

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

“Teach us to number our days aright.” Is there a more wise and prudent prayer for people of all ages than this verse from today’s responsorial psalm? As we savor the lovely but limited days of summer we are reminded that nothing lasts forever. In today’s first reading, the master teacher (Qoheleth) asserts “All things are vanity!” while the Gospel of Luke describes the ease with which our possessions can possess us. The second reading makes the point as well: “Think of what is above, not of what is on earth.” We see the problem of wealth from both sides today—from the viewpoint of the wealthy person who inevitably has to leave his riches to someone else and from the perspective of the potential inheritor who is at odds with his brother over how to divide their inheritance. The problem is clear; the wisdom is also.

YOU CAN’T TAKE IT WITH YOU

Stephen Covey, in his book *The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People*, lists as his second habit: Begin with the end in mind. Is that not the point of our scripture reflections today? We know we will die. We know we “can’t take it with us.” If you’ve ever been tasked with cleaning out the home of a deceased person, you know how easily once-treasured items simply become another burden to deal with. Or you may have experienced how quickly the joy of owning the latest smart phone becomes as outdated as the model itself. So how do we think about all the stuff that we buy, accumulate, fret over where to store, and pay taxes on? Heaven forbid if we ever have to move!

RICH IN WHAT MATTERS TO GOD

Luke sets us on the right path when he affirms that we must be “rich in what matters to God.” Needless to say, he is not saying that possessions themselves are evil. Today’s psalm asks God—twice—to “prosper the work of our hands for us!” The danger is that, as one wag put it, “we never have enough of what we don’t really need.” What does matter to God? What is the opposite of vanity? Kindness to one another, mercy, forgiveness, generosity to the poor and needy—all of these remain beyond death. These are what we can take with us when we die. The great mystery in all this is that God is never outdone in generosity; the more we give away, the more we have.

July 31 is also the feast day of Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). He epitomizes richness in what really matters. His military and court aspirations evaporated after he was seriously wounded in battle. His subsequent change of heart led him to found one of the most influential religious orders in the history of the Church. If the opposite of vanity is wealth that remains after death, Ignatius is most appropriately honored today.

Decimoctavo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

“Enséñanos a contar bien nuestros días”. ¿Existe una oración más sabia y prudente para las personas de todas las edades que este verso del salmo responsorial de hoy? Mientras saboreamos los hermosos pero limitados días del verano, recordamos que nada es eterno. En la primera lectura de hoy, el maestro (Qoheleth) afirma que “todo es vanidad”, aunque el Evangelio de Lucas describe la facilidad con que nuestras posesiones pueden poseernos. La segunda lectura también lo señala: “Piensa en lo de arriba, no en lo de la tierra”. Hoy vemos el problema de la riqueza desde ambos lados: desde el punto de vista de la persona rica que inevitablemente tiene que dejar sus riquezas a otra persona y desde la perspectiva del heredero potencial que está en desacuerdo con su hermano sobre cómo dividir su herencia. El problema está claro; la sabiduría también.

NO PUEDES LLEVARLO CONTIGO

Stephen Covey, en su libro “Los siete hábitos de la gente altamente efectiva”, menciona como segundo hábito: Comenzar con el fin en mente. ¿No es ese el objetivo de nuestras reflexiones bíblicas de hoy? Sabemos que vamos a morir. Sabemos que “no podemos llevarlo con nosotros”. Si alguna vez has tenido que limpiar la casa de una persona fallecida, sabes con qué facilidad los objetos que antes eran un tesoro se convierten en otra carga con la que hay que lidiar. O tal vez haya experimentado lo rápido que la alegría de poseer el último teléfono inteligente se vuelve tan obsoleta como el propio modelo. Entonces, ¿cómo pensamos en todas las cosas que compramos, acumulamos, nos preocupamos por dónde guardarlas y pagamos impuestos por ellas? Y si alguna vez tenemos que mudarnos, ¿que eso no ocurra por que es demasiado trabajo!

RICO EN LO QUE LE IMPORTA A DIOS

Lucas nos pone en el camino correcto cuando afirma que debemos ser “ricos en lo que le importa a Dios”. Ni que decir tiene que no está diciendo que las posesiones en sí mismas sean malas. El salmo de hoy pide a Dios -dos veces- que “nos prospere el trabajo de nuestras manos”. El peligro es que, como dijo un gracioso, “nunca tenemos suficiente de lo que realmente no necesitamos”. ¿Qué es lo que le importa a Dios? ¿Qué es lo contrario de la vanidad? La bondad con los demás, la misericordia, el perdón, la generosidad con los pobres y los necesitados: todo esto permanece más allá de la muerte. Es lo que podemos llevar con nosotros cuando morimos. El gran misterio de todo esto es que Dios nunca es superado en generosidad; cuanto más damos, más tenemos. El 31 de julio es también la fiesta de Ignacio de Loyola, fundador de la Compañía de Jesús. Él personifica la riqueza en lo que realmente importa. Sus aspiraciones militares y cortesanas se esfumaron tras ser gravemente herido en combate. Su posterior cambio de opinión le llevó a fundar una de las órdenes religiosas más influyentes de la historia de la Iglesia. Si lo contrario de la vanidad es la riqueza que permanece después de la muerte, Ignacio es hoy honrado con toda propiedad.



EL CENTRO DE UNA VIDA CON SENTIDO

Las lecturas de hoy nos invitan a reflexionar sobre algunas de las cuestiones más profundas de la vida y a explorar el significado de la fe. En el libro del Eclesiastés escuchamos acerca de la búsqueda humana universal del sentido de nuestras vidas. En el Evangelio de Lucas escuchamos la parábola de Jesús que habla de quien busca tontamente la seguridad definitiva mediante la acumulación de riquezas. En la carta a los colosenses, la fe en Cristo crucificado y resucitado, se proclama como el camino hacia una vida abundante en propósitos y con sentido. El camino de la fe cristiana pone nuestro trabajo, nuestros sufrimientos y nuestras limitaciones dentro de un panorama más amplio de los propósitos de Dios para todos nosotros. En Jesús, Dios se revela como nuestro compañero en el sufrimiento y las limitaciones humanas. El amor de Dios está en el centro de una vida con sentido. Ponemos nuestra confianza en este Dios amoroso, que nos creó para compartir este amor, y para compartir este amor con los demás.

Diciottesima domenica del tempo ordinario

"Insegnaci a contare bene i nostri giorni." C'è una preghiera più saggia e prudente per le persone di tutte le età di questo versetto del salmo responsoriale di oggi? Mentre assaporiamo le belle ma limitate giornate estive, ci viene ricordato che nulla dura per sempre. Nella prima lettura di oggi, il maestro (Qohelet) afferma che "tutto è vanità", anche se il vangelo di Luca descrive la facilità con cui i nostri beni possono possederci. La seconda lettura sottolinea anche: "Pensa a ciò che è in alto, non a ciò che è sulla terra". Oggi vediamo il problema della ricchezza da entrambe le parti: dal punto di vista del ricco che inevitabilmente deve lasciare le sue ricchezze a qualcun altro e dal punto di vista del potenziale erede che non è d'accordo con il fratello su come dividere la sua eredità. Il problema è chiaro; anche saggezza.

NON PUOI PORTARLO CON TE

Stephen Covey, nel suo libro "The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People", menziona come seconda abitudine: inizia con la fine in mente. Non è questo l'obiettivo delle nostre riflessioni bibliche oggi? Sappiamo che moriremo. Sappiamo che "non possiamo portarlo con noi". Se hai mai dovuto pulire la casa di una persona deceduta, sai quanto facilmente gli oggetti che una volta erano un tesoro diventano un altro peso da affrontare. O forse hai sperimentato quanto velocemente la gioia di possedere l'ultimo smartphone diventa obsoleta quanto il modello stesso. Quindi come pensiamo a tutte le cose che acquistiamo, accumuliamo, ci preoccupiamo di dove conservarle e paghiamo le tasse su di esse? E se mai dovessimo trasferirci, non lasciare che succeda perché è troppo lavoro!

RICCO DI QUELLO CHE CONTA PER DIO


Luca ci mette sulla strada giusta quando dice che dovremmo essere "ricchi nell'interesse di Dio". Inutile dire che non sta dicendo che i beni in sé sono cattivi. Il salmo di oggi chiede a Dio - due volte - che "l'opera delle nostre mani ci faccia prosperare". Il pericolo è che, come ha detto un burlone, "non abbiamo mai abbastanza di ciò di cui non abbiamo veramente bisogno". Di cosa si preoccupa Dio? Qual è il contrario di vanità? Gentilezza verso gli altri, misericordia, perdono, generosità verso i poveri e bisognosi: tutto questo resta al di là della morte. È ciò che possiamo portare con noi quando moriamo. Il grande mistero di tutto questo è che Dio non è mai da meno; più diamo, più abbiamo. Il 31 luglio è anche la festa di Ignazio de Loyola, fondatore della Compagnia di Gesù. Personifica la ricchezza in ciò che conta davvero. Le sue aspirazioni militari e cortigiane svanirono dopo essere stato gravemente ferito in combattimento. Il successivo mutamento di opinione lo portò a fondare uno degli ordini religiosi più influenti nella storia della Chiesa. Se l'opposto della vanità è la ricchezza che rimane dopo la morte, Ignazio oggi è adeguatamente onorato.
