From the Pastor's Desk

XI SUNDAY of O.T. This Sunday, we take up again the gospel of Mark as we return to the ordinary time, after the long break of Lent, Easter and the Solemnities of Holy Trinity and Corpus Christi. *The Gospel of Mark is nothing if not a testament to the power of parables to illustrate the Good News through story. Jesus was a master storyteller, who understood the importance of using images and concepts to which his listeners could relate. A seed, a mustard plant, would symbolize one of Mark's signature focuses: the Kingdom of God. Centuries earlier, the prophet Ezekiel proclaimed most poetically to the Israelites, recently liberated from Babylonian captivity, that their God was still their hope, their comfort, their rescue, and their shelter. Those refugees would understand the image of the towering cedar as a symbol of their kingdom, cut down, fallen, captured. By restoring their kingdom, their God was giving them a new creation (the replanted shoot) and a new covenant. Today's scriptures connect the towering cedars of Lebanon from the prophet Ezekiel to the mustard plant of the famous parable of Jesus. Both plants represent the Kingdom of God. Both are also to be understood as symbols of the Church, where "birds of every kind shall dwell" (Ezekiel 17:23) and shelter in the cedar's branches, and the shade of the mustard plant's large branches provide dwelling for the "birds of the sky". So, we are all birds and just ones. God's incarnation in Jesus, born fully human, is the fulfillment of the promise to Ezekiel of the renewed and restored cedar, the new Kingdom. That new creation and covenant exists for us in the Church, through the Holy Spirit making the seed planted within us grow, flourish, and spread. Thus, we have the faith and courage to be that visible sign of the Kingdom bringing hope and renewal to the world. We must live Kingdom lives before we can convince others to do so. The Italics are a Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.* This Sunday, we also remember **Saint Anthony of Padua**. The gospel calls to leave everything and follow Christ. This became over and over again the rule of Saint Anthony of Padua's life. God called him to something new in his plan. Every time Anthony responded with renewed zeal and self-sacrificing to serve his Lord Jesus more completely. His journey as the servant of God began as a very young man when he decided to join the Augustinians in Lisbon, giving up a future of wealth and power to be a servant of God. Later when the bodies of the first Franciscan martyrs went through the Portuguese city where he was stationed, he was again filled with an intense longing to be one of those closest to Jesus himself: those who die for the Good News. So, Anthony entered the Franciscan Order and set out to preach to the Moors. But an illness prevented him from achieving that goal. As a result of a torment, he ended up in Italy and was stationed in a small hermitage where he spent most of his time praying, reading the Scriptures and doing menial tasks. The call of God came again at an ordination where no one was prepared to speak. The humble and obedient Anthony hesitantly accepted the task. The years of searching for Jesus in prayer, of reading sacred Scripture and of serving him in poverty, chastity, and obedience had prepared Anthony to allow the Spirit to use his talents. Anthony's sermon was astounding to those who expected an unprepared speech and knew not the Spirit's power to give people words. Recognized as a great man of prayer and a great Scripture and theology scholar, Anthony became the first friar to teach theology to the other friars. Soon he was called from that post to preach to the Albigensians in France, using his profound knowledge of Scripture and theology to convert and reassure those who had been misled by their denial of Christ's divinity and of the sacraments. After he led the friars in northern Italy for three years, he made his headquarters in the city of Padua. He resumed his preaching and began writing sermon notes to help other preachers. In the spring of 1231 Anthony withdrew to a friary at Camposampiero where he had a sort of treehouse built as a hermitage. There he prayed and prepared for death. On June 13, he became very ill and asked to be taken back to Padua, where he died after receiving the last sacraments.





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Del Escritorio del Párroco:

XI DOMINGO del T.O. Este domingo retomamos el evangelio de Marcos retomando el tiempo ordinario, tras la pausa de Cuaresma, Pascua y las solemnidades de la Santísima Trinidad y del Corpus Christi. *El Evangelio de Marcos no es más que un testimonio del poder de las paráboles para ilustrar las Buenas Nuevas a través de la historia. Jesús fue un maestro narrador, que entendió la importancia de usar imágenes y conceptos con los que sus oyentes pudieran identificarse. Una semilla, una planta de mostaza, simbolizaría uno de los enfoques característicos de Marcos: el Reino de Dios. Siglos antes, el profeta Ezequiel proclamó de la manera más poética a los israelitas, recientemente liberados del cautiverio babilónico, que su Dios todavía era su esperanza, su consuelo, su rescate y su refugio. Esos refugiados entenderían la imagen del cedro altísimo como un símbolo de su reino, talado, caído, capturado. Al restaurar su reino, su Dios les estaba dando una nueva creación (el brote replantado) y una nueva alianza. Las escrituras de hoy conectan los imponentes cedros del Líbano desde el profeta Ezequiel hasta la planta de mostaza de la famosa parábola de Jesús. Ambas plantas representan el Reino de Dios. Ambos también deben entenderse como símbolos de la Iglesia, donde "las aves de todo tipo habitarán" (Ezequiel 17:23) y se refugiarán en las ramas del cedro, y a la sombra de las grandes ramas de la planta de mostaza proporcionará morada a las "aves de el cielo". La encarnación de Dios en Jesús, nacido completamente humano, es el cumplimiento de la promesa a Ezequiel del cedro renovado y restaurado, el nuevo Reino. Esa nueva creación y alianza existe para nosotros en la Iglesia, a través del Espíritu Santo que hace que la semilla plantada dentro de nosotros crezca, florezca y se extienda. Por lo tanto, tenemos la fe y el coraje de ser ese signo visible del Reino que trae esperanza y renovación al mundo. Debemos vivir la vida del Reino antes de poder convencer a otros de que lo hagan.* Las cursivas son Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc. Este domingo, también recordamos a **San Antonio de Padua**. El evangelio llama a dejar todo y seguir a Cristo. Esto se convirtió una y otra vez en la regla de vida de San Antonio de Padua. Dios lo llamó a algo nuevo en su plan. Antonio siempre respondió con renovado celo y abnegación para servir a su Señor Jesús de manera más completa. Su camino como siervo de Dios comenzó siendo muy joven cuando decidió unirse a los agustinos en Lisboa, renunciando a un futuro de riqueza y poder para ser siervo de Dios. Más tarde, cuando los cuerpos de los primeros mártires franciscanos pasaron por la ciudad portuguesa donde estaba destinado, volvió a sentir un intenso anhelo de ser uno de los más cercanos al mismo Jesús: **los que mueren por la Buena Nueva**. Entonces, Antonio ingresó en la Orden Franciscana y se dispuso a predicar a los moros. Pero una enfermedad le impidió lograr ese objetivo. Como resultado de una tormenta, terminó en Italia y fue destinado a una pequeña ermita donde pasó la mayor parte de su tiempo orando, leyendo las Escrituras y haciendo tareas domésticas. El llamado de Dios vino de nuevo en una ordenación donde nadie estaba preparado para predicar. El humilde y obediente Anthony aceptó vacilante la tarea. Los años de buscar a Jesús en oración, de leer las Sagradas Escrituras y de servirlo en la pobreza, la castidad y la obediencia habían preparado a Antonio para permitir que el Espíritu usara sus talentos. El sermón de Anthony asombró a quienes esperaban un discurso sin preparación y no conocían el poder del Espíritu para dar palabras a las personas. Reconocido como un gran hombre de oración y un gran estudiante de las Escrituras y la teología, Antonio se convirtió en el primer fraile en enseñar teología a los demás frailes. Pronto fue llamado desde ese puesto para predicar a los albigenses en Francia, usando su profundo conocimiento de la Escritura y la teología para convertir y tranquilizar a aquellos que habían sido engañados por su negación de la divinidad de Cristo y de los sacramentos. Después de dirigir a los frailes en el norte de Italia durante tres años, estableció su sede en la ciudad de Padua. Reanudó su predicación y comenzó a escribir notas para sermones para ayudar a otros predicadores. En la primavera de 1231, Antonio se retiró a un convento en Camposampiero donde hizo construir una especie de casa en el árbol como ermita. Allí oró y se preparó para la muerte. El 13 de junio, se puso muy enfermo y pidió que lo llevaran de regreso a Padua, donde murió después de recibir los últimos sacramentos.

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



XI DOMENICA di T.O. Questa domenica riprendiamo la lettura del vangelo di San Marco ritornando al tempo ordinario, dopo la lunga pausa per la Quaresima, la Pasqua e le Solennità della Santissima Trinità e del Corpus Domini. *Il Vangelo di Marco non è altro che una testimonianza del potere delle parabole per illustrare l'insegnamento di Gesù. Gesù era un maestro narratore, che capiva l'importanza di usare immagini e concetti a cui i suoi ascoltatori potevano relazionarsi. Un seme, una pianta di senape, simboleggia uno dei punti chiave di Marco: il Regno di Dio. Secoli prima, il profeta Ezechiele proclamava in modo molto poetico agli Israéliti, recentemente liberati dalla cattività babilonese, che il loro Dio era ancora la loro speranza, il loro conforto, la loro salvazza e il loro rifugio. Quei profughi capirebbero l'immagine del cedro torreggiante come simbolo del loro regno, abbattuto, caduto, catturato. Ripristinando il loro regno, il loro Dio offriva loro una nuova creazione (il germoglio ripiantato) e una nuova alleanza. Le scritture odierne collegano gli imponenti cedri del Libano, dal profeta Ezechiele alla pianta di senape della famosa parola di Gesù. Entrambe le piante rappresentano il Regno di Dio. Entrambi sono da interpretare anche come simboli della Chiesa, dove "dimoreranno uccelli d'ogni specie" (Ezechiele 17,23) e si rifugeranno tra i rami del cedro, e l'ombra dei grossi rami della senape darà dimora agli "uccelli il cielo". L'incarnazione di Dio in Gesù, nato pienamente umano, è il compimento della promessa a Ezechiele del cedro rinnovato e restaurato, il nuovo Regno. Quella nuova creazione e alleanza esiste per noi nella Chiesa, attraverso lo Spirito Santo che fa crescere, fiorire e diffondere il seme piantato in noi. Abbiamo così la fede e il coraggio di essere quel segno visibile del Regno che porta speranza e rinnovamento al mondo. Dobbiamo vivere la vita del Regno prima di poter convincere gli altri a farlo. Il corsivo è Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.* Questa domenica ricordiamo anche **sant'Antonio da Padova**. Il Vangelo chiama a lasciare tutto e seguire Cristo. Questa divenne più e più volte la regola della vita di sant'Antonio di Padova. Dio lo chiamò a qualcosa di nuovo nella sua vita. Ogni volta Antonio rispondeva con rinnovato zelo e abnegazione per servire in modo più completo il suo Signore Gesù. Il suo cammino come servo di Dio inizia giovanissimo quando decide di unirsi agli agostiniani a Lisbona, rinunciando a un futuro di ricchezza e potere per essere servo di Dio. Più tardi, quando i resti dei primi martiri francescani giunsero alla città portoghese dove si trovava, si rinnovò il profondo desiderio di essere uno dei più vicini seguaci di Gesù: pronto a morire per la Buona Novella. Così, Antonio entrò nell'Ordine Francescano e si mise a predicare ai Mori. Ma una malattia gli ha impedito di raggiungere quell'obiettivo. A seguito di una tempesta in mare, finì in Italia e fu destinato in un piccolo eremo dove trascorreva la maggior parte del suo tempo pregando, leggendo le Scritture e svolgendo lavori umili. La chiamata di Dio è giunta di nuovo durante un'ordinazione in cui nessuno era pronto a predicare. L'umile e obbediente Antonio accettò con esitazione l'incarico. Gli anni di ricerca di Gesù nella preghiera, di lettura della Sacra Scrittura e di servizio in povertà, castità e obbedienza avevano preparato Antonio, a permettere allo Spirito di usare i suoi talenti. Il sermone di Antonio è stato sorprendente per coloro che si aspettavano un discorso impreparato e non conoscevano il potere dello Spirito di manifestare tanta saggezza. Riconosciuto come un grande uomo di preghiera e grande studioso della Scrittura e della teologia, Antonio divenne il primo frate ad insegnare teologia agli altri frati. Ben presto fu chiamato da quel posto a predicare agli Albigesi in Francia, usando la sua profonda conoscenza della Scrittura e della teologia per convertire e rassicurare coloro che erano stati fuorviati dalla loro negazione della divinità di Cristo e dei sacramenti. Dopo aver guidato per tre anni i frati dell'Italia settentrionale, stabilì la sua sede nella città di Padova. Riprese la sua predicazione e iniziò a scrivere note di prediche per aiutare altri predicatori. Nella primavera del 1231 Antonio si ritirò nel convento di Camposampiero dove fece costruire una sorta di capanna sull'albero come eremo. Lì pregò e si preparò alla morte. Il 13 giugno si ammalò gravemente e chiese di essere riportato a Padova, dove morì dopo aver ricevuto gli ultimi sacramenti.


