

From the Pastor's Desk

"Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord".

It is with this biblical expression that humbly I come among you in these sacred holy days of Christmas Festivities, end of the year and beginning of the new year, to journey along as pastor together.

I am Fr. Giovanni Bizzotto, scalabrinian missionary, that after several years of formation in Italy where I was born, I spent 9 years in Canada, 6 years in Michoacán, MX, 16 years in Los Angeles, 4 years in CDMX, and 1 ½ year in Nuevo Laredo, MX. Believe me, I am torn within many feelings and thoughts in this moment for what I am presently living, and for what God called me to live through this year 2017.

First, it is with joy and hope that I come among you, parishioners of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church, to fulfill my vocation and to journey together in building up the Kingdom of God in the hope to continue with the activities and programs of evangelization in the parish, in order to grow as people of God and in our personal call to holiness.

Second, I believe that this year 2017 has being for all of us a year of many opportunities of growth, many excellent decisions, blessings with grateful and rich experiences as well as challenges and lost. Personally, it has been a year in which, on one side, God offered me the opportunity to live the experience of being a good samaritan, welcoming, and hosting daily an average of 100 migrants in our **Casa del Migrante Nazareth, House for Migrants**, in Nuevo Laredo, MX. I learned a lot and it filled my missionary heart with many gratifications and wisdom. I thank God for allowing me daily to be one with the migrants by listening to their stories of journey or of return as deportees. Where many shared their despair and pain for being separated from their spouse or their 3 or 8 children, after being living and working here for 43, 30, 20, or 10 years with documents and losing the status for a lie or an administrative failure, or due to lack of proper process.

On the other hand, God called my mother Caterina to enter to the eternal Glory on Good Friday. I am grateful to God and my family for the abundant and caring life he gave her. As a result, I was left with a heart full of peace for all that she shared with me in her 90 years of life. Finally, I do not deny it, for all that I lived in the past year in Nuevo Laredo, believe me, it was not easy to leave my migrants, but you know this is the missionary life that I embrace and as **missionary I am happy to be here with you**.

And so for you, which are the experiences, you thank God in this year 2017?

Third, I believe that all of us men and women of God, it is with hope that we welcome the New Year, certain that it will bring a lot of good opportunities and blessings. And of course in case of difficult situations, we firmly believe that God will be always with us to strengthen and enlightening our way.

God is our light and our salvation!!!

1. Heartfelt good wishes for peace

Peace to all people and to all nations on earth! Peace, which the angels proclaimed to the shepherds on Christmas night, is a profound aspiration for everyone, for each individual and all peoples, and especially for those who most keenly suffer its absence. Among these whom I constantly keep in my thoughts and prayers, I would once again mention the over 250 million migrants worldwide, of whom 22.5 million are refugees. Pope Benedict XVI, my beloved predecessor, spoke of them as "men and women, children, young and elderly people, who are searching for somewhere to live in peace." In order to find that peace, they are willing to risk their lives on a journey that is often long and perilous, to endure hardships and suffering, and to encounter fences and walls built to keep them far from their goal.

In a spirit of compassion, let us embrace all those fleeing from war and hunger, or forced by discrimination, persecution, poverty and environmental degradation to leave their homelands.

We know that it is not enough to open our hearts to the suffering of others. Much more remains to be done before our brothers and sisters can once again live peacefully in a safe home.

Segundo, creo que para todos nosotros este año 2017 ha sido un año de oportunidades de crecimiento, de muchas buenas decisiones y bendiciones con agradables y ricas experiencias como también de retos y desafíos. Para mí ha sido el año en donde Dios, de un lado, me ofreció la oportunidad todos los días de vivir la experiencia del buen samaritano, acogiendo y hospedando a diario un promedio de 100 migrantes en **Nuestra Casa del Migrante Nazareth**, en Nuevo Laredo. Agradezco a Dios por haberme permitido hacerme a diario uno con los migrantes, escuchando sus historias de camino o de deportación en donde algunos compartían sus destrozos, porque separado de su pareja o de sus 3 o 8 hijos. Otros que luego de 43, 30, 20 o 10 años en este país con documentos, se los vieron quitados por una mentira o un indebido proceso legal. De otro lado, Dios me llamó a entregarle a mi mamá Caterina, que el viernes santo entró en Su Gloria. Estoy agradecido con Dios y mis familiares por la abundante vida que le regaló. Me quedé con el corazón lleno de paz, por todo lo que nos regaló en sus 90 años de vida.

Finalmente, no le escondo, por todo lo vivido en Nuevo Laredo, créanme no me fue fácil dejar mis migrantes, pero así es nuestra vida misionera y como misionero **feliz aquí estoy!**

¿Y tú de qué agradeces al Señor por este año 2017?

Tercero, creo que todos nosotros como hombres y mujeres de Dios es con ilusión que damos la bienvenida al Nuevo Año, cierto que nos brindará un abanico de muchas oportunidades y que en el caso de situaciones difíciles, la **GRACIA** de Dios siempre estará con nosotros para iluminarnos y fortalecernos.

que buscan la PAZ***

1. Un deseo de paz

Paz a todas las personas y a todas las naciones de la tierra. La paz, que los ángeles anunciaron a los pastores en la noche de Navidad, es una aspiración profunda de todas las personas y de todos los pueblos, especialmente de aquellos que más sufren por su ausencia, y a los que tengo presentes en mi recuerdo y en mi oración. De entre ellos quisiera recordar a los más de 250 millones de migrantes en el mundo, de los que 22 millones y medio son refugiados. Estos últimos, como afirmó mi querido predecesor Benedicto XVI, «son hombres y mujeres, niños, jóvenes y ancianos que buscan un lugar donde vivir en paz». Para encontrarlo, muchos de ellos están dispuestos a arriesgar sus vidas a través de un viaje que, en la mayoría de los casos, es largo y peligroso; están dispuestos a soportar el cansancio y el sufrimiento, a afrontar las alambradas y los muros que se alzan para alejarlos de su destino.

Con espíritu de misericordia, abrazamos a todos los que huyen de la guerra y del hambre, o que se ven obligados a abandonar su tierra a causa de la discriminación, la persecución, la pobreza y la degradación ambiental.

Somos conscientes de que no es suficiente sentir en nuestro corazón el sufrimiento de los demás. Habrá que trabajar mucho antes de que nuestros hermanos y hermanas puedan empezar de nuevo a vivir en paz, en un hogar seguro.

La Santa Famiglia — Anno “B”— Il mistero della vita di Gesù Bambino con i suoi genitori: la liturgia di oggi ci presenta una meditazione tutta centrata sul Cristo, che interessa in modo particolare le famiglie cristiane. «*Da dove viene il Messia?*», si domandavano i contemporanei di «*Gesù di Nazaret!*». Ignoravano la sua nascita a Betlemme di Giuda; perciò si stupivano che si presentasse come il messia uno che veniva dalla Galilea (Giv. 1,46; 7,41). Matteo ripercorre quindi l’itinerario movimentato dell’infanzia di Gesù: il suo esodo come profugo in seguito alla minaccia di

Erode, che costringe i suoi genitori a rifugiarsi in Egitto, dove Gesù rivive il destino del popolo eletto; e infine il ritiro nel paese d’Israele e la scelta di abitare a Nazaret, che giustifica il suo soprannome (Anno A). Fin dalla nascita Gesù si trova sotto il segno della croce.


Gli episodi della presentazione di Gesù al tempio (Anno B) e del suo ritrovamento a Gerusalemme, durante il suo primo pellegrinaggio pasquale (Anno C), sottolineano entrambi la crescita «*in sapienza grazia*» di un bambino dedito alla propria missione fin dalla più giovane età. La sua vocazione dolorosa e gloriosa insieme, viene annunziata da Luca: «*Gesù sarà segno di contraddizioni*», ma anche luce per i pagani e gloria del suo popolo Israele. Nel tempio, a dodici anni, il bambino vivrà anticipatamente il proprio destino pasquale quando, perduto e ritrovato, verrà scoperto il terzo giorno nella casa del Padre.

La Santa famiglia non era una famiglia senza problemi. Maria e Giuseppe hanno voluto condividere la condizione di quel figlio sconcertante, seguendolo passo per passo nella rivelazione del suo mistero. Ed è proprio per questa loro disponibilità totale che meritano la nostra ammirazione.

Inizi difficili — Le circostanze obbligano Giuseppe a ritirarsi con la famiglia in Galilea, in una borgata senza gloria. A Nazaret i primi cristiani si riconoscevano in Gesù Bambino: perseguitati anch’essi, venivano chiamati con l’appellativo un po’ spregiativo «*nazareni*». questa è la linea dell’incarnazione: il figlio di Dio non ha voluto condividere la vita dei privilegiati, ma dei poveri, dei disprezzati, degli esclusi.

Famiglia piccola Chiesa

La Chiesa e il mondo contemporaneo s’interrogano, oggi più che mai, circa il disegno di Dio sulla famiglia. Mentre da una parte emergono alcuni grandi valori che manifestano la presenza di Dio, come la crescita della libertà e della responsabilità nella paternità e nell’educazione, la legittima aspirazione della donna all’egualanza di diritti e di doveri con l’uomo, l’apertura al dialogo verso tutta la grande famiglia umana, la stima delle relazioni autenticamente personali..., dall’altra si constatano crescenti difficoltà, come la degradazione della sessualità, la visione materialistica ed edonistica della vita, l’atteggiamento permissivo dei genitori, l’indebolirsi dei vincoli familiari e della comunicazione tra generazioni.


