## From the Pastor's Desk

**XXXIV Sunday O.T. and Last Sunday of the Liturgical Year: Solemnity of Christ the King.** We have been walking this year and especially in recent months surrounded by anxiety, worries, challenges, difficulties, sufferings, deaths in the midst of illusions, dreams and hopes. There is no doubt that the news of a few days ago, promising a new vaccine, silenced most of us, welcoming it, as a blessing from heaven. Because, while the data of those infected with Covid-19 continues to rise tremendously; fortunately, the double news that arrived affirming that in a few months, we will soon have the vaccine, reassure all of us. Hopefully, it will arrive soon. No doubt, we all

received this news as a great release. Blessed be God. Amen.

This Sunday, end of the Liturgical Year, we will read from the Gospel of Saint Matthew, the proclamation of the last verses of chapter 25. After having reflected in these last two Sundays the parables of the 10 virgins: 5 wise and 5 foolish ones and that of the talents. Thus, we encounter today the well-known account of the final judgment, where Jesus, the Risen One, presents the requirements needed to enter into His Glory. He tells us, as the shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, so at the end of the days, you and I will be judged on how we have lived and witnessed our love. We know that the criterion of separation at the end of our life will not be based on ideological, cultural or religious differences (how many Masses we have participated or rosary we have prayed), but on how we have embodied the message of the gospel and how we have served those in need and the poor. Jesus will be the judge who will appear to us and will tell us: "**I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me, a stranger and you welcome me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me**". This dialogue that presents us the gospel of the judge and his interlocutors, in whom both the good and the bad are surprised, helps us to realize and convince ourselves that true charity lies at the heart of Christian life. Jesus repeats to us: "If you recognize me in the face of those people who live on the street or the abandoned old man or that disfigured children whom are at time separated from their parents or from those foreigners expelled and not welcomed". Believe me, Jesus will tell us: "**those actions you did them to me or you did not do them to me**". Mt. 25:40. In order to enjoy salvation, the Lord does not ask us for extraordinary and impossible gestures, but for meaningful and great sign of compassion, kindness, sensitive, spiritual and welcoming heart. Let us ask the Lord for grace at the end of this liturgical year that, through an enlightened spiritual life, nourished by a good sacramental life, prayer and many rosaries, we may have a heart full of God's grace and be able to live true charity, recognizing the face of Jesus in each of our fellow brothers and sisters. Amen.

### DEL ESCRITORIO PARROCO:

**XXXIV Domingo T.O. y Último Domingo del Año Litúrgico: Solemnidad de Cristo Rey.** Hemos venido caminando en este año y sobre todo en estos últimos meses rodeados de ansiedad, preocupaciones, retos, dificultades, sufrimientos, muertes en medio también de ilusiones, sueños y esperanzas. No cabe duda que la noticia de hace algunos días, a todos nos calló como **bendición de lo alto**. Porque mientras los datos de los infectados de Covid-19 siguen tremadamente ascendiendo, afortunadamente llegó la doble noticia que en algunos meses ya tendremos **la vacuna disponible**. **Ojalá llegue pronto**. Todos recibimos esta noticia como una gran liberación. Bendito sea Dios. Amen.

Este domingo de fin de Año Litúrgico en el cual durante el año hemos leído el evangelio de San Mateo. Hoy concluye con la proclamación de los últimos versos del capítulo 25 de San Mateo. Luego de habernos presentado en estos dos últimos domingos las parábolas de las 10 vírgenes: 5 precavidas y 5 distraídas y la de los talentos. Así, nos encontramos con el conocido relato del juicio final, en donde Jesús, el Resucitado, presenta los requisitos para entrar al final de los días en Su Gloria. Nos dice, como el pastor separa las ovejas de los cabritos, así al final de los días, tú y yo seremos juzgados sobre como hemos vivido y testimoniado nuestro amor. Sabemos que el criterio de separación al final de nuestra vida no se basará en diferencias ideológicas, culturales o religiosas (cuantas misas he participado o rosario he rezado), sino en como hemos encarnado el mensaje del evangelio y en como hemos servido a los necesitados y a los pobres. Será el mismo juez, Jesús que se nos presentará y nos dirá: "**Tuve hambre, y me diste de comer; tuve sed, y me diste de beber...**". Este diálogo que nos presenta el evangelio del juez y sus interlocutores, en los cuales se quedan sorprendidos tanto los buenos como los malos nos ayuda a percarnos y convencernos que en el corazón de la vida cristiana está la verdadera caridad. Nos repite Jesús: "**si tu me reconociste en el rostro de aquella persona que vive en la calle o del anciano abandonado o de aquel niño desfigurado y separados de sus papas o de aquellos extranjeros expulsados y no acogidos, a mi me lo hiciste o no hiciste**". Para gozar la salvación el Señor no nos pide gestos extraordinarios e imposibles de realizar, sino un gran corazón compasivo, bondadoso, sensible, espiritual y acogedor. Pidamos al Señor la gracia al terminar este año litúrgico que, a través de una iluminada vida espiritual, alimentada de una buena vida sacramental, de oración y de muchos rosarios tengamos un corazón lleno de Dios y seamos capaces de vivir la verdadera caridad, reconociendo el rostro de Jesús en cada uno de nuestros semejantes. Amen.




**XXXIV Domenica T.O.** e ultima domenica dell'anno liturgico: **Solennità di Cristo Re.** Quest'anno abbiamo camminato spiritualmente affrontando varie sfide e soprattutto negli ultimi mesi circondati da ansie, preoccupazioni, difficoltà, sofferenze e defunti, in mezzo a illusioni, sogni e speranze. Non c'è dubbio che la notizia di pochi giorni fa ci abbia rasserenati tutti come una benedizione dall'alto. Perché mentre i dati dei contagiatati da Covid-19 continuano a salire a dismisura, fortunatamente è arrivata la doppia bella notizia che tra pochi mesi avremo già il vaccino a disposizione. Speriamo arrivi presto. Accogliamo tutti questa notizia

come un grande sollievo. Benedetto sia Iddio. Amen.

Questa domenica, concludendo l'anno liturgico in cui abbiamo letto tutto il Vangelo di san Matteo, ascoltiamo la proclamazione degli ultimi versetti del capitolo 25. Quindi ciò che abbiamo ascoltato in queste ultime due domeniche, le parabole delle 10 vergini: 5 sagge e 5 stolte e la parabola dei talenti. Oggi incontriamo il ben noto racconto del giudizio finale, dove Gesù, il Risorto, presenta i requisiti per entrare alla fine dei tempi nella Sua Gloria. Ci dice che, come il pastore separa le pecore dalle capre, così alla fine dei giorni, tu ed io saremo giudicati per come abbiamo vissuto e testimoniato il nostro amore. Sappiamo che il criterio di separazione alla fine della nostra vita non sarà basato su differenze ideologiche, culturali o religiose (quante messe ho partecipato o quanti rosari ho recitato), ma su come abbiamo incarnato il messaggio del Vangelo e come abbiamo servito chi è nel bisogno, i poveri. Sarà lo stesso giudice, Gesù, che ci apparirà e ci dirà: **"Avevo fame e mi avete dato da mangiare; avevo sete e mi avete dato da bere ...".** Questo dialogo che ci presenta il vangelo del giudice e dei suoi interlocutori, in cui si sorprendono sia i buoni che i cattivi, ci aiuta a renderci conto e a convincerci che la vera carità è al centro della vita cristiana. Gesù ci ripete: **"Se mi hai riconosciuto di fronte a quella persona che vive per strada o al vecchio abbandonato o quel bambino sfigurato e separato dai genitori o da quegli stranieri espulsi e non accolti, lo hai fatto a me o ti sei desinteressato di me".** Per godere la salvezza, il Signore non ci chiede gesti straordinari e impossibili, ma un grande cuore compassionevole, gentile, sensibile, spirituale e accogliente. Chiediamo al Signore la grazia al termine di questo anno liturgico affinché, attraverso una vita spirituale illuminata, nutrita da una buona vita sacramentale, dalla preghiera e da tanti rosari, possiamo godere un cuore pieno di Dio e poter vivere la vera carità, riconoscendo il volto di Gesù in ciascuno dei nostri simili. Amen.


**1 Thes 5:18** - *In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus.*
