XXVIII SUNDAY O.T. Most of us sincerely desire to grow in wisdom and in faith. Today's readings explore the challenges we face when we allow God to lead the way. We first hear the author of the book of Wisdom extolling the value of wisdom in our lives. Then in Hebrews we are told that sometimes God exposes difficult truths about ourselves. These readings set up Mark's story of the wealthy man. In his encounter with Jesus, the man faced a very harsh truth, that his possessions actually possessed him and blocked his path to God. We may have similar "moments of truth" when we have an overwhelming desire to minimize or to run away from truth that God reveals to us. In these moments, may we remember that God always seeks to bless and heal us.

BIBLICAL GENEROSITY

Today's Gospel describes a tense and tragic encounter between Jesus and a wealthy man. It appears that the man sincerely desired to know the way to inherit eternal life. He had followed much of the Law of Moses. Apparently, he had also followed society's rules in gaining and sustaining his wealth, avoiding stealing and defrauding. Jesus indicates that the man missed a crucial part of the Biblical tradition, which calls upon those who have much to share generously with those who have little. The Old Testament regularly refers to this obligation (for example, see Deuteronomy 15). Historians note that in the society in Jesus' day, the wealthy enjoyed privileges in an economic system that also prevented the poor and vulnerable from meeting their basic needs. The wealthy man's entrapment in his possessions damaged both himself and the whole community. In our own time and place, those of us who enjoy privileges of various kinds are invited into social and economic practices that embrace this biblical generosity.

HEART SURGERY

Much of our inner life is hidden from others. This protects us from being harmed by others who would seek advantage over us. But our hidden inner life can also keep wounds from healing, and may help sustain deeply damaging illusions about ourselves and about the outer world. In today's passage from Hebrews, the author offers vivid imagery of the word of God and its effect upon us. Here, God's word is described as the active power of God that penetrates our hearts. God is described as a surgeon who can expose our hidden places and maneuver around our hardness of heart. Exposure of our inner self can be terrifying. During surgery, we are deeply vulnerable and utterly dependent on the surgeon's care and skill so that we can be healed. When events in life allow God to reveal hidden truths about ourselves, it is crucial that we know we are in the hands of a trustworthy and skilled surgeon. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

MISSIONARY MONTH. The theme of this year's World Mission Day – "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (*Acts 4:20*), is a summons to each of us to "own" and to bring to others what we bear in our hearts. This mission has always been the hallmark of the Church, for "she exists to evangelize" (SAINT PAUL VI, *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, 14). Our life of faith grows weak, loses its prophetic power and its ability to awaken amazement and gratitude when we become isolated and withdraw into little groups. By its very nature, the life of faith calls for a growing openness to embracing everyone, everywhere. The first Christians, far from yielding to the temptation to become an elite group, were inspired by the Lord and his offer of new life to go out among the nations and to bear witness to what they had seen and heard: the good news that the Kingdom of God is at hand. They did so with the generosity, gratitude and nobility typical of those who sow seeds in the knowledge that others will enjoy the fruit of their efforts and sacrifice. I like to think that "even those who are most frail, limited and troubled can be missionaries in their own way, for goodness can always be shared, even if it exists alongside many limitations" (*Christus Vivit*, 239).

XXVIII DOMINGO T.O.

La mayoría de nosotros desea sinceramente crecer en sabiduría y en la fe. Las lecturas de hoy exploran los desafíos que enfrentamos cuando dejamos que Dios nos guíe. Primero escuchamos al autor del libro de la Sabiduría exaltar el valor de la sabiduría en nuestras vidas. Luego, en la carta a los hebreos se nos dice que algunas veces Dios pone al descubierto verdades difíciles sobre nosotros mismos. Estas lecturas nos llevan al relato de Marco sobre el hombre rico. En su encuentro con Jesús, el hombre se enfrentó a una verdad muy dura, que sus posesiones lo poseían y le bloqueaban su camino hacia Dios. Nosotros podemos tener “momentos de verdad” similares cuando tenemos un deseo abrumador de minimizar o huir de la verdad que Dios nos revela. En esos

momentos, recordemos que Dios siempre busca bendecirnos y sanarnos. Es en esos momentos que pedimos a Dios abra nuestros corazones para recibir la verdad con fe y valor.

LA GENEROSIDAD BÍBLICA

El Evangelio de hoy describe un encuentro tenso y trágico entre Jesús y un hombre rico. Parece que el hombre deseaba sinceramente conocer el camino para heredar la vida eterna. Él había obedecido gran parte de la Ley de Moisés. Aparentemente, él también había seguido las reglas de la sociedad para ganar y mantener su riqueza, evitando robar y defraudar. Jesús indica que el hombre se perdió una parte crucial de la tradición bíblica, la que llama a los que tienen mucho a compartir generosamente con los que tienen poco. El Antiguo Testamento se refiere regularmente a esta obligación (por ejemplo, lo que se menciona en Deuteronomio 15). Los historiadores señalan que, en la sociedad de los tiempos de Jesús, los ricos gozaban de privilegios en un sistema económico que también impedía a los pobres y vulnerables satisfacer sus necesidades básicas. Al estar el hombre rico atrapado en sus posesiones le perjudicaba a él mismo y a toda la comunidad. En nuestro propio tiempo y lugar, aquellos que gozan de privilegios de diversa índole están invitados a adoptar prácticas sociales y económicas que incluyan esta generosidad bíblica.

CIRUGÍA DEL CORAZÓN

Gran parte de nuestra vida interior está oculta a los demás. Esto nos protege de que seamos lastimados por aquellas personas que buscarían una ventaja sobre nosotros. Pero nuestra vida interior oculta también puede impedir que las heridas sanen, y puede favorecer a mantener ilusiones profundamente dañinas sobre nosotros mismos y sobre el mundo exterior. En el pasaje de la carta a los hebreos, el autor ofrece una imagen vívida de la palabra de Dios y su efecto sobre nosotros. Aquí, la palabra de Dios se describe como el poder activo de Dios que penetra nuestros corazones. A Dios se le describe como un cirujano que puede exponer nuestros lugares ocultos y maniobrar alrededor de nuestra dureza de corazón. La exposición de nuestro interior puede ser aterradora. Durante la cirugía, estamos profundamente vulnerables y dependemos totalmente del cuidado y la habilidad del cirujano para poder sanar. Cuando los eventos de la vida permiten a Dios revelar verdades ocultas sobre nosotros mismos, es crucial que sepamos que estamos en manos de un cirujano fiable y hábil. Copyright © J. S. MES MISIONERO.

El lema de la Jornada Mundial de las Misiones de este año, «No podemos dejar de hablar de lo que hemos visto y oído» (*Hch4,20*), es una invitación a cada uno de nosotros a “hacernos cargo” y dar a conocer aquello que tenemos en el corazón. Esta misión es y ha sido siempre la identidad de la Iglesia: «Ella existe para evangelizar» (S. Pablo VI, Exhort. ap. *Evangelii nuntiandi*, 14). Nuestra vida de fe se debilita, pierde profecía y capacidad de asombro y gratitud en el aislamiento personal o encerrándose en pequeños grupos; por su propia dinámica exige una creciente apertura capaz de llegar y abrazar a todos. Los primeros cristianos, lejos de ser seducidos para recluirse en una élite, fueron atraídos por el Señor y por la vida nueva que ofrecía para ir entre las gentes y testimoniar lo que habían visto y oído: el Reino de Dios está cerca. Lo hicieron con la generosidad, la gratitud y la nobleza propias de aquellos que siembran sabiendo que otros comerán el fruto de su entrega y sacrificio. Por eso me gusta pensar que «aun los más débiles, limitados y heridos pueden ser misioneros a su manera, porque siempre hay que permitir que el bien se comunique, aunque conviva con muchas fragilidades»(Exhort. ap. postsin. *Christus vivit*, 239).

GENEROSITÀ BIBLICA

Il Vangelo di oggi descrive un incontro teso e tragico tra Gesù e un uomo ricco. Sembra che l'uomo desiderasse sinceramente conoscere la via per ereditare la vita eterna. Aveva seguito gran parte della Legge di Mosè. Apparentemente, aveva anche seguito le regole della società nell'ottenere e sostenere la sua ricchezza, evitando di rubare e frodare. Gesù indica che a quell'uomo è mancata una parte cruciale della tradizione biblica, che invita chi ha molto a condividere generosamente con chi ha poco. L'Antico Testamento fa regolarmente riferimento a questo obbligo (si veda ad esempio Deuteronomio 15). Gli storici notano che nella società ai tempi di Gesù, i ricchi godevano di privilegi in un sistema economico che impediva ai più poveri e ai vulnerabili di soddisfare i propri bisogni primari. L'intrappolamento del ricco nei suoi beni danneggiò sia sé stesso che l'intera comunità. Ai nostri giorni, coloro che godono di privilegi di vario genere sono invitati a pratiche sociali ed economiche che abbracciano questa generosità biblica per essere buoni samaritani con i bisognosi.

CHIRURGIA CARDIACA


