“I am the good shepherd”

Fr. Josep VALL i Mundó (*Barcelona, Spain*)

Today, Jesus tells us: “I am the good shepherd” (Jn 10:11). St. Thomas Aquinas, commenting on this assertion, writes that “it is evident the title of ‘good shepherd’ suits Christ for, as the shepherd feeds the flock in the pasture, so Christ feeds the faithful with a spiritual food: his own body and blood.” It all started with the Incarnation and Jesus, throughout His earthly life, fully accomplished it to its end through his redeeming death in the Cross and his resurrection. After it, He entrusted the shepherding of the people of God to Peter, to the Apostles and to the Church, till the end of time.

Through His shepherds, Christ teaches His Word, He gives out His grace with the Sacraments and leads the flock towards the Kingdom: He gives himself as food in the Sacrament of the Eucharist; He imparts the Word of God and His Magistery, and solicitously guides His People. Jesus provides His Church with shepherds who can follow His heart, that is, men who, symbolizing Jesus through the sacrament of Holy Orders, are willing to give their life for their sheep, with pastoral charity, with a humble spirit of service, and with clemency, patience, and fortitude. St. Augustine frequently spoke of this engaging responsibility of the shepherd: “To be honored as a shepherd worries me (...) what I am for you terrifies me, what I am with you consoles me. For you I am a bishop, with you I am a Christian.”

And each one of us, Christians, we work by helping these shepherds, praying for them, loving them, and obeying them. We are also shepherds for our brothers, providing them with the grace and the doctrine we have received, sharing their concern and joy, and helping everybody with all our heart. We devote ourselves to those around us whether in our family, or in our social and professional world, quite willing to offer our life for them all with the same spirit of Christ, who came to this world “not for other people to serve him. The Son of Man came to serve other people” (Mt 20:28).

«Yo soy el buen pastor»

Hoy celebramos el domingo del Buen Pastor. En primer lugar, la actitud de las ovejas ha de ser la de escuchar la voz del pastor y seguirlo. Escuchar con atención, ser dóciles a su palabra, seguirlo con una decisión que compromete a toda la existencia: el entendimiento, el corazón, todas las fuerzas y toda la acción, siguiendo sus pasos.

Por su parte, Jesús, el Buen Pastor, conoce a sus ovejas y les da la vida eterna, de tal manera que no se perderán nunca y, además, nadie las quitará de su mano. Cristo es el verdadero Buen Pastor que dio su vida por las ovejas (cf. Jn 10,11), por nosotros, inmolándose en la cruz. Él conoce a sus ovejas y sus ovejas le conocen a Él, como el Padre le conoce y Él conoce al Padre. No se trata de un conocimiento superficial y externo, ni tan sólo un conocimiento intelectual; se trata de una relación personal profunda, un conocimiento integral, del corazón, que acaba transformándose en amistad, porque ésta es la consecuencia lógica de la relación de quien ama y de quien es amado; de quien sabe que puede confiar plenamente.

Es Dios Padre quien le ha confiado el cuidado de sus ovejas. Todo es fruto del amor de Dios Padre entregado a su Hijo Jesucristo. Jesús cumple la misión que le ha encomendado su Padre, que es la cura de sus ovejas, con una fidelidad que no permitirá que nadie se las arrebatase de su mano, con un amor que le lleva a dar la vida por ellas, en comunión con el Padre porque «Yo y el Padre somos uno» (Jn 10,30).

Es aquí precisamente donde radica la fuente de nuestra esperanza: en Cristo Buen Pastor a quien queremos seguir y la voz del cual escuchamos porque sabemos que sólo en Él se encuentra la vida eterna. Aquí encontramos la fuerza ante las dificultades de la vida, nosotros, que somos un rebaño débil y que estamos sometidos a diversas tribulaciones.

«Io sono il buon pastore»

Oggi celebriamo la Domenica del Buon Pastore. In primo luogo, l'atteggiamento delle pecore deve essere quello di ascoltare la voce del pastore e seguirlo. Ascolta attentamente, sii docile alla sua parola, seguilo con una decisione che compromette tutta l'esistenza: la comprensione, il cuore, tutte le forze e tutta l'azione, seguendo le sue orme.

Da parte sua, Gesù, il Buon Pastore, conosce le sue pecore e dona loro la vita eterna, in modo tale che non si perderanno mai e, inoltre, nessuno le toglierà dalla sua mano. Cristo è il vero Buon Pastore che ha dato la vita per le pecore (cfr Jn 10,11), per noi, immolandosi sulla croce. Conosce le sue pecore e le sue pecore lo conoscono, come lo conosce il Padre e lui conosce il Padre. Non è una conoscenza superficiale ed esterna, né solo una conoscenza intellettuale; Si tratta di un rapporto personale profondo, di una conoscenza integrale del cuore, che finisce per diventare amicizia, perché questa è la logica conseguenza del rapporto tra chi ama e chi è amato; di chi sai di poterti fidare completamente.

È Dio Padre che gli ha affidato la cura delle sue pecore. Tutto è frutto dell'amore di Dio Padre donato a suo Figlio Gesù Cristo. Gesù compie la missione affidatagli dal Padre suo, che è la cura delle sue pecore, con una fedeltà che non permetterà a nessuno di strappargliele di mano, con un amore che lo porta a dare la vita per loro, in comunione con il Padre perché "Io e il Padre siamo uno" (Gv 10,30)

È proprio qui che sta la sorgente della nostra speranza: in Cristo Buon Pastore, che vogliamo seguire e di cui ascoltiamo la voce perché sappiamo che solo in Lui si trova la vita eterna. Qui troviamo la forza di fronte alle difficoltà della vita, noi che siamo un gregge debole e che siamo soggetti a varie tribolazioni.

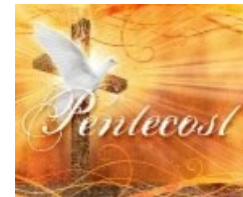
