

From the Pastor's Desk

III Sunday of Advent. This third Sunday, known as Sunday in Gaudete, that is to say of rejoicing and joy, because the arrival of the Messiah is near. The gospel takes us to the banks of the Jordan, where John the Baptist, with the crowds that pressed around the prophet, to receive the baptism of purification. Some devotees approach the prophet asking how to enjoy a new path in their lives and they asked him: "**What should we do?**" The Baptist with very clear ideas, does not invite them to go to the desert to live an ascetic life of penance, like him, nor does he encourage them to make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem

to receive the Messiah in the temple, nor does he propose religious rites or norms nor precepts. It is not a matter of doing things or of assuming new duties, rather to live a really human way of life, manifesting the good that is already in our heart. Likewise, striving to fight for a more just, dignified and fraternal life, such as promoting a solidarity and more just and peaceful society. This is what we should ask to ourselves, in order to take advantage of our spiritual journey in this Advent season: What should we do? Embracing the explicit answer of John the Baptist we should meditate deeply: **Do not take advantage of anyone, do not abuse the weak, do not live at the expense of others, do not think only about their well-being as he says: He who has two tunics, give one to the one who does not have, and the one who has food, do the same.** This is so simple and clear. It is a challenge and a call to a kind and humane behavior in relation to others, so that as Christ teaches us, our mission is to live the genuine values of solidarity, the defense of the poor, compassion and justice. May this Advent be a moment of grace celebrated with love, charity and hope to enjoy the arrival of the Messiah with joy. Amen!!!



Este tercer domingo conocido como domingo en **Gaudete**, es decir de **gozo y alegría**, porque se acerca la llegada del Mesías, nos lleva a orillas del Jordán junto a Juan Bautista, con las multitudes que se agolpan alrededor del profeta, para recibir el bautismo de purificación. Algunos devotos se acercan al profeta preguntando como gozar de nuevo camino en su vida y le preguntan: "**¿Qué debemos hacer?**". El Bautista con las ideas muy claras, no los invita a ir al desierto a vivir una vida ascética de penitencia, como él, ni tampoco los anima a peregrinar a Jerusalén para recibir al Mesías en el templo, ni les propone ritos religiosos ni tampoco normas ni preceptos. Esto creo es lo que tenemos que preguntarnos también nosotros que queremos aprovechar nuestro camino espiritual en este Adviento: **¿Qué debemos hacer?** Haciendo nuestra la explícita respuesta de Juan Bautista que es para meditar profundamente: **No se aprovechen de nadie, no abusen de los débiles, no vivan a costa de otros, no piensen sólo en su bienestar como nos dice él: *El que tenga dos túnicas, que dé una al que no tiene, y el que tenga comida, haga lo mismo.*** Así es de simple y claro. Es un desafío y un llamamiento a un comportamiento dulce y humano en relación a los demás, para que como nos enseña Cristo nuestra misión es vivir los valores genuinos de la solidaridad, la defensa de los pobres, la compasión y la justicia. Que este Adviento sea un **momento de gracia** celebrado con amor, caridad y esperanza para gozar en la alegría la llegada del Mesías. Amen!!!



Fr. Feccia's Reflection

Terza Domenica d'Avvento — Anno "C" — Quando Luca scrive il suo vangelo, parecchie decine di anni dopo l'Ascensione, la Chiesa conferisce ormai il battesimo cristiano nello Spirito, attraverso il ministero degli Apostoli. Il racconto dell'evangelista non manca certo di un fondamento storico, ma il suo interesse è rivolto in primo piano alla storia della salvezza che

continua nella comunità primitiva. Venuta meno l'attesa di una fine imminente, il richiamo del Battista alla conversione acquista un significato nuovo: gli uomini sono invitati a modificare la loro esistenza quotidiana, il loro modo di vivere nel presente.

La folla che Luca descrive nel brano di oggi sono un popolo, una moltitudine di buona volontà, di ogni condizione e professione. Attenti alle parole del precursore, hanno compreso di dover cambiare qualcosa nella propria vita. Come loro, poniamoci anche noi la domanda: «*Che cosa dobbiamo fare?*». È il punto di partenza di ogni conversione: bisogna rinunciare alla propria sufficienza, riconoscere la necessità di essere folgorati da una parola che ci farà uscire da noi stessi. Ciascuno poi cercherà il modo migliore per compiere, nel proprio ambiente di vita e nella professione, i suoi doveri di giustizia sociale, di aiuto reciproco e di carità.

Ma queste folle che gettano un primo sguardo alla propria vita e accettano di aprirsi all'interno della realtà quotidiana, all'improvviso di Dio, sono anche «*un popolo in attesa*». Deve arrivare Qualcuno che porterà avanti nel loro cuore il cammino iniziato. Qualcuno! Anche oggi sorgono dei precursori, che preparano la via ponendo al nostro tempo le grandi domande proposte dalla vita e dalla morte. Oggi, come ieri, i profeti di Dio rimandano a un Altro, più forte di loro: Gesù Cristo, che continua a venire per battezzare ciascuno nel fuoco che deve bruciare la nostra paglia e nello Spirito che raccoglie il grano maturo.

Spontaneità, creatività, vita. — Giovanni annuncia la *buona notizia*: il Messia viene a fare giustizia, non più attraverso i segni esteriori di un capovolgimento cosmico (il vento e il fuoco) né con gli interdetti, ma attraverso i segni modesti e spontanei di un cambiamento visibile di mentalità: il convertito è un uomo che vive per gli altri. Per prepararsi a questa venuta, gli uomini che si sentono peccatori ricevono il battesimo di Giovanni, segno di penitenza e inizio di conversione. Ma Gesù con questo stesso gesto umile, inaugura il tempo del vangelo, aprendo a tutto il popolo la via nuova dei figli di Dio, nello Spirito.




