

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From the Pastor's Desk

SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI. We ended the Easter season with the powerful Feast of Pentecost, now we pause to reflect on **two mysteries of our faith.** Last Sunday we meditated on the mystery of the **Holy Trinity** and this Sunday, the mystery of the **Body and Blood of Christ.** We have already celebrated the Institution of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday, but the Church gives us another Sunday, to deepen and understand the great meaning of **"this beautiful prayer",** which is **the Eucharist, the Holy Mass.**

At the height of His mission, at the Last Supper, Jesus instituted the Sacrament of his Body and his Blood, the Memorial of his Paschal Sacrifice. By so doing he replaced the ancient sacrifices with himself,

but he did so in a rite which he commanded the Apostles to perpetuate, as a supreme sign of the true Sacred One who is he himself. With this faith, dear brothers and sisters, let us celebrate the Eucharistic Mystery today and every day and adore it as the center of our life and the heart of the world, reminds us Pope Benedict XVI. Likewise, as much as the Eucharist is a memorial, sacrifice and communion, it is also a service. It was precisely during the Last Supper that Jesus washed the feet of his disciples inviting them to do the same with one another. Jesus who had chosen the apostles, to be with him and prepare them to continue his mission in the world. We know, Pope Francis reminds us, that Jesus speaks in silence in the Mystery of the Eucharist. Often, He reminds us that following him means going out of ourselves and making our life a gift to him and to others. As, He did in front of the crowd, who was listening to Him, when He directed the apostles to satisfy their hunger; after having listened to him for a long time. Finding themselves in a deserted and austere area, they thought of dismissing the crowd! Rather, Jesus' solution goes in another direction, a direction that surprises the disciples: **"Give them something to eat".** Perhaps, how many times we Christians have had this temptation! Where, we do not take care of the needs of others, dismissing them with a pious: **"May God help you",** or with a not so pious: **"Good luck"** ... But how is it possible that we are the ones who feed a crowd? **"We have only five loaves and two fish; unless we are to go to buy food for all these people".** However, Jesus does not despair. He asks the disciples to have the people sit down in groups of fifty people. He looks up to heaven, recites the blessing, breaks the loaves and gives them to the disciples to distribute. It is a moment of deep communion: the crowd is satisfied by the word of the Lord is now nourished by his bread of life. It is in listening to his Word, that we are also nourished with his Body and his Blood, that he makes us go from being a crowd to being a community. **The Eucharist is the Sacrament of communion,** which brings us out of individualism so that we may follow him together, living out our faith in Him. Then we should all ask ourselves before the Lord: **how do I live the Eucharist, the Holy Mass? Do I live it as a moment of true communion with the Lord, but also with all the brothers and sisters who share this same banquet? How do I live the Eucharistic celebration?** We remember, each Mass is an encounter with the Lord who gives Himself, who is offered as food to strengthen us, recalls the Preface for Holy Thursday. Jesus today also gives Himself to us in the Eucharist, indeed, he becomes food, the true food that sustains our life even in difficult moments when, perhaps, the road becomes hard-going and obstacles slow our steps. **It is in the Eucharist that the Lord makes us walk his way, that of service, that of sharing, that of gift, and that little we have, the little we are. Yes, if we share it, it will enrich us, because the power of God, which is that of love, descends on our human poverty to transform it, sustain it and animate it.** Then our existence will be truly productive. Amen.

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Del Escritorio del Párroco:

SOLEMNIDAD DE CORPUS CHRISTI. Terminado el tiempo pascual con la ponderosa fiesta de Pentecostés, nos detenemos a reflexionar sobre **dos misterios de nuestra fe**. El domingo pasado meditamos el misterio de la **Santísima Trinidad** y este domingo el misterio del **Cuerpo y La Sangre de Cristo**. Ya celebramos el Jueves Santo la Institución de la Eucaristía, pero la Iglesia nos regala otro domingo, para a profundizar y entender el gran significado de **“esta hermosa oración”**, que es la **Eucaristía**, la Santa Misa. En el culmen de Su misión, en la última Cena, Jesús instituyó el Sacramento de su Cuerpo y de su Sangre, el Memorial de su Sacrificio pascual. Actuando de este modo se puso a sí mismo en el lugar de los sacrificios antiguos, pero lo hizo dentro de un rito, que mandó a los Apóstoles perpetuar, como signo supremo de lo Sagrado verdadero,

que es él mismo. Con esta fe, queridos hermanos y hermanas, celebramos hoy y cada día el Misterio Eucarístico y lo adoramos como centro de nuestra vida y corazón del mundo, nos recuerda Papa Benedicto XVI. Así mismo, tanto cuanto la **Eucaristía es memorial, sacrificio y comunión**, es también **servicio**. Fue justamente durante la última cena, que **Jesús lavó los pies a sus discípulos** invitándolos hacer lo mismo los unos a los otros. Jesús que había escogido a los apóstoles, para que estuvieran con Él y se prepararán para continuar su misión concreta en el mundo. Sabemos, nos recuerda Papa Francisco, que Jesús habla en silencio en el Misterio de la Eucaristía y cada vez nos recuerda que seguirle quiere decir salir de nosotros mismos y **hacer de nuestra vida un don a Él y a los demás**. Como, Él los hizo delante de la multitud, que lo escuchaba, cuando indicó a los apóstoles que satisficieran sus hambres; luego de haberles escuchado por largo tiempo. Delante, de la desierta y austera realidad ellos, pensaron en ¡despedir a la muchedumbre! Pero, la solución de Jesús va en otra dirección, una dirección que sorprende a los discípulos: **“Denles ustedes de comer”**. Quizá, ¡Cuántas veces nosotros cristianos hemos tenido esta tentación! No nos hacemos cargo de las necesidades de los demás, despidiéndoles con un piadoso: **“Que Dios te ayude”**, o con un no tan piadoso: **“Buena suerte”** ... Pero ¿cómo es posible que seamos nosotros quienes demos de comer a una multitud? **“No tenemos más que cinco panes y dos peces; a no ser que vayamos a comprar de comer para toda esta gente”**. Pero Jesús no se desanima: pide a los discípulos que hagan sentarse a la gente en comunidades de cincuenta personas, eleva los ojos al cielo, reza la bendición, parte los panes y los da a los discípulos para que los distribuyan. **Es un momento de profunda comunión: la multitud saciada por la palabra del Señor se nutre ahora por su pan de vida**. Es en la escucha de su Palabra, alimentándonos de su Cuerpo y de su Sangre, como Él hace que pasemos de ser multitud a ser comunidad. **La Eucaristía es el Sacramento de la comunión**, que nos hace salir del individualismo para vivir juntos el seguimiento, la fe en Él. Entonces todos deberíamos preguntarnos ante el Señor: **¿cómo vivo yo la Eucaristía, la Santa Misa?** ¿La vivo como momento de verdadera comunión con el Señor, pero también con todos los hermanos y las hermanas que comparten esta misma mesa? **¿Cómo vivo la celebración eucarística?** Recordamos, cada Misa es un encuentro con el Señor que se dona, se ofrece como comida para fortalecernos, recuerda el Prefacio del Jueves Santo. Jesús también hoy se da a nosotros en la Eucaristía, es más, se hace alimento, el verdadero alimento que sostiene nuestra vida también en los momentos difíciles en donde, tal vez, el camino se hace duro, los obstáculos ralentizan nuestros pasos. **Es en la Eucaristía que el Señor nos hace recorrer su camino, el del servicio, el de compartir, el del don, y lo poco que tenemos, lo poco que somos**. Si, lo compartimos, se convertirá en riqueza, porque el poder de Dios, que es el del amor, desciende sobre nuestra pobreza para transformarla, sustentarla y animarla. Entonces nuestra existencia será verdaderamente fecunda. Amén.



SOLENNITÀ DEL CORPUS DOMINI. Terminato il tempo pasquale con la meravigliosa festa di Pentecoste, ci soffermiamo a riflettere su due misteri della nostra fede. Domenica scorsa abbiamo meditato il mistero della **Santissima Trinità** e questa domenica il mistero del **Corpo e del Sangue di Cristo**. Abbiamo già celebrato l'Istituzione dell'Eucaristia il Giovedì Santo, ma la Chiesa ci dona un'altra domenica, per approfondire e comprendere il grande significato di **"questa bella preghiera"**, che è **l'Eucaristia, la Santa Messa**. Al culmine della Sua missione, nell'Ultima Cena, Gesù istituì il Sacramento del suo Corpo e del suo Sangue, il Memoriale del suo Sacrificio pasquale. Così facendo Egli pose sé stesso al posto dei sacrifici antichi, ma lo fece all'interno di un rito, che comandò agli

Apostoli di perpetuare, quale segno supremo del vero Sacro, che è Lui stesso. Con questa fede, cari fratelli e sorelle, noi celebriamo oggi e ogni giorno il Mistero eucaristico e lo adoriamo quale centro della nostra vita e cuore del mondo, ci ricorda Papa Benedetto XVI. Allo stesso modo, l'Eucaristia, per quanto è memoriale, sacrificio e comunione, è anche servizio. Fu proprio durante l'Ultima Cena che **Gesù lavò i piedi ai suoi discepoli invitandoli a fare lo stesso gli uni per gli altri**. Gesù che aveva scelto gli apostoli, per stare con lui e prepararsi a continuare la sua missione concreta nel mondo. Sappiamo, ci ricorda Papa Francesco, che Gesù parla in silenzio nel mistero dell'Eucaristia e ogni volta ci ricorda che seguirlo significa abbandonare noi stessi e fare della nostra vita un dono a lui e agli altri. Come, lui fece davanti alla folla, che lo ascoltava, quando ordinò agli apostoli di saziare la loro fame; dopo averlo ascoltato a lungo. Immersi nell'area deserta e austera che si trovavano, pensarono di congedare la folla! Ma la soluzione di Gesù va per un altro verso, una direzione che sorprende i discepoli: **"Date voi a loro da mangiare"**. Forse, quante volte noi cristiani abbiamo avuto questa tentazione! Non ci prendiamo cura dei bisogni degli altri, congedandoli con un pio desiderio: **"Che Dio vi aiuti", o con una "Buona fortuna..."**. Ma come è possibile che siamo noi a dare da mangiare alla folla? **"Abbiamo solo cinque pani e due pesci; a meno che non andiamo a comprare cibo per tutte queste persone"**. Ma Gesù non si scoraggia: chiede ai discepoli di far sedere la gente in comunità di cinquanta persone, alza gli occhi al cielo, recita la benedizione, spezza i pani e li dà ai discepoli perché li distribuiscano. È un momento di profonda comunione: la folla dissetata dalla parola del Signore, è ora nutrita dal suo pane di vita. È nell'ascolto della sua Parola e del suo dono che tutti furono saziati. **L'Eucaristia è il Sacramento della comunione**, che ci fa uscire dall'individualismo **per vivere insieme la sequela**, la fede in Lui. Allora tutti dovremmo chiederci davanti al Signore: **come vivo io l'Eucaristia, la Santa Messa?** La vivo come un momento di vera comunione con il Signore, ma anche con tutti i fratelli e le sorelle che condividono questa stessa mensa? Come vivo la celebrazione eucaristica? Ricordiamo, **ogni Messa è un incontro con il Signore che si dona, si offre come cibo per fortificarci, ricorda il Prefazio del Giovedì Santo**. Gesù anche oggi si dona a noi nell'Eucaristia, anzi si fa cibo, il vero cibo che sostiene la nostra vita anche nei momenti difficili, dove, forse, la strada si fa dura, gli ostacoli rallentano i nostri passi. **È nell'Eucaristia che il Signore ci fa percorrere la sua strada, quella del servizio, quella della condivisione, quella del dono, e quel poco che abbiamo, quel poco che siamo, che se è condiviso, diventa ricchezza, perché la potenza di Dio, che è quella dell'amore, scende sulla nostra povertà per trasformarla, sostenerla e animarla**. Allora la nostra esistenza sarà veramente feconda. Amen.
