

From the Pastor's Desk



**Count off seven weeks of years—seven times seven years—
 so that the seven week-years amount to a period of forty-nine years.
 Then have the trumpet sounded everywhere on the tenth day of the seventh month;
 on the Day of Atonement sound the trumpet throughout your land.
 Consecrate the fiftieth year and proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants.
 It shall be a jubilee year for you
 (Lev. 25:8-10)**

According to this biblical instruction, every 50th year is to be considered a year of rejoicing for the Holy People. Several were the prescriptions to be followed during this special season of Grace, and all of them had to do with respecting peoples dignity, restoring Grace in the Land and moving forward with the certainty that God is in the midst of His people as a fortress. Since the beginning of the Church, the idea of celebrating a Holy Year of Rejoicing every 50 and later every 25 years, has been part of our Religious Experience, as disciples of Christ, this anniversary grants us the opportunity to celebrate God's fidelity, His Infinite Compassion and Divine Mercy.

The year of 2018 will be a special time for Our Lady of Mount Carmel's Faith Family. On June 10th, we will be celebrating the 50th anniversary of the consecration of the New Church building; a moment to gratefully raise our hearts in thanksgiving for the many special moments we have been able to celebrate in this House of God. Many have been the sacramental services, thousands of people have had the opportunity to celebrate in this Holy Place: Sunday Eucharists, Baptisms, Confirmations, Reconciliation Services, Anointing of the Sick, Weddings, Funerals, Religious Professions, Conferral of Holy Orders, countless hours of silent prayer... I hold no doubt, God has been good to us and this Sacred Space has been the spot where those encounters have taken place, hence the reason to get ready and prepare our hearts to celebrate this special anniversary.

Another milestone to keep in mind, is the 125th Feast in honor of la Madonna del Carmine. Year in and year out, for over a century, the devotees of Our Lady have gathered in the month of July to honor her as their special protectress. This coming year we will have the opportunity to celebrate the Jubilee of those festivities and hopefully, pledge our efforts to continue promoting this event as a special moment to celebrate our Faith in God and our Love for his Immaculate Mother.

This weekend, Bishop Manz, our Episcopal Vicar, will be celebrating the Opening Mass for the Jubilee Year. Thereafter, monthly activities are being organized as a way of prolonging our celebration till the Month of July, when we will bring it to a close. Hopefully you plan on attending them all and thus rejoice in celebrating this unique occasion. May our Blessed Mother grant us the Grace of moving forward throughout this Special Year, and may her Infant Child shower abundance of Graces over us all, members of the Parish and devotees of our Lady.



CHRIST, KING OF ALL

On this, the final Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King. By concluding the year with this feast we are proclaiming our faith that Jesus Christ is the one and only king over all seasons, all peoples, and all of creation.

At the end of time as we know it, Christ's work of restoring all things to unity and harmony with their Creator God will be completed. This Sunday, when we claim Christ as both our Shepherd and our King, we recognize our own calling to participate in Christ's saving work by caring for those whom Jesus calls "the least ones" (Matthew 25:45).





TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we have a modern feast, less than a century old, and placed at the very end of the liturgical cycle of Sundays only in 1969. In 1925, the world was in a sorry state from the vantage point of Pope Pius XI. The winds of war had swept the map of Europe raw, and ancient Christian dynasties had fallen in Russia and Spain. Although the Great War had ended, wars were breaking out everywhere. Fascism was already in control in Italy, and Nazism was on the horizon for Germany. The disorder making its claim on the human race was, the pope felt, an insult to the Divine Order. Pius XI designated the last Sunday in October as a day of universal recognition of the kingship of Christ. Creating this feast was an act of bravery by the pope, who was standing up against idolatry of the state and the dehumanizing forces of the modern world, things that are not hard to detect in today's world as well. In 1969 it seemed fitting to move the feast to a place of honor at the end of the year, a way of summing up the whole movement of the liturgical year toward the perfection of the Kingdom of God. In recent decades, many Protestant churches have adopted this day from the new Roman calendar, so it is shared now with the Church of England, the Episcopal, Presbyterian, and Lutheran churches, and others.





Mensaje del Párroco



Contarás también siete semanas de años para ti, siete veces siete años, para que tengas el tiempo de siete semanas de años, es decir, cuarenta y nueve años. Entonces tocarás fuertemente el cuerno de carnero el décimo día del séptimo mes; en el día de la expiación tocaréis el cuerno por toda la tierra. Así consagraréis el año cincuenta y proclamaréis libertad por toda la tierra para sus habitantes. Será de jubileo para vosotros (Lev. 25:8-10)

Según esta instrucción bíblica, cada 50 años debería declararse una estación de regocijo y retribución llamada el Jubileo. Varias eran las expresiones de celebración durante este año de Gracia, y todas ellas tenían que ver con la dignidad del ser humano y la invitación para avanzar hacia el futuro con la certeza que Dios camina con su Pueblo. Desde los principios de la Iglesia, la idea de celebrar un jubileo cada 50 años, y después cada 25, ha sido parte de la experiencia religiosa de los discípulos de Jesucristo. Esa festividad nos brinda la oportunidad para celebrar la fidelidad de Dios, su compasión sin límites y su misericordia divina.



CRISTO, REY DE TODOS

En este, el último domingo del año litúrgico, celebramos la solemnidad de Cristo Rey. Al concluir el año con esta fiesta proclamamos nuestra fe en que Jesucristo es el solo y único rey sobre todos los tiempos, todos los pueblos y toda la Creación.

Al final del tiempo que conocemos, quedará completa la obra de Cristo de restaurar todas las cosas en unidad y armonía con Dios su Creador. Este domingo, cuando proclamamos que Cristo es nuestro Pastor y nuestro Rey, reconocemos nuestro llamado a participar en la obra salvadora de Cristo al cuidar de quienes Cristo llama "aquellos más insignificantes" (Mateo 25:45).





TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

México tiene la reputación de ser un país muy católico. Sin embargo, en 1917 México recibió una nueva constitución en la cual se estableció una política de intolerancia religiosa, especialmente en contra de la Iglesia católica romana. Con el paso de los años, se emitieron muchas leyes anticlericales mismas que fueron puestas en vigor hasta el punto que el gobierno federal decretó la suspensión de culto. Esto generó un levantamiento por parte de muchos mexicanos y mexicanas con el único fin de defender su religión y su derecho a celebrarla.

En marzo de 1925, estos mexicanos católicos movidos por el deseo de justicia, fundaron la Liga Nacional para la Defensa de la Libertad Religiosa. Ese mismo mes, el Papa Pío XI proclamó la Fiesta de Cristo Rey, celebrada el último domingo del año litúrgico. Esta fiesta se incluyó al calendario litúrgico para recordar a los cristianos —que no importa en qué país o bajo que gobierno nos encontremos— pertenecemos a un solo poder, a un solo Señor, ¡un solo Rey! Inspirados por el grito “¡Viva Cristo Rey!”, miles de mexicanos dieron testimonio público de su fe y murieron con esta confesión de fe, justo antes de recibir el martirio, demostrando así que Jesús es verdaderamente el único Rey de sus vidas.

Fr. Feccia's Reflection



Cristo, re dell'universo — Anno "A". Il brano dell'ultimo vangelo liturgico richiama la nostra attenzione sul rapporto tra la fine dei tempi e la nostra vita, sul nostro atteggiamento nei confronti del prossimo, in base al quale saremo giudicati dal Cristo re che presiederà al giudizio. Dobbiamo pensare nel modo giusto alla fine dei tempi: non per sognare il cielo come la soluzione-miracolo, ma per attendere nella maniera migliore il grande raduno di tutti gli uomini di fronte al pastore messianico, il nostro destino ultimo si gioca nella realtà attuale della nostra vita.

Saremo infatti giudicati sul nostro atteggiamento di oggi verso il prossimo. Negli uomini stretti dalla sofferenza e dal bisogno, il figlio dell'uomo è già misteriosamente presente. Nel prossimo più vicino, prima di tutto, ma anche nella folla immensa di quei «*milioni di Crististi dagli occhi cupi e dolci*» (fr. Mauriac), che in un mondo attraversato da molteplici legami di interdipendenza, aspettano da noi molto più che una elemosina: un amore creativo, efficace, che sappia arrivare fino a mettere in moto i meccanismi della decisione politica.

Tutto questo ci porta a pensare al Cristo, re dell'universo. Non per proclamare la sua signoria sulle questioni della vita civile, cosa che suonerebbe piuttosto ambigua, in una società pluralistica e laicizzata come la nostra. Gesù rivendica il suo titolo di re soltanto per l'ora della sua venuta nella gloria. Ma è presente nei poveri e nei piccoli: è difensore dei loro diritti, il loro protettore. Servendo i poveri, è lui che serviamo.

Alla sera della vita, «*saremo giudicati sull'amore*» (S. Giovanni della croce); il giudizio non si baserà altro che sulle opere di misericordia, sulla carità che non verrà mai meno. Bisogna dunque amare fino alla fine Dio e gli uomini. Mai Dio senza l'uomo, mai l'uomo senza Dio.

Il Cristo in incognito — Abbiamo qui la scena classica del giudizio finale. Ma la nostra sorte non si divide nell'aldilà; è adesso che ci pronunciamo per Cristo o contro di lui. Il testo riprende la serie tradizionale delle opere di misericordia; ma non pone limiti all'amore. Servire il Cristo, è andare alla ricerca dei bisogni e delle carenze e porvi rimedio. Comprendere che si ha bisogno di noi è più importante che interrogarsi sul giudizio, a cui saranno sottoposte le nostre azioni, in ogni modo. I criteri di Dio oltrepassano di molto la nostra immaginazione e il suo verdetto ci sorprenderà sempre.

Cristo, punto focale dei desideri della storia

Questa prospettiva è fatta propria dal Vaticano II, che conclude il capitolo «La missione della Chiesa nel mondo contemporaneo» della «*Gaudium et Spes*» con un paragrafo (n. 45) intitolato appunto «Cristo alfa e omega»:

«Infatti il Verbo di Dio, per mezzo del quale tutto è stato creato, si è fatto egli stesso carne, per operare, lui, l'uomo perfetto, la salvezza di tutti e la ricapitolazione universale. Il Signore è il fine della storia umana, "il punto focale dei desideri della storia e della civiltà", il centro del genere umano, la gioia d'ogni cuore, la pienezza delle loro aspirazioni. Egli è colui che il Padre ha risuscitato da morte, ha esaltato e collocato alla sua destra, costituendolo giudice dei vivi e dei morti. Nel suo Spirito vivificati e coadunati, noi andiamo pellegrini incontro alla finale perfezione della storia umana, che corrisponde in pieno col disegno del suo amore: "Ricapitolare in Cristo tutte le cose, quelle del cielo come quelle della terra" (*Ef 1,10*).

Dice il Signore stesso: "Ecco, io vengo presto, e porto con me il premio, per retribuire ciascuno secondo le opere sue. Io sono l'alfa e l'omega, il primo e l'ultimo, il principio e la fine" (*Ap 22, 12-13*)».

Ma questa convergenza di tutto l'universo in Cristo Signore, non è un fatto meccanico: è il frutto di una intensa attività degli uomini per la costruzione dell'umanità e del mondo, attività che viene sollecitata dall'amore divino mostrato in Cristo. Il regno di Dio si è manifestato in Cristo come amore che libera i «poveri dinanzi a Dio» (*Mt 5,3*), vale a dire i peccatori, gli emarginati, i disperati del corpo e dello spirito. Questo amore reso contemporaneo e attuale nella pratica delle opere di misericordia (vangelo) non si esaurisce nel presente, ma lo trascende, proiettandosi nel futuro come


«giudizio finale». Di fronte al Padre, Gesù salva, per la vita eterna, coloro che lo hanno testimoniato (*Mt 10,32*), gli ubbidienti a lui (*Mt 7,21s*), coloro che sono vissuti come veri discepoli in una carità sempre disponibile al perdono (*Mt 6,14ss*) e alla misericordia (*Mt 5,7*), e perseveranti sino alla fine (*Mt 24,13*).
