**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:****Halloween, ALL SAINTS, Faithful Departed?**

Hello dear parishioners. Greetings from your pastor. This weekend is a date that brings back memories and makes us travel to the past. Some of us still have a journey of pain, others have already found peace, but all of us remember our faithful departed with enormous affection and we would love to be able to see them once again... some of us would like to say something that we failed to express in due time and say goodbye with a big hug. It may happen that Halloween becomes more important than these mandatory holidays for Catholics. To any store you go there are decorations all over, costumes to decorate your house ... all related to Halloween. But, for us, the saints remind us of the only way to God: holiness. The deceased remind us of our human reality: fragility.

Last weekend Bartimaeus reminded us that in life there are times when we must shout: "Son of David, Jesus, have compassion on me." We can walk in blindness, and it is good to remind ourselves that "Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him.' They called the blind man, saying, "Courage, get up, who calls you." When the Lord calls us, we must say as Bartimaeus, that we no longer want to be in blindness, we want to see.

The saints are those who saw the light of Christ and allowed themselves to be penetrated by it. There is not a single day on the calendar on which the feast of a saint is not commemorated. There are days when several of them even coincide. These sisters and brothers of ours who have preceded us in the faith are set as role models in our Christian life. Their lives are for us a test of what God is capable of doing in a person, when He puts his entire existence in His hands. Their lives are a test of what God is capable of doing in the world, through just one of these people. But there are many more people who have attained holiness than have been officially recognized as such. None of them has gone unnoticed in their environment, and their work is still remembered even after centuries. The Church, aware of the impossibility of recognizing them all, pays homage to them on this day of All Saints. There are no excuses. Just a few verses after what we have read in the Gospel of Matthew, the Lord says, "Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect." What do we have to do to attain the perfection that the Lord asks of us? Love. To be perfect is to love God, to love all people, to love oneself, to love all His creation. It is from this love that it becomes possible to live the beatitudes we have heard. The Beatitudes invite us to live our relationship with God, with others and with ourselves, in a different way than we have been doing with the commandments.

On the day we celebrate the dead, everything speaks of life, so that we can affirm, with all certainty and joy, that to die is to live. The reason for all this is the person of Jesus Christ, dead and risen, the first among those who has risen from the dead, our brother and conqueror of death.

Our God wants us alive and to be alive you must remember the dead to become saints.

### ¿Halloween, TODOS LOS SANTOS, Fieles Difuntos?

Hola queridos parroquianos. Un saludo de su párroco. Este final de semana se celebra una fecha que a todos nos trae recuerdos y nos hace viajar hacia el pasado. Algunos aún tenemos un viaje de dolor, otros ya hemos encontrado la paz, pero todo nosotros recordamos a nuestros fieles difuntos con un enorme cariño y nos encantaría poderlos verlos una vez más...algunos quisiéramos decirle algo que nos faltó expresar en el debido momento y despedirnos con un fuerte abrazo. Puede pasar que Halloween se vuelva más importante que estos días de fiesta obligatorios para los católicos. A cualquier tienda que vas hay un sin fin de decoración, disfraces para decorar su casa... todo relacionado a Halloween. Pero, para nosotros los santos nos recuerdan el único camino para llegar a Dios: santidad. Los difuntos nos recuerdan nuestra realidad humana: fragilidad.

El fin de semana pasado Bartimeo nos recordaba que en la vida hay momentos que tenemos que gritar: "Hijo de David, Jesús, ten compasión de mí". Podemos andar en la ceguera y es bueno recordarnos que "Jesús se detuvo y dijo: «Llamadlo». Llamaron al ciego, diciéndole: «Ánimo, levántate, que te llama».

Cuando el Señor nos llama hay que decirlo como Bartimeo, que ya no queremos estar en la ceguera, quiero ver.

Los santos son aquellos que vieron la luz de Cristo y se dejaron penetrar por ella. No hay ni un solo día del calendario en el que no se conmemore la fiesta de algún santo o santa. Hay días en el que incluso coinciden varios de ellos. Estas hermanas y hermanos nuestros que nos han precedido en la fe son puestos como modelos a seguir en nuestra vida cristiana. Sus vidas son para nosotros una prueba de lo que Dios es capaz de hacer en una persona, cuando pone toda su existencia en sus manos. Sus vidas son una prueba de lo que Dios es capaz de hacer en el mundo, a través de una sola de estas personas. Pero son muchas más las personas que han alcanzado la santidad que las que oficialmente han sido reconocidas como tales. Ninguna de ellas ha pasado desapercibida en su entorno, y su labor se sigue recordando incluso al cabo de los siglos. La Iglesia, consciente de la imposibilidad de reconocerlos a todos, les rinde homenaje en este día de Todos los Santos.

**Todos estamos llamados a la santidad. No hay excusas.** Justo unos versículos después de los que hemos leído en el Evangelio de San Mateo, el Señor dice: "Sed perfectos, como vuestro Padre celestial es perfecto." ¿Qué tenemos que hacer para alcanzar la perfección que nos pide el Señor? Amar. Ser perfecto es amar a Dios, amar a todas las personas, amarse a sí mismo, amar a toda su creación. Desde ese amor es desde donde se hace posible vivir las bienaventuranzas que hemos escuchado. Las bienaventuranzas nos invitan a vivir nuestra relación con Dios, con los demás y con nosotros mismos, de una manera distinta a como lo veníamos haciendo con los mandamientos.

El día que celebramos a los muertos, todo habla de la vida, para que podamos afirmar, con toda certeza y alegría, que morir es vivir. La razón de todo esto es la persona de Jesucristo, muerto y resucitado, el primer de entre los que resucita de entre los muertos, nuestro hermano y vencedor de la muerte.

Nuestro Dios nos quiere vivo y para estar vivos hay que recordar a los muertos para llegar a ser santos.

Alcuni di noi hanno ancora un cammino di dolore, altri hanno già trovato la pace, ma tutti noi ricordiamo i nostri fedeli defunti con enorme affetto e ci piacerebbe poterli rivedere ancora una volta... alcuni di noi vorrebbero dire qualcosa che non siamo riusciti a dire a tempo debito .... e dire addio con un grande abbraccio. Oggi in questa società super consumistica, Halloween sta diventando più importante di queste festività religiose (obbligatorie) quale "Tutti i Santi" e "I Morti". Dovunque vai, qualsiasi negozio

è pieno di decorazioni e articoli tutti inerenti ad Halloween.

Per noi cattolici è importante ricordare "I Santi ed I Morti"; i Santi sono il modello esemplare da seguire e ci ricordano che l'unica via verso Dio è la santità; I defunti ci ricordano la nostra realtà umana: la fragilità.

La scorsa settimana Bartimeo ci ha ricordato che nella vita ci sono momenti in cui dobbiamo gridare: "Figlio di Davide, Gesù, abbia compassione di me affinché' possa superare le mie fragilità e fare un cammino di Santità". Fare un cammino di Santità significa non camminare nella cecità, ma rispondere alla chiamata di Gesù come Bartemio ..... "Gesù si fermò e disse: 'Chiamalo'... e chiamarono il cieco, dicendo: "Coraggio, alzati, che ti chiama".

Quando il Signore ci chiama dobbiamo rispondere (come Bartimeo) che, non vogliamo più vivere nella cecità, vogliamo "vedere", superare le fragilità per fare un cammino di santità.

I Santi sono coloro che hanno risposto alla chiamata di Gesù e facendo un cammino di santità hanno visto la luce di Cristo e si sono lasciati penetrare da essa. La loro vita è un vero modello di vita cristiana da seguire, la loro vita è per noi una prova di ciò che Dio è capace di fare in una persona; la loro vita è prova di ciò che Dio è capace di fare nel mondo, attraverso una sola di queste persone. Nel Vangelo di Matteo il Signore dice: "Siate perfetti, come è perfetto il Padre vostro celeste". Che cosa dobbiamo fare per raggiungere la perfezione che il Signore ci chiede? **Amare. Essere perfetti è amare Dio**, amare tutti gli uomini, amare sé stessi, amare tutta la sua creazione. È da questo amore che diventa possibile vivere le beatitudini, cammino alla santità. Non c'è un solo giorno sul calendario in cui la festa di un santo non viene commemorata. Ci sono giorni in cui vengono commemorati più Santi nella stessa giornata. Ciò nonostante, ci sono molte più persone che hanno raggiunto la santità di quante ne siano state ufficialmente riconosciute come tali. Nessuno di loro è passato inosservato nel loro ambiente, e il loro lavoro è ancora ricordato anche dopo secoli. La Chiesa, consapevole dell'impossibilità di riconoscerli tutti, rende loro omaggio in questo giorno di Ognissanti. Nel giorno in cui celebriamo i morti, tutto parla di vita, così che possiamo affermare, con tutta certezza e gioia, che morire è vivere. La ragione di tutto questo è la persona di Gesù Cristo, morto e risorto, il primo frutto tra coloro che risorgono dai morti, nostro fratello maggiore e vincitore della morte.

Il nostro Dio ci vuole vivi e per essere vivi bisogna ricordare i morti.


