltanto a una piccola parte del superfluo, o con la vedova povera che dona tutto quello che ha?

L'ipocrisia denunciata— Gli scribi hanno dei discepoli anche nella nostra storia cristiana. La corsa agli onori è più praticata che il sedersi a tavola coi peccatori o solidarizzare con gli oppressi. Quante costruzioni ecclesiastiche hanno in ogni tempo divorato il denaro delle vedove col pretesto di costruire una casa di preghiera! Queste dichiarazioni di buon senso sono comuni a tutti i saggi di tutte le regioni e di tutti i tempi. Tuttavia, per Gesù tali frasi non hanno nulla di astratto o di moralistico. Nel momento in cui egli denuncia la corsa ai primi posti, si prepara ad essere messo nel rango dei malfattori, proprio all'ultimo posto.
